School Bus Safety & Driver Training



The New Eight Light System for School Buses (5 min.)

This is a short 5-minute film that describes the Eight Light System for School Buses. A brief film that will show drivers how to stop smoothly, count students getting on and off the bus and the importance of all the safety features with the warning lights.

Eight Light System (30 min.)

This film describes the Eight Light System in great detail. The 1986 Film demonstrates how to use the safety lighting to pick up and drop off students. The upgraded system meets the National Standard that was recommended in the mid 1980's. The film quality is rather poor. On this same tape Becky Bus teaches small Kindergarten aged students how to get on and off the bus safely. This tape has poor quality sound. This film is also made in the mid 80's.



CDL: Pre-Trip Inspection Test (30 min.)

Designed to help you meet the challenge of your state agency's Pre-Trip Inspection Test for a commercial driver license. It covers inspection of your vehicle, air brakes and the air brake dual air brake system. This video uses the California testing system and may vary from state to state.

CDL: Skills and Road Test (24 min.)

Designed to help you meet the challenge of your state agency's Basic Controls Skills and Road Test. It covers the six Basic Controls Skills: forward stop, straight-line backing, measured right turn, parallel parking, alley dock and serpentine backing. It also explains the type of driving environment you will be expected to perform in for the Road Test. This video uses the California testing system and may differ from state to state.

Common Sense-Insuring Your Personal Safety (15 min.)

Thousands of bus drivers' workman's compensation injuries, some resulting in permanent disabilities, occur while walking to and from the bus or while getting the bus ready for a run. This program stresses the importance of putting the twin tools of common sense and personal awareness to work when performing all job duties – not just while driving. (Good In-Service training video for bus drivers)

The Ghost of Grade Crossing X (20 min.)

An entertaining film, which demonstrates the importance of school bus drivers stopping at all, railroad grade crossings. Also shows the proper way to evacuate a bus in the event the bus should stall while on the tracks.

Sesptc 2000 50th Anniversary (The Pupil Transportation Series (45 min.))

A series of 7 videos covering various aspects of school transportation safety. These 7 videos cover driver training and were made in the area of Louisville, Kentucky, with the cooperation of the Jefferson County Schools. (old video)

Driver First Aid (19 Min.)

Instructs school bus drivers on what to do and how to administer first aid in emergency situations. Covered are bleeding, broken or fractured bones, sprains, convulsions, shock, poisoning, choking, burns, and many more.

Driving the Activity Bus (14 Min.)

Discusses how proper pre-planning, knowing how to handle emergencies, and how being prepared for the unexpected should lead to a safe and enjoyable field trip.

Pre-Trip Inspection (14 Min.)

A full discussion of outside and inside equipment checks, which can be made by the driver before moving the school, bus.

Riding Your School Bus Safely (14 Min.)

This video shows how a student should behave on the school bus and explains the importance of following the rules. Primary-Intermediate

School Bus Driving: Controlling Skids (15Min.)

Explains how the proper balance of steering, braking and acceleration are the most effective ways to maintain vehicle control and prevent wheel lockup in different types of skidding situations. Demonstrated are front and rear wheel skids, all wheel skids, spinouts, and hydroplaning.

Skids: Cause and Control (15 min.)

Demonstrates the proper ways to control skidding in emergency situations while driving a school bus. Shows the proper manipulation of the brakes to avoid locking the wheels and how to maintain steering control. Included are; front and rear wheel skids, all wheel skids, power skids, spinouts, and hydroplaning. Also included is an instructor's guide that goes along with the video. Good for bus driver training.

Evacuating the Special Needs Bus (16 min.)

Discusses what procedures to take and how to handle evacuation.

Loading and Unloading The Special Needs Bus (14 min.)

This video discusses what procedures to take and illustrates how to handle loading and unloading when driving a school bus.

Introduction To The Special Needs Bus (13 min.)

This instructs school bus drivers on what to do and how to handle situations when first aid has to be administered.

Wheelchair Management (10 min.)

Drivers are faced with problems caused by many variables in wheelchairs from the difference in construction to the ways in which they must be secured on the bus. This film depicts different methods for loading, securing, and transporting wheelchairs on special needs school buses. Good for the bus driver training.

State Bus Rodeo 1994 (18 min.)

This film describes how the rules of the Bus Driver Competition are set up. You will be impressed to know that 517 drivers started but only 42 completed the competition. Cash prizes were awarded to the 1st and 2nd place winners of the bus driver competition. Drivers drive through cones and stop within ½ inch of a stopping point without hitting the cone. This film will generate interest in the competition.

The Talking Safety Bus (18 min.)

This 1992 film was made to demonstrate how safe it would be to have a prerecorded message that plays to all students as they got on and off the bus. It is an automatic delivery of the prerecorded safety message. It will also show you a dramatization of an accident involving a small child getting off the bus.

First Aid- What You Can Do (22 min.)

As a driver of the school bus you will have to act without delay for many types of medical emergencies. Knowing first aid will give you the ability to help students with many medical problems. This video covers, controlling bleeding, seizures, broken bones, ABC's of First Aid, and many more. Excellent video for the driver to see and get good ideas on how to handle most emergencies. This film was produced by the American Red Cross and is a new video in the 2000's.

Green County School Bus Accident (30 min.)

Accident in May of 1985 near Snow Hill NC.

This 30-minute video describes the scene of a School Bus accident with two Tractor-Trailers. The driver of the first Tractor-Trailer fell asleep at the wheel and hit the School Bus head on. The driver of the Tractor-Trailer was killed as well as 4 students on the bus. There were a total of 22 injuries and many were very serious. This video is not for small or young students due to its graphic descriptions of the accident. Several news agencies made live a newscast of the event and are all shown on this video. At the end of the video there are discussions about possibilities of seatbelts on the buses in the future.

Beltman vs. Emperor Bing (10 min.)

This video is designed for elementary school children to dramatize the critical areas of safety for school bus riders. It reviews points such as walking to and waiting at the bus stop, sitting quietly while riding the bus, and how to leave the bus, and other safety precautions. Good film for elementary grades to see.

Good Morning Mr. Johnson (13 min.)

Mr. Johnson, an 18-year veteran school bus driver, runs his morning route and rehearses passenger safety rules with his children as he picks them up. Several dangerous situations are shown and the correct behaviors stressed.

In Whom We Trust (13 min.)

This film describes the responsibilities of school bus driving and its tangible and intangible rewards as seen through the eyes of four experienced adult drivers in the Tar Heel State. It's used to assist schools throughout North Carolina in recruiting adult school bus drivers.

Just Can't Get Enough Safety (15 min.)

The legendary Sugar Bear leads an entire school in its new program for school bus safety. He is full of ideas on how young people can be "Safety Smart" from the moment they leave their homes to their safe return. It deals with the matter of distractions, which are involved, with a high percentage of school bus accidents. Good for K - 3 children.

Pooh's Great School Bus Adventure (14 min.)

A Walt Disney film on school bus safety rules in four important areas: waiting for the bus, loading and riding the bus, and unloading. By watching their favorite characters from the Hundred Acre Wood, students learn that it is important to follow bus safety rules to protect themselves and others. Pooh, Piglet, Tigger, and friends demonstrate safety rules and proper behavior as they ride the school bus by themselves for the first time. Good for kindergarten through third grade.

Practicing School Bus Safety (13 min.)

Mr. Berfosini, using his most popular orangutan "Poppi", demonstrates the correct and incorrect ways of waiting for, riding, and departing a school bus. Good for grades K-5.

Problems In Transporting the Handicapped (29 min.)

The video demonstrates how to handle situations such as communication with your passengers, medical problems such as seizures, and also, bus evacuation if necessary. Stresses how to be stern but compassionate at the same time.

School Bus Riding the Safe Way (14 min.)

This video will demonstrate the proper school bus safety rules while boarding, riding, and exiting the bus. K-5

CDL School Bus Safety Pre-Trip Inspection 30 min. By David Wall (1993)

This video describes all the pre-trip inspections a driver must do before the students are loaded on the bus. This shows the proper way to check tires, engines, axle seals and many more. Excellent for new CDL Students wanting to take the CDL Exam.

School Bus Passenger Safety (10 min.)

This video describes school bus passenger safety. It is mostly narrated by the students. It teaches safety rules for getting on and off the bus. For ages K-5th grade.

Introduction to Special Ed Bus Driving (19 min.)

There are more special needs children riding the bus now than ever before. This video teaches the drivers how to operate the bus, load, unload and tying down the wheel chairs. If you are the

driver of the special needs bus you will have many challenges. Watch this video to prepare yourself as a driver to safely get this bus to and from school safely.

The Proper Operation of Transpec Safety Vents (7 min)

This video was produced to show the Transpec Safety Vents that are installed on the school buses. This ventilation system is good to keep cool air moving in the bus in the summer and will also help keep the students warm in the winter. In addition, it also helps with the drivers' visibility. It improves the comfort level for everyone. Instructions are given on how to open and close vent and it also can be used in case of an accident to exit the bus.

School Bus Safety K-3 (15 min.)

The video is made for ages K through the 3rd grade. It teaches young students the proper way to wait, board, ride quietly and get off the bus at its destination. It was produced in the 1980's. Still a good one for young students to view.

50th Anniversary Pupil Transportation Conference 2000 (45 min.)

The video reviews Bus transportation after World War I. You will view a history of NC School Bus Transportation. The beginning of School Bus Safety started in 1939. You will see past and present changes in safety. They will review several of the Southeastern States.

Five Point Mirror Check (5 min.)

This video will show drivers how to do a 5 point mirror check and also do a warning light check for school buses. It will also show students how to get on and off the bus safely.

Counting On You (Driving a School Bus with ABS) (5 min.)

This video shows the advantages of the ABS breaking system on school buses. This describes the stability of the ABS breaking system in bad situations. Bad situations are anytime water, ice and snow will interfere with your vehicles ability to stop in an emergency.

School Bus Driver Training (5 min.)

The video covers the proper operation of the Allison Automatic Transmission. It will show the viewer important operational tips and techniques. Also covers the "How To" questions of maintenance checks, light checks and tire inspections. There are several transmissions available for our buses and it shows the different types we have to use.

The Passenger Restraint System (8 min.)

This video was produced in 1985 and talks of the "R" Bar Restraint and its effectiveness with the pupil riding the bus. Discussions of the history of pupil transportation in North Carolina.

Integrated Child Restraint Seat (9 min.)

This short video talks about the integrated seat for safety of the small child that rides the school bus. These seats are an integrated part of the bus seat. There are toddlers that ride the bus and these are the safest seat for them to ride in. If the seat is not in use it converts back to the normal seat for older students.

School Bus Driving Part 1 (16 min.)

This video was produced in California and is an excellent production. Discussions of the bus weight of 18 tons will be covered as well as the techniques to maneuver the large vehicle in traffic. If there are questions you may have as to how to manage a big bus in tight neighborhoods this video can surely answer them. Other topics are safe following distance, scanning mirrors, changing lanes, planning ahead, turning points of the bus, backing the bus, and using an adult to safely back a bus where there may be kids in the area. This is a good film for new and old drivers.

Your School Bus Passenger Stop...Consistency Makes the Difference! (6 min.)

An excellent film made in Wake County that discusses the importance of being very consistent in the way you stop at every student pickup. Discussions on the amber, & red lights on the bus as well as the importance of counting the children as they board.

A member of the North Carolina Highway Patrol speaks briefly on the penalties of passing a stopped school bus in North Carolina. There is some good information shared in this short 1999 production.

How to Respond To a School Bus Hijacking (18 min.)

This film is to train drivers of the buses in many different situations they may run into with violence. The video is divided into four sections with stop and break points to ask you, the bus driver, "What would you do." The four sections are 1. Student Feedback, 2. Early Warning Signs, 3. Preventive Techniques, 4. Staying Calm. The video contains guns and is not for students but for driver training only.

Violence Prevention on a School Bus (18 min.)

(This is the exact film as the one above titled "How to respond to a School Bus Hijacking")

This film is to train drivers of the buses in many different situations they may run into with violence. The video is divided into four sections with stop and break points to ask you the bus driver "What would you do." The four sections are 1. Student Feedback, 2. Early Warning Signs, 3. Preventive Techniques, 4. Staying Calm. The video contains guns and is not for students but for driver training only.

Think Safety & Stay Alive (7 min.)/ Getting to and From School Safely (7 min.)

This video is in two separate parts and was produced in Alaska. Part one will show the students to just "Stop and Think". It gives the student something to think about in reference to an accident on the school bus. How to survive if there is an accident. It will cover all the different exits on the bus. When you exit after an accident you get 100 feet from the bus so that you are in a safe area. Something to think about in the winter is to Dress for the Weather. Part Two: This video is also for the students to see. The video shows how dangerous it is to play on and off the bus. It shows the student the danger zones of the exterior of the bus. This video will stress the term "Behave on the Bus". This is a must see for high school students as well as younger kids.

Most Valuable Cargo (13 min.)

A video for the School Bus Driver. Produced by Aetna Life and Casualty. The film was produced in the early 1970's. This video will show a class of adults with the ambition of being a school bus driver. They are unaware of the responsibilities they are about to have. They find out through their classroom environment that the students are "The Most Valuable Cargo."

Transporting Preschoolers: Get a Head Start on Safety. (20 min.)

This video will demonstrate the importance of taking extra care of our preschool aged children. Head Start Buses have special equipment and the kids may have special needs. As a driver you have a greater responsibility with this age group. Child restraint seating is covered at length.

Safe Bus Riders are Happy Kids & School Bus Driving in Winter Conditions. (25 min.)

Here we have 2 videos for the driver and the students. These two videos discuss what to wear to school and why to dress for the weather. On cold snowy days the possibilities of the bus breaking down or being involved in an accident is greater. Dress for the occasion. Never ride with strangers. The topic relates to how easy it is for a small child to be picked up at a bus stop by a stranger. It shows what the child is to do in this situation. Other topics are, courtesy on the bus, missing the bus, loading and unloading the bus, & to stay out of the exterior danger zones of the bus.

CDL School Bus Inspection (15 min.)

This video was made in the early 90's. Gerald Cook describes all the pre-trip inspections that are required to obtain your CDL endorsement to drive the school bus.

Mr. Cook divides the bus into stations. Each station is checked on item at a time to insure safety. Topics discussed are lights, windows, emergency exits, service brakes, emergency brakes, and air brake "Pop Out".

School Bus Drivers Dealing with Behavior (11 min.)

This 2004 video was made in Virginia Beach, Virginia. This is a good film that describes the difference in acceptable and unacceptable behavior on the bus. The key word they use in managing the students. Topics of discussion will include types of misconduct, disruptive behavior, gross misconduct, and reasons for misbehavior. This will also give the driver good information on how to report problems from students and parents that may be a problem for you.

School Bus Driver Positively in Control (13 min.)

This 2004 video will illustrate a school bus accident in which several students were injured and one was crippled for life. All was due to a bus driver that left home with a bad attitude. This will cover the rules of the bus and how to communicate them to the students. Illustrations are shown on how to deal with the parents that may be as out of control as the student. It promotes the importance of no alcohol and drugs as a driver. This is one of the few films that discuss the importance of post trip inspections of the bus so that a sleeping child is not left on the bus at the end of the route.

School Bus Safety Issues (1993) (55 min.)

This video covers 4 sections of safety concerns on our school buses. In the first section, seat belts (lap belts) are discussed. Tests have proven that lap belts increase the chances for injuries. Buses and cars are made entirely different and this video will get the viewer a view of how safe the bus is with the newly designed seating.

The second section of the video covers Vision Obscuration and how important it is for the driver to lean forward and backward to see around the front post of the bus to see oncoming traffic. An accident in Oklahoma was recreated to show how the bus driver was at fault for not checking traffic at an open intersection.

The third section covers Rail Crossings. In 1961 an accident that involved a school bus and a train in a small town made the headlines all over the country. Interviews were held with actual parents of the victims. This video will show drivers how to cross the tracks safely.

The fourth and final section is titled People Saving People. Interviews are with actual mechanics that install safety equipment on the buses. Handrail inspection procedures and safety education are explained in detail.

Pupils are Different (13 min.)

The video made in the 70's, shows how all Pupils are different in the way they act everyday on our buses. The driver can sometimes be permissive and at other times authoritarian with how they manage the students. This video will assist the bus drivers in having a responsive approach when they misbehave on the bus. They call it friendly persuasion.

Skids: Cause and Control (15 min.)

This 1989 video explains how we can safely control our vehicle in the event of a skid. Skidding is responsible for 10,000 deaths per year. To prevent these keep the vehicle in control using three elements. Steering, Braking, and Acceleration

How to Safely Evacuate a School Bus (20 min.)

This video shows the driver and the students how to effectively evacuate the bus. The film is separated into 3 sections. They are Introduction to Safety, Decisions when and when not to evacuate, and Training drill on how to evacuate the bus using all the exits. Very good for drivers and students of all ages.

Buses are Different! (20 min.)

This video was made in the early 80's for the bus driver in training. Buses are not at all like cars we may own and drive. The sporty little cars that maneuver well in traffic are easy to handle. On the other hand the big school buses will take more training to get us all used to how it handles in emergency situations. You will see a driver in training maneuver on a driver training course using the steering wheel and brakes to avoid an obstacle in the roadway.

School Bus Passengers on the Bus (18 min.)

This is a video made in 1993 that covers the passengers on the bus. They are all affected by the attitude of the driver. This video will cover the following topics. Loading, unloading, the use of transition seating, never using the rear seat unless it's absolutely necessary, and how to react to bad actions of the students that are riding. Question and answer stops are on this video. Good training video for the new driver.

If It's a Tie, You Loose (13 min.)

A video that discusses the dangers of Railroad Crossings and School Buses. Trains are longer, wider, and taller and weigh 8,000 tons. The train can stop in time to miss you. They take over 1 mile to come to a stop. Crossing gates are a big danger for the bus so take the time to view this video to make the school trip safer for everyone.

Preventing Disaster at the Crossing (18 min.)

This video shows school bus drivers the potential for danger at highway-rail crossings and teaches drivers proper safety precaution. A train and bus accident is staged to show the viewer the force behind the train and the damage it can cause a school bus.

Get Home Safe: With Chelsi the Safety Dog (7 min.)

This is a unique video that shows a full grown black dog by the name of Chelsi that actually escorts small students from their home to the bus stop and eventually to school and back home again. All the things K-3 would need to know about getting to school safely. Topics that are discussed are crosswalks, waiting for the bus, how to ride quietly, and many more.

Be Cool Follow The Rules (15 min.)

This video will help teach students (K-4) the rules of school bus safety. This is an award winning film. It demonstrates safe conduct on and around the school bus. It includes instruction on emergency evacuation. A great film for school bus safety education program.

General Safety

Operation Lifesaver Safety Videos (DVD) (1 hr. 45 min.)

This is a new DVD in 2006 that will be helpful for all drivers to see. There are 6 sections that cover all aspects of safety at Railroad Crossings. There is special attention to Police, Fire and Rescue. They sometimes respond to emergencies and end up being a fatality. The train will take over 1 mile to stop at 60 miles per hour. There are more fatalities than you think when trains are involved. This DVD will give you statistics and open your eyes to the dangers.

Crossing Guard Training Video (18 min.)

A crossing guard is a person who safely escorts elementary school children across a street or roadway on the way to or from school. This video's purpose is to provide training to qualified persons so they can perform their duties with the utmost safety and effectiveness. Grade Level: Adult.

I'm No Fool In Water (10 min.)

Animated with Jiminy Cricket by Walt Disney. Illustrates precautions for young children when swimming.

Signs Are For Safety (15 min.)

An animated film featuring Fat Albert and the gang. Who is Cool Roy? That's what the gang would like to know. He's been defacing buildings, moving roadblocks, taking signs and changing them around which is very dangerous. Cool Roy removes a danger sign and almost gets Pee Wee killed. Fat Albert lets Roy know the dangers and how he must take responsibility and learn that **Signs Are For Safety**. Good for grade levels 3 through 8.

Cars, Motorcycles and a Common Road (8 min.)

This video was made in the mid 1990's and will show all the viewers the importance of sharing the road with the motorcycles. Motorcycles are unique in the way they move in and out of traffic and other vehicles tend to think they can tailgate on the cycles. A good video for all age drivers.

Die Hard if You're Dumb (13 min.)

An up to date film made around 1999 to discuss the dangers of Trains, Railroad Crossings and Railroad Yards. The film involves teenagers trying to get information to make their own safety film about the dangers of the Rail System. This film is definitely good for young drivers to watch. It shows the consequences of playing and being dumb around the tracks.

DDC-Driving Ambition (7 min.)

This video is presented by the National Safety Council. This video will satisfy diverse learning needs about safe driving. This will give information about defensive driving certification. This program will help reduce accidents and injuries. This program will help reduce moving violations. Beneficial especially for ages 16 to 24. Produced in 1998.

Know Your No-Zone (12 min.)

Two of North Carolina's top truckers share their insights on how to stay safe in the No-Zone during this special program. Learn how they watch for vehicles that "disappear" into blind spots, and how they compensate for mistakes made by other drivers. Take a ride down North Carolina's highways to see how these drivers achieve their safe driving records. Watch this video and you can get lost in the No-Zone too. Listen to how concerned truckers and other motorists can help each other to ensure safer roadways.

Driving Safely In Winter Conditions (18 min.)

This video was produced in 2002 and is an excellent production for all passenger vehicle drivers to see. Topics of this video include, ABS Brakes, Skids, Black Ice, Hydroplaning, first aid kits, blankets in the auto for winter driving, and will cover the importance of not leaving your car unattended and running in the winter for an extended time. This can cause a vehicle fire.

The Diana Factor: What's Driving You? (30 min.)

We all remember Princess Diana and the fatal car crash. This video discusses all elements that lead up to her death. Driving too fast for conditions, not wearing seat belts, attitude of the driver, and many more. This video is divided up into separate sections to show us how to eliminate the bad from our lives and take the time to use safety equipment. Drugs and Alcohol are also discussed. The driver for Princess Diana was drinking just before the accident.

The Bus Stops Here: So Should You (1 min.)

These are two short 30 second public service announcements on the importance of stopping at the school bus stop locations. Produced by the NC Governor's Highway Safety Program.

It's a Jungle Out There (5 min.)

This short video talks about collisions and how to be a defensive driver. Shows young driver how to pay attention to others on the highway. Produced by the National Safety Council.

Safe Driving for Teens (5 min)

This video demonstrates unsafe driving habits and viewers are introduced to survivors of serious vehicle crashes. The survivors tell their story of how this accident has altered their lives forever. The results of Drunk Drivers are detailed by medical personnel. Emphasis is put in the use of safety belts.

Funnel Facts: Public Relations (10 min.)

A video for good public relations. Tornadoes are a fact of life in our state. We have to prepare and rely on facts and not the myths that are floating out in the public. This video will tell us how and where to go in case of a tornado. What to do if you are traveling. How to prepare is a good key element.

Defensive Driving Techniques (16 min.)

The San Francisco, Police Department is sponsoring a safe driving rally. This rally will show aggressive drivers and also shows observant drivers doing things the correct way. There are reactions to both types of drivers. Driving at the correct speed can save lives and you, the driver, money. Speeding citations cost the driver lots of money.

Yielding to Emergency Vehicles (22 ½ min.)

This video was made in the 80's but is still a good video to watch. It covers the importance of the emergency vehicles getting to their destination without being held up by the everyday traffic. It will cover the law's that enforce what you do when you see and hear an emergency vehicle. Lives are affected if you hinder fire, rescue or police getting to their call. Tabletop training will show the viewer exactly what to do in these incidences. A good video for all drivers.

Winter Driving Tactics (14 min.)

This video was developed in 1985 and will discuss topics that include: The proper winter tires, Pre-winter tune up, Batteries, belts, your lights on the vehicle, and emergency equipment you need to carry in the truck. The video was made in Anchorage Alaska.

DDC...It's Good Business (13 min.)

You may ask, what is DDC. DDC is short for Defensive Driving Course. As owners and managers of business in America we have to consider the high cost of insurance, accidents, and loss of important man hours and labor if an employee is involved in an auto accident. Many companies today are making it a prerequisite to have all their drivers to complete a DDC before getting behind the wheel. These classes will be tailored to the company needs. Preventing the accident before it happens make good sense.

So...You Think You're Going to Live Forever? (20 min.)

Capt. Pete Collins did not set out to become an award-winning speaker. He was just a state trooper who felt the need to tell people about his experience on the highway. The stories are not unique. Any state trooper could tell them. But Capt. Pete Collins mixes the laughter and the tears of more than 26 years of patrolling Mississippi highways, to bring a compelling message that young people and their parents will not soon forget.

Vehicle Safety-Driving of the Road (17 min.)

This video is good for all ages of drivers. The rules of the road and how important it is to carry the proper information with you as you travel. Your License, insurance and your registration information will all be handy and is the law to have it. The laws of our highways are discussed in good detail.

Write Your Own Ticket-Auto Insurance for Teens (10 min.)

Every teen should see this video. This starts as a comedy and ends on a more serious note. A note called Money. Mike loses his keys to drive the car. His dad took them away and he is back to the old reliable bicycle again. His insurance went through the roof. The only college student in the group is the one with all the insurance information. He gives great details on how to buy and keep the cheapest insurance on your vehicle. He shared secrets on insurance that all young drivers need to learn. This is a good up to date video for today's teens.

Animal Awareness Driving (15 min.)

This educational program aims to reduce that statistic by training drivers on proper driving behavior when in an area with a high potential for animals crossing the road. Senior High through Professionals can learn from this video.

Backing and Parking (15 min.)

This program covers the hazard areas where most accidents occur due to backing and parking. By following three real drivers we see common obstacles that we all face on our daily routes. Also, we learn what we can do to avoid accidents by planning ahead, recognizing potential parking problems, and realizing safe backing and parking procedures.

City Driving Tactics (17 min.)

Rome, Paris, Tokyo traffic compared. The world's best drivers set forth six guideline factors: Sight, speed, turns, signals, signs, & space. Good for high school driver education and adults.

Code 3 (11 min.)

A gripping dramatization that demonstrated the importance of motorists' cooperation with emergency vehicles. Discusses proper yielding procedures for the general motorist both on the avenue and at the intersection. Also, addresses problems and solutions concerning curious motorist and onlookers at an emergency scene. Good for grade 10 to adult.

Defensive Driving (19 min.)

Reviews specific defensive driving techniques and introduces a four-step, defensive driving formula. Hosted by Mike Muffins, a comedian and professional instructor in a top traffic school. Reviews proper vehicle maintenance, central and peripheral vision, lane changes, and the constantly changing road environment. Grade level 10 to adult.

Driver Attitudes and Responsibility (16 min.)

Shows drivers that their attitudes are just as important as their skills. Also, reviews traffic citation procedures. Hosted by Mike Muffins, a comedian and professional instructor in a top traffic school, Mike illustrates to viewers that "getting even" or "teaching a lesson" causes accidents. Grade level 10 to adult.

Emergency Driving Tactics (18 min.)

How to react to high speed skids, fire, tire blow-out, loss of power in brakes and other situations. Could be a life-saver. Good for high school and adults.

Freeway Driving Tactics (16 min.)

This video offers important techniques for safe expressway driving.

Freeway Phobia (15 min.)

Walt Disney features Goofy on the freeway. Demonstrates how to drive on the freeways.

Habit Defense: Covering The Brake (12 min.)

Habit Defense is a technique that reduces the likelihood of collision by reducing a car's total stopping distance. A dramatization of a teenage boy showing his father where the habit of "covering the brake" avoids potential hazards and how the technique is as useful to seasoned drivers as it is to those just starting out.

Heavenly Debate (7 min.)

In this video you will witness interviews between young drivers and older drivers. The video stimulates awareness of the problems we all face as drivers and creates greater understanding of how each tend to feel about each other.

How to Handle an Accident (15 min.)

Offers a thorough review of proper steps to take in the event of a vehicle accident. Hosted by Mike Muffins, a comedian and professional instructor in a top traffic school. Grade level 10 to adult.

Icy Road Ahead (23 min.)

Former auto racing champion Jean-Paul Luc, introduces this informative program on how to drive safely and confidently in difficult winter weather conditions. Cheryl Lemke and Dan Chandler explain and demonstrate how to operate and control a vehicle so that drivers can overcome their winter driving fears. Senior High to Adult.

License (11 min.)

Presents a film adaptation of Theodore L. Thomas' short story, "Test". While on a joyride with his unimpressed girlfriend, Michael plunges the car off a cliff, killing her. He wakes surprised to find the dream was induced by the driving school. Grade levels 10 to College.

Low Visibility and Driving (15 min.)

Learn about obstacles within the vehicle, night driving, tunnels, blinding spray from passing vehicles, the effects of shadows, safe stopping areas, dealing with over-sized vehicles, and fog, snow, rain and bright sun. Good for driver education students and adults.

A Matter of Time (10 min.)

What can happen in the two seconds it takes to look down and turn on the heat control? A traffic light may change. In the brief period of two seconds, your car will travel 160 feet at 50 mph. Viewers watch through the windshield of "their" vehicle as different traffic sequences show how accidents happen. Good for driver education class and adults.

Motor Mania (7 min.)

Walt Disney color cartoon revealing how wrong attitudes on the part of a motorist can make him act like a maniac when he is behind the wheel. Good for all audiences of all ages.

The National Driving Test (32 min.)

This video is narrated by Christopher Reeve and featuring other actors and actresses such as Lisa Gilbert and Lorenzo Lamas. Developed in association with the National Safety Council, the Highway Safety Administration, and the Automobile safety Association to test ones knowledge of driving skills. Questions covered are in regard to good defense, rules of the road, driving environment unexpected situations, what's under the hood and much more.

Options To Live (24 min.)

This presents to the viewer, in a hard hitting manner, several choices he can make which will have a dominant effect on his driving behavior. It takes you to the accident scenes to see the results of highway tragedies in which operators ignored the foremost life-saving options.

Pro-Driving Attitudes (16 min.)

A film demonstrating four key attitudes characteristic of professional drivers: alertness, wariness, patience, and considerations. Encourages us to be patient with ourselves in developing these four pro-attitudes, concentrating on one at a time until each becomes a habit. Good for high school, adults, and professional drivers.

Signal 30 (28 min.)

This video is a collection of documentary shots of actual accident scenes on Ohio highways. For the adult driver.

Staying Out Of Harm's Way (14 min.)

This uses modern traffic scenes, vehicles, and near miss situations to cover a broad range of driving issues. Explores four "Danger Zones" (intersections, merging, backing, and highway railroad crossings) and five categories of "Dangerous Drivers" (weavers, turtles, tailgaters, speeders, and drunk drivers) and shows how to deal with each successfully and how to recognize and avoid them. Good for driver education students and adults.

The System (15 min.)

Safe Driving is more than seat belts, more than knowledge, and more than road sense. It is the car, the belts, and the driver all operating as one machine that anticipates, senses, acts, and reacts as on system. Good for driver education and adults.

There Are Choices (18 min.)

Viewers will witness powerful reenactments of actual accidents. Then, Pat Summerall takes us back through time to examine the lives of accident victims just prior to their accidents. The audience is made powerfully aware that our attitudes and emotions can either cause accidents, or help us prevent them.

Traffic Trials-Heaven Won't Wait (19 min.)

Six drivers are called before the court of final judgment to answer for one of the five basic causes that, together, account for 95% of all traffic accidents. Based on research done at Indiana University.

What's Under Your Hood? (11 min.)

This presents the fundamentals of the mail systems of the engine and power train, naming key parts and their function and relationship.

Winter Driving Tactics (20 min.)

The major concepts of winter driving tactics for ice, snow, skids and the use of chains are exemplified by the experiences of a small group of travelers isolated by a severe storm.

Winter Driving Tactics Update (15 min.)

This demonstrates methods for driving in snow and ice such as: pumping the brakes to prevent wheel lock-up, gently braking before entering a curve, keeping both hands on the wheel and maintaining a generous following distance. It also emphasizes the importance of being prepared in the event of a breakdown.

Winter Safety (15 min.)

This video has all types of "Winter Safety". This includes home safety, personal safety as well as automobile safety.
High School – Adult

Commercial Driver License (CDL Endorsement)

General Information

CDL Endorsement Test (30 min.)

This video shows tankers, passenger endorsement with air brake test. It shows several types of situations for drivers of tankers hauling liquids in large quantities. It covers the different lengths, weights and center of gravity of the large carriers. It covers transit buses. This includes safety checks for this type of bus.

General CDL Knowledge Test "Refresher" (30 min.)

This 1990 video gives information of operating commercial vehicles. If you were ever in doubt of what you needed to know about safe driving, this information covers topics such as weight, road hazards, skill of driving, classes of CDL's and the written test. The rules that you always wanted to know are right here in this video.

CDL—Part 2A Vehicle Inspection (27 min.)

An all inclusive 1989 video to show the viewer safe driving practices & pre-trip inspections. You will see how vehicle inspections are done. Inspection forms are discussed and the manuals the examiners use are brought out.

Air Brakes CDL-Part 5 (32 min.)

This video is very informative on all the parts of the air breaking system. It is divided up into 4 sections for the viewer. Each section will stop and pause for you to answer the questions at the end of each module. The modules are, Air Brake System Parts, Dual Air Brakes Systems, Inspection of the air brakes, and using air brakes. The video is very helpful by showing all the components of the brake system on a white display board. The air tank, control valves & all the mechanical parts are shown in detail. Great for all drivers and will also help the drivers of Fire and Rescue vehicles to get a better idea of how it all works.

Driving Distractions of the Professional Driver (25 min.)

A video specifically made for the CDL Class B group. If you are a delivery truck driver you will need to get the information shared here. Topics that are covered are, loose packages, eating in the drivers seat, loose paperwork, laptops, cell phones while driving, and all the other distractions that may occur.

Operation Lifesaver (5 min.)

There are three (3) separate training videos on this one VCR Tape. All three cover the topic of Railroad Crossing safety.

Anytime is Train Time (13 min)

Discusses the 3 E's of Railroad Crossings – Education, Engineering & Enforcement

Gambling with Death (9 ½ min)

This video showing some old, very old, 1925 public safety footage of the dangers of Railroad Crossings. This is more training of Railroad Crossings being more dangerous than a Rattlesnake.

Extreme 7 Minutes on Mountains (10 min.)

This is a video that teaches safe driving techniques in the mountains. The hills of the North Carolina Mountains will require the best driver to have special skills. The grades, the weather, and the need for pre-trip inspections are definitely brought out in this video. Winter driving will also mean you will need to fully understand the meaning of black ice.

Vehicle Inspection (20 min.)

This video is designed for the professional CDL driver. The proper inspection of your vehicle is important and can save your company money and possibly save lives. The video will show you all the steps of the pre-trip, on the road and also the post trip inspection of the vehicle. A good up-to-date film for the professional.

Alcohol

Driving the Message Home (16 min.)

This video was made in the 1980's and is dedicated to the North Carolina Teens that lost their lives in senseless alcohol-related accidents. The video subject matter is simple. Don't drink and drive. Teens in a backyard swim party discuss the law and the serious consequences of driving under the influence. North Carolina Alcohol Law Enforcement officers speak of the serious consequences. The laws of legal age to buy alcohol have changed since this video. For all teens to adult viewers.

It's Up To You! Driver's Education (18 min.)

A very good video made in 1992 that shows teenagers in two groups doing two different things and getting into serious trouble while behind the wheel. It is all about making the correct decisions. Topics that are discussed are seat belt laws, speeding violations, drinking and driving. Two famous NASCAR drivers narrate parts of the video and put all this into it proper perspective. Made for Teens and for the Adult driver also. Some parts of the video show graphic scenes that are the result of a serious accident.

Driver Safety Series Alcohol and Drugs (14 min.)

Mike Muffins' driver safety video talks of drugs and alcohol to a class of students taking driver training. With a blend of humor and facts, Mike will show how the body reacts to alcohol and other drugs. A video for teens to adults.

Adam's Last Day (16 min.)

Adam learns about the all too frequent consequences of drunk driving, the life changing impact that occurs when a person is responsible for another person's death. High School to Adult

The Aftermath (24 min.)

This is a true story involving Bruce Kimball, an Olympic diver and silver medallist in the 1984 Olympics. Bruce was the driver of a car that ran into a crowd of teenagers. Two were killed and three others were critically injured. Bruce was found to be driving while impaired. This film deals with the grief and agony experienced by the victims, families, and friend as a result of this alcohol-related crash.

Alcohol and Drugs (13 min.)

This video reviews and refutes many of the myths surrounding driving under the influence and how drugs affect one's abilities. Hosted by Mike Muffins, a comedian and professional instructor in a top traffic school. Also reviews the legal limits for alcohol content in the bloodstream. A convincing case for driving cold sober at all times. For grade level 10 to adult.

Blurred Lines (25 min.)

Viewers, by seeing and listening to stories related by the families of victims who were killed or maimed in alcohol related accidents. Explains how they are also victims because of the emotional stress caused by the pain and suffering they must endure everyday over their loss. High School to Adult.

Contract For Life: The S.A.D.D. Story (31 min.)

The compelling story of how a group of dedicated students and their teacher establish the first chapter of S.A.D.D. (Students Against Drunk Driving) The video shows two members of the school hockey team die in two separate automobile accidents within the course of four days. Without condoning drinking, the film shows students and adults working together to attack this ugly problem. Junior high through adult.

Deadliest Weapon In America (29 min.)

This is narrated and hosted by Collin Siedor; this hard-hitting film examines both the statistical and human sides of the most unpredictable killer in recent history: the drunk driver. Millions of potential killers are loose in America. Every 20 minutes one of them strikes randomly, murdering or maiming victims. These killers are not lunatics or members of a fanatical cult. They are community leaders, housewives, business people, parents, teenagers, or just about anyone who drinks and then drives. For high school, college and adult safety or substance abuse.

Drinking and Drugs: Driving Under The Influence (18 min.)

True stories, which dramatize the real-life tragic consequences of mixing drugs or alcohol with driving. Through controlled-reaction tests and tests in a driving simulator, the program clearly demonstrates that mind-altering substances impair perceptions, slow reactions, and erode judgment. High School to Adults.

Driving Drunk (30 min.)

The impact on viewers of this film regarding the dangers of driving drunk is unforgettable. Viewers look at several guests enjoying a cocktail party, watching them change as they drink. They are not actors but volunteers altering themselves with alcohol from responsible to irresponsible. Myths are exploded. Alternatives are demonstrated. Lives are saved. Junior High to adult.

DUI: It Could Never Happen To Me (25 min.)

This dramatizes a traffic accident with teenage fatalities caused by driving under the influence of alcohol. In addition, the film follows the severe moral, legal, and psychological effects of driving under the influence.

DUI: The Price Is Too High (23 min.)

The film shows how using alcohol or drugs carries a steep price tag. The stories of three young first-time offenders are typical. After their arrest each faces the painful consequences of their actions, including the loss of their driver's license, the need to retain an attorney, being sentenced, paying fines, attending an alcohol and drug awareness program, having auto insurance canceled or premiums increased, or in the case of at least one, losing their job.

If You Could See What I've Seen (23 min.)

A highly emotional approach is taken to the important issue of drinking and driving. Highway Patrol officer Pete Collins graphically describes a number of true events, which force the viewer to consider the potential consequences of drunk driving. Junior High to Adult

Last Dance (18 min.)

This program portrays the tragic aftermath of a drunken-driving accident and the sometimes fatal consequences of the failure to use seatbelts. High School to Adult

Saying No to Drinking Drivers (23 min.)

A different kind of film about driving under the influence. The three main concepts explored are; how to avoid riding with an intoxicated driver; how to stop an intoxicated friend from driving; and how to plan ahead to avoid these situations. Good for driver education and adults.

BICYCLE AND PEDESTRIAN

Bicycle Drivers Don't Have To Have Accidents (15 min.)

Demonstrates the main causes and reminds viewers that bicycles on the streets and highways are vehicles of transportation and must obey the same rules as automobiles. Shows how and why accidents are caused: by riding on the wrong side of the road, not remembering that a bicycle is small and hard to see, failing to stop at stop signs, risk-taking, high-speed riding, tricks, poor weather and night visibility, and other accident-causing factors. Good for elementary school level.

Bicycle Rules of the Road (16 min.)

With this film, children will learn that whether a bicycle is used for fun, exercise, or transportation, they have a responsibility to ride safely. Included is a bike rodeo which consists of nine tests that are demonstrated in real-life situations on the street and provides a fun and informative lesson in bicycle safety.

Bicycle Rules-Safety First (15 min.)

An animated film featuring Fat Albert and the Gang. When Weird Harold's uncle lends Harold his racing bicycle, Harold breaks all the rules and becomes a careless rider-an accident waiting to happen. Harold crashes into kindly old Mrs. Kowalski and she's taken to the hospital badly shaken. Harold finally learns his lesson and understands a cyclist who ignores the rules is a danger to himself and a threat to others. Good for elementary grades.

Bicycle Safety (14 min.)

Shown are the rules of the road for bikers while riding alone or with friends, on quiet or busy streets. Safety begins with a safety check of your bike, and involves obeying traffic laws while you ride, riding defensively and maintaining control at all times. From the excitement of stunt riding to the beauty of bike trail, viewers will see that safe bicycling makes that invigorating sport even more enjoyable. Good for all ages.

Helmets (25 min.)

Makes viewer aware of the need to wear a helmet while operating a motorcycle no matter what the traffic environment. Depicts potential dangers of various traffic settings, the experience of veteran drivers, and the thorough construction and testing of helmets. Forces the viewer to examine the many "excuses" for not wearing a helmet and emphasizes the inescapable conclusion that helmets do protect and preserve the life of the rider.

McGruff On The Law: Bicycles and Pedestrians. (18 min.)

McGruff explains why bicycles and pedestrian laws protect bicyclists and other people. McGruff illustrates safety points that children should always remember. Primary to Intermediate

SAFETY BELTS AND OTHER RESTRAINTS

Buckle Up... And Do It Right! (14 Min.)

Shows how belts should be worn for maximum benefit; explains what must be done to avoid belt-induced injuries. Demonstrates the mechanism, which locks up belts; and shows the new technologies of occupant restraint.

On Country Roads (16 min.)

Explains why statistics show that two-thirds of all fatal vehicle accidents and vehicle injuries occur on rural roads. Explains why the reasons are due to the difference between rural roads and city streets, the speed limits of each, the different types of vehicles used, and why people do not feel it necessary to wear their seat belts because of the short distances traveled in rural areas.

Room To Live (27 min.)

Presents one of the most effective programs ever produced on seat belt safety, starring Sergeant Jack Ware. Winner of the 1980 Cindy Gold Award and the 1980 National Safety Council Film Contest. Good for all age groups.

Safety Belts: For Dummies Or People (8 min.)

A two part video, the first part presents in an understandable and very realistic way, the facts about safety belts. Shows why safety belts work and how to wear belts properly. The second part covers drinking and driving.

Seatbelts and Passenger Restraints (17 min.)

Discusses why and how a seatbelt should be worn at all times, air bags, safety glass, and the proper restraint of children in cars. Hosted by Mike Muffins, a comedian and professional instructor in a top traffic school. Grade level 10 to adult.

Seat Belts: The Life Saving Habit (20 min.)

With clear and convincing explanations and demonstrations, this film refutes the common excuses for not wearing seat belts. The facts and arguments presented in this film are sure to motivate drivers and passengers to use these life saving safety devices. Good for all ages.
