5307 Transition Overview and Next Steps

New Directions/Empowering Local Agencies

- FTA Circular 9030.1E specifies the Governor (or his designee) to be the "Designated Recipient" in small UZAs
 - NCDOT will authorize a public entity in each small UZA to be a "Direct Recipient"
 - Direct Recipients must be a public agency legally eligible to apply for and receive grants from FTA
 - Small UZAs will have principal authority and responsibility for administering Urbanized Area Formula Program funds within a UZA

Agreement with NCDOT

 A written agreement will be executed to transfer responsibility for the Urban Formula Program to the Direct Recipient

6. SAMPLE SUPPLEMENTAL AGREEMENT

UNITED STATES OF AMERICA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION FEDERAL TRANSIT ADMINISTRATION SUPPLEMENTAL AGREEMENT (Attachment to FTA G-15, October 1, 2008)

It is the practice of the Federal Transit Administration to enter into a formal agreement with the designated recipient for projects that the designated recipient does not carry out directly. Under this Grant Agreement, the grant recipient is not the designated recipient. Therefore, the designated recipient hereby agrees to permit the grant recipient under this Grant Agreement to receive and dispense the federal assistance funds described in this Grant Agreement. The designated recipient further agrees that the grant recipient shall assume all responsibilities set forth in this Grant Agreement.

The federal government and the grant recipient under this Grant Agreement hereby agree that the designated recipient is not in any manner subject to or responsible for the terms and conditions of this Grant Agreement and is a party to this Grant Agreement only to assign the right to receive and dispense federal funds to the grant recipient as described above.

Funding & Suballocations

- The Governor, by law, remains the Designated Recipient and is responsible for suballocation of Section 5307 funds to small UZAs
- Split letter issued to FTA indicating allocation amounts in each apportionment year
 - Will be done in cooperation and with the coordination of the respective MPOs
 - NCDOT will respect past funding allocations
- Direct recipients will apply funding, consistent with the split letter

Funding & Suballocations

- In some instances, there may be multiple Direct Recipients and "pass-through" recipients in an urbanized area
 - In UZAs served by more than one public transit provider, it is possible to have multiple Direct Recipients in the UZA
 - NCDOT will coordinate with the respective MPOs in situations where multiple entities should be named as Direct Recipients
 - Lower-tier contractual relationships are also permissible
 - "Pass-through" arrangements with another eligible recipient
 - Contractual relationships arising from competitive procurements

Application Process

- After the effective date of the transition, Direct Recipients will apply for funds directly to FTA
- Direct Recipients will use the TrAMS web platform to submit applications
 - TrAMS requires authorization and credentials for each entity
 - FTA has produced signification guidance on the use of the TrAMS platform

Application Process

- NCDOT will work with FTA to provide supporting documentation to demonstrate an applicant's:
 - Technical capacity
 - Managerial capacity
 - Financial capacity
 - Compliance with required elements
 - Title VI
 - ADA
 - Procurement systems

Claims & Reimbursements

- All requests for reimbursement will be made directly to FTA using the Electronic Clearing House Operation (ECHO) system
 - Use of the ECHO system will expedite receipt of grant funding and lessen dependence on local funds to support transit between reimbursement requests
 - ECHO payment turnaround typically 24 48 hours
- Key considerations in use of the ECHO system
 - Must represent actual, eligible costs
 - Must be performed only by authorized individuals
 - If advances of funds are used, disbursements must be made within three business days after drawdown
 - Improper use of ECHO system may result in suspension of ECHO privileges or repayments with interest

Periodic Reporting

- Two Key Documents Must be Submitted for Each Active Grant from FTA
 - MPRs
 - Organized based on projects undertaken in each grant (as developed in the grant application)
 - Must address progress in achieving project milestones, by Activity Line Items (ALIs)
 - FFRs
 - These two reports are they key elements of communication between a recipient and FTA regarding use of FTA funds
 - Typically, small UZAs report to FTA annually on each grant
- Reports are due 30 days following the close of the reporting period (e.g., reports are due on October 30 for annual reporters)

Audit and Oversight

- Single audit requirements under 2 CFR § 200.500 et. seq. remain unchanged
- Indirect Costs
 - If any entity intends to claim indirect costs under the Section 5307 program, the requirements of 2 CFR §
 200 remain unchanged
- As a Direct Recipient, the entity will be subject to Triennial Reviews
- If a Direct Recipient receives both Section 5307 and Section 5311 funding, NCDOT will still have an oversight role in evaluating the entity's compliance with Section 5311 program funding requirements
 - NCDOT will develop new oversight procedures to reduce duplication of oversight activities from federal and state authorities

Transition Assistance

• NCDOT

- On-going program of technical assistance (monthly video conference)
- One-on-one assistance will provided by Subject Matter Experts (SME) with schedule help desk times
- NCDOT will be posting Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs) concerning the transition on its website
- FAQs will be updated weekly throughout the transition period
- A resource page will be established with key training, regulatory, and resource documents will be available for download
 - Governing directives (regulatory material)
 - TrAMS documentation
 - ECHO system documentation
 - FTA reporting requirements (MPRs/FFRs)
 - Triennial Review process
 - NTD reporting

• FTA

- Review and approve grant applications for designated and direct recipients
- Obligate funds for approved grant applications
- Work with recipients to implement the annual program
- Provide technical assistance
- Receive recipient certifications and amendments to the program of projects
- Monitor and close grants
- Conduct triennial reviews and state management reviews every three years or as circumstances warrant, and other reviews as necessary

• NCDOT

- Providing technical assistance throughout the transition period
- Allocating FTA's annual apportionment of Section 5307 funds to small UZAs
- Serving as the Designated Recipient of Section 5307
- Transferring funds between small urbanized areas after consultation with responsible local officials and transit agencies
- Transferring potentially lapsing funds at least 90 days before expiration

- Direct Recipient
 - Submitting requisite documentation to FTA
 - Demonstrating legal and technical capacity
 - Demonstrating procurement capacity
 - Submitting timely MPRs/FFRs on a schedule established by FTA
 - Complying with all Civil Rights requirements
 - Conducting single audits
 - Reporting under NTD

- MPOs
 - Offer recommendation and concur on the selection of the entity that will serve as the Direct Recipient within the UZA
 - Coordinate with NCDOT in formulating the recommended allocations of Section 5307 funds to small UZAs
 - Identify projects (capital, operating, etc.) that will be included in the short-range transit plan, TIP, and/or unified planning work program (UPWP)
 - Adopt UPWPs that include a list of planning projects, scopes, and related costs.
 - Ensure any NTI training funds are included in the TIP

• MPOs

- Offer recommendation and concur on the selection of the entity that will serve as the Direct Recipient within the UZA
- Coordinate with NCDOT in formulating the recommended allocations of Section 5307 funds to small UZAs
- Identify projects (capital, operating, etc.) that will be included in the short-range transit plan, TIP, and/or unified planning work program (UPWP)
- Adopt UPWPs that include a list of planning projects, scopes, and related costs.
- Ensure any NTI training funds are included in the TIP

Compensation Study Findings

- Blended services can create more opportunities
- · Challenges are more pronounced in rural areas and for smaller transit systems
- Higher pay leads to lower vacancies
- Reliable hours and pay attracts workers
- Workers want training, health benefits, and a quality work environment

Workforce Workgroup Formed

- IMD will lead a workforce workgroup with select transit system directors, NCPTA, NCDMV, and others
- The group will develop strategies and recommendations to address the driver shortage challenge

State Management Plan

- SMP draft updates being finalized this week.
- Next step: distribute to transit systems by next week for comment – 30-day review period.
- November December update document incorporating comments/feedback.
- Complete SMP update by January 1 share with transit agencies and FTA.
