Program Income

Definition:

FTA recognizes program income to be gross income (minus the cost of generating program income) earned by the recipient that is directly generated by a supported activity, or earned only as a result of federal funds during a period of performance **Examples of Program Income:**

- ✓ Income from fees for services performed, such as fees collected for servicing tickets for Greyhound.
- ✓ Income from the use or rental of real or personal property
 - Rent received from leasing a portion of a facility that is owned by the transit agency
 - Income from leasing vehicle(s) to another transit system
- ✓ Income from the sale of advertising from local businesses concessions
- ✓ Income from the sale of commodities, such as profits from vending machines on property like a transfer station

Program Income

Activities that are NOT considered program income:

- Interest accrued on grant funds
- <u>Refunds, credits, discounts, rebates</u> earned on items purchased with federal funds
- <u>Farebox revenues</u> must be deducted from eligible operating expenses before applying for Operating Assistance
- <u>Sale of federally-funded assets</u>, such as vehicles, real property or equipment. This process is laid out in FTA Circular 5010 (<u>Award</u> <u>Mgmt Circular</u>)

Program Income Guidance

Reporting: Quarterly Reporting

• IMD sends a spreadsheet specific to each program for the recording of program income

Utilizing Program Income:

 Any income generated must be spent on eligible transit capital and/or operating expenses for that program

Program Income Generated from Emergency Relief Funds

Must Reserve, Track, and Use Properly

- Transit agencies have two options when program income is generated from CARES funding:
 - 1. Deduct program income from eligible expenses when submitting claims (similar to farebox revenues).
 - 2. Reserve and track program income and utilize in the future as match to FTA funds or for eligible transit expenses.

- The purpose of the survey is for the IMD to collect information on program income at the transit system level, relative to the Federal Emergency Relief funds (CARES, CRRSAA, ARP).
 Program Income includes things such as advertising on vehicles, concessions, income generated from the lease of building space or vehicle to another agency.
- The survey is only geared toward program income not contract revenue.
- Future actions could include required quarterly reporting, a programmatic review by IMD, and targeted document review during proficiency reviews.

- Procurement (\$10,000-\$29,999)
- Contact or send requests for quotes to at least 3 responsible vendors
- Quotes can be informal (over the phone or email)
- Procurement Checklist and History Form
- All bids over \$25,000 require a Debarment Certification signed by vendor
- Require E-Verify compliance for any service or installation

- Procurement (\$30,000-\$89,999) for Equipment/Supplies; \$30,000-\$499,000 for Construction
- Contact or send requests for quotes to at least 3 responsible vendors
- Must receive at least 3 quotes back
- Procurement Checklist and History Form
- All bids over \$25,000 require Debarment Certification signed by vendor
- Require E-Verify compliance for any service or installation
- Buy America certification needed for projects over \$150,000

- Procurement Sealed Bid (\$90,000 and above);
 \$500,000 and above for Construction
- Must advertise bid for at least 7 full days before bid opening
- May use electronic ad, newspaper or both (must have prior agency board approval if solely electronic)
- Procurement Checklist and History Form
- Requires Debarment Certification signed by vendor
- All bids exceeding \$100,000 vendors and/or consultants must sign Lobbying Certification
- Require E-Verify compliance for any service or installation
- Buy America certification needed for all bids involving construction, equipment or materials over \$150,000

- Raised Roof Van/LTV Contract Status Update
 - As of 10/5/21, the previous NCDOT-specific contract for LTVs has expired
 - Currently finalizing the bid posting for an NCDOT-specific contract for LTVs and Raised Roof Vans
 - Mid-roof and high-top RR vans
 - 20ft, 22ft, 25ft and 28ft Light Transit Cutaway-type Vehicles (LTV)
 - Bid is currently undergoing final specification review by NCDOT Main Purchasing Division before submission to NC Division of Purchase and Contract
 - Bid posting expected by end of April 2022; contract awards should take place by July/August 2022.

TSA Mask Mandate



The Transportation Security Administration (TSA) is extending the face mask requirement for individuals across all transportation networks throughout the United States, including at airports, onboard commercial aircraft, on over-the-road buses, and on commuter bus and rail systems **April 18, 2022.**

COVID-19 Response Reporting

- Federal Transit Administration (FTA) launched an online application to collect information from recipients and subrecipients on the impacts of COVID-19. The FTA will use information submitted through the application to inform FTA actions in support of the transit industry's COVID-19 recovery efforts and implementation of the Federal mask requirement for public transportation. - As of Dec 7, 2021, this requirement was continued indefinitely.

FTA Low-No and Bus Competitive Grant Programs FY22 Notice of Funding Opportunity

- Survey of Interest will be out no later than 03/21/22 (Monday) and will be due 03/31/22 (Thursday)
- We will review those who have submitted interest to determine applicability and readiness within the next week and move forward quickly in order to meet the deadline.

Background:

- NOFO was released 3/4/22 with a deadline of 05/31/22
- The FTA is offering \$1.1 billion under the Low or No Emission Grant Program and \$372 million under the Grants for Buses and Bus Facilities program (both competitive grants, both nationwide)

FTA Low-No and Bus Competitive Grant Programs FY22 Notice of Funding Opportunity

• Eligibility:

- The Low-No Program provides funds to designated recipients of FTA grants, including states, local governmental authorities and Indian Tribes.
- The Buses and Bus Facilities Program provides funds to designated recipients that allocate funds to <u>fixed-route bus operators</u>, states, or local governmental authorities that <u>operate fixed-route bus service</u>, and Indian tribes.
- Local Match The Federal Share of the total cost for most projects is up to 80%. Applicants are expected to provide the remaining 20% in Local Match.

BURLINGTON, NC'S LINK TRANSIT BUYS TWO BYD BATTERY-ELECTRIC BUSES



LOS ANGELES, CALIF. (2/10/2022) – BYD announced the City of Burlington, N.C. bought two K7M 30-foot battery-electric buses to serve the customers of its Link Transit. The sale marks BYD's first entry into the North Carolina market.

The BYD K7M has 22 seats, a range of up to 150 miles, and can be charged in 2.5 to 3 hours. The K7M is one of BYD's top products. It has no air emissions and runs quietly, improving quality of life wherever it operates. With lower fuel and maintenance costs, the K7M has lower total cost of ownership than diesel or CNG.
