

VACCINATION TRIPS PROVIDED BY NC TRANSIT AGENCIES

Since the beginning of the T2V efforts, 83 Transit Systems (86%) have reported over 15,216 Trips and traveled over 126,569 miles to provide transportation to 9,903 people for vaccinations.
