

Defensive Driving Course Information

Effective August 15, 2019, all *initial* applicants for the Escort Vehicle Operator Program will be required to submit documentation of completion of a defensive driving course that has been approved by the National Safety Council in addition to a copy of their State certified driving record and application to the NCDOT Oversize/Overweight Permit Unit.

FAQ

Q: If I hold a Class A commercial driver's license, am I required to take the Defensive Driving course from the National Safety Council?

A: Yes, all Initial applicants are required to submit documentation of completion of a defensive driving course that has been approved by the National Safety Council.

Q: Am I required to take a course that is a specific length of time – ex: the 4-hour or the 8-hour course?

A: No, you may take any defensive driving course, as long as it is approved by the National Safety Council.

Q: What if I have taken the defensive driving course sometime in the past? Does the course have to be current or can I use my old certificate?

A: As long as the course you took was approved by the National Safety Council, you can use the certificate from a defensive driving course you've taken in the past.

Q: Are recerts required to take the defensive driving course?

A: No. Anyone holding a North Carolina EVO Certification with an effective date prior to August 15, 2019 is "grandfathered in" and does not have to provide documentation of a defensive driving course when recertifying.

Q: What if I let my current certification expire? Do I have to apply as an initial applicant and take the defensive driving course at that time?

A: No. If you have EVER held a North Carolina EVO Certification, you are grandfathered in and do not have to take the defensive driving course. You are only required to take the 4-hour EVO Renewal course offered by the Community College System or third-party vendor.
