





90.6% Combine Usage Rate (+2.0%)


90.9% Driver Usage Rate (+1.3%)

#### **Charges by Participating Agencies**

12,056 Seat Belt Charges – 7% Decrease

1,152 Child Passenger Safety Charges – 17% Decrease

13,208 Total OP Charges – 10% Decrease

1,845 DWI Charges – 7% Decrease

11,217 Criminal Charges – 17% Decrease

89,467 Traffic & Criminal Charges – 5% Decrease

# 2015 North Carolina Seat Belt Survey Vs. 2014 Seat Belt Survey

Johnston (95.5%) Nash (95.1%) and Alamance (93.8%) were the highest

Columbus/Rowan (88.2%), Harnett (86.4%) and Robeson (83.3%) were the lowest

Urban vs Rural - 91.5% to 84.6%











Of the drivers who were stopped and cited during the NTSBE enforcement activities...


60.9% had a moving violation on their records

From 2009-2013, on average, 48 of 92 teen fatalities\* (15-19) were unrestrained - **That is 52%!**
