The Governor's Highway Safety Program accomplishes our mission in two ways, through grant funding opportunities and conducting highway safety initiatives each year.









FY 2019 Grants

- Funding decisions are based on rigorous analysis- Annual Highway Safety
 Plan
- Over \$17 million for 93 community grants
- DWI Treatment Courts in Buncombe and Cumberland Counties
- Crime labs in Pitt County, Wake County and Wilmington to expand blood alcohol testing capabilities
- 9 DWI Enforcement Teams, 11 Law Enforcement Liaisons, 45 Law Enforcement Agencies
- Forensic Test for Alcohol unit at NC Department of Health & Human Services
- NC Conference of District Attorneys for training and DWI prosecutor specialists
