

Leading Cause of Death, North Carolina


Ages 15 to 19






Teen Fatalities in MV Crashes, North Carolina

A Little History

Graduated Driver Licensing (GDL)

- Concept originated in NC
- GDL bill introduced in mid-1990s
- Joint effort of GHSP, HSRC, CFTF, AAA & others
- 34 Senators & 101 Reps co-sponsored the bill
- Signed into law in 1997





Graduated Driver Licensing


Principles:

- Lots of driving experience
- Reduce exposure to high-risk settings






Young Driver Crashes by Months Licensed

Graduated Driver Licensing

Addresses inexperience:

- 12-month learner period
- Must be supervised at all times
- 60 hours driving (10 at night)





Graduated Driver Licensing


Provisional/intermediate license stage

- May not drive unsupervised from 9pm to 5am
- Limit of one teen passenger
- No cell phones






Teen Fatal Crashes by Time of Day






Risk of Driver Death

Why Have Fatalities Decreased?

- 1) Graduated Driver Licensing
- 2) Fewer licensed teens:
 - 16-year-olds in NC w/permit or license
 - 68% in 1991
 - 58% in 2011



Young Driver Crashes by Months Licensed


















Counts of Young Drivers in Crashes in North Carolina (Ages 16 -17)






In the weeks after things shut down, I was concerned my teen was not getting enough practice.






Do you approve of teens getting a license without taking a road test?






Does the thought of teenagers getting a license without taking a road test make you feel...

Parent comments

- "We feel that learning to drive is an important enough lifelong skill that the driving process shouldn't be fast-tracked."
- "The idea that we're going to reduce what little we have in place for safety, for reasons completely unrelated to road safety, to me is a problem."
- "I am terrified because I, as a parent, want to make sure that my kid is safe and the basic hours were not enough for me."
- "I don't think that the duration of the permit holding should be shortened at all because they do a lot of maturing in a year."
- "I have a problem with shortening that time period, because I mean, that's the time when the parents are there to supervise."
- "I'd like to see him not do the mistakes that I made. The more time that he gets with us, I think, is the best thing."
