

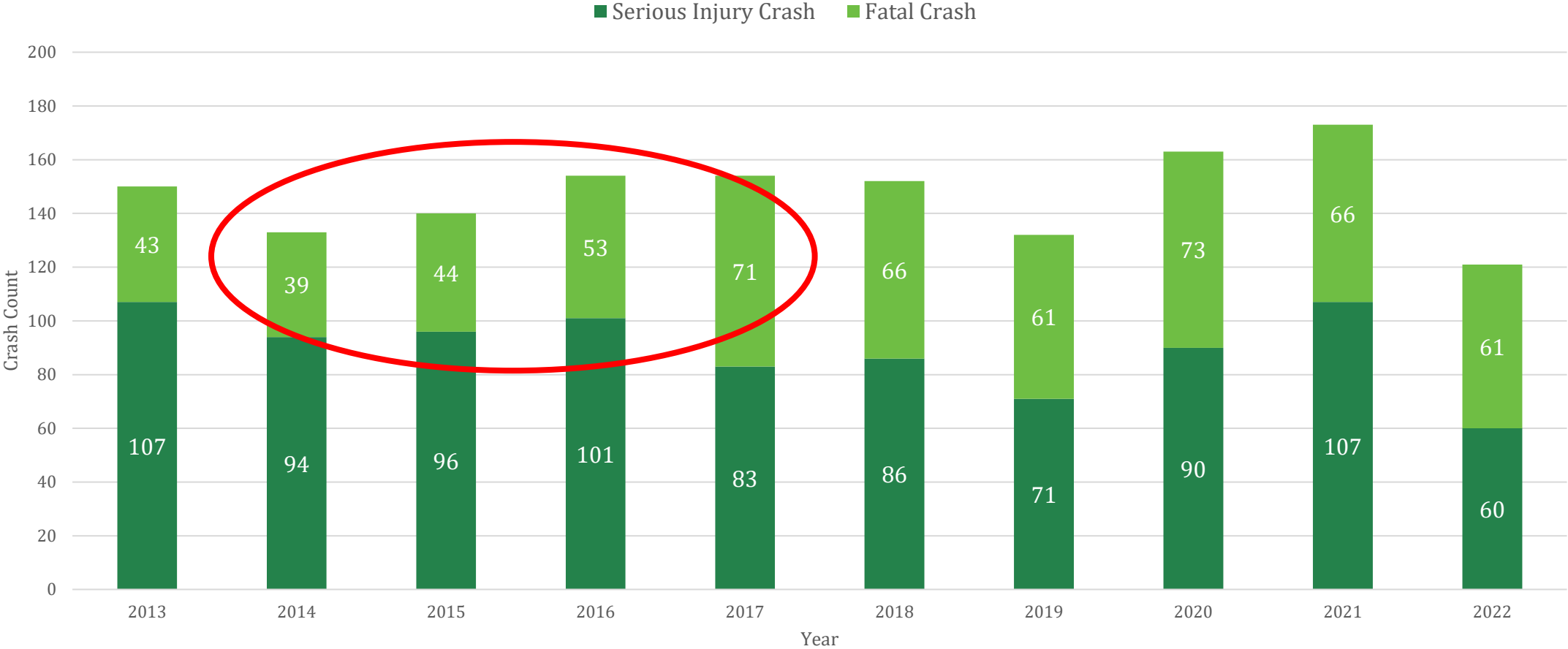

Why Vision Zero in Charlotte?



71 crashes resulted in **74 fatalities** on Charlotte streets in 2017. This was the **4th consecutive increase in annual fatalities**.

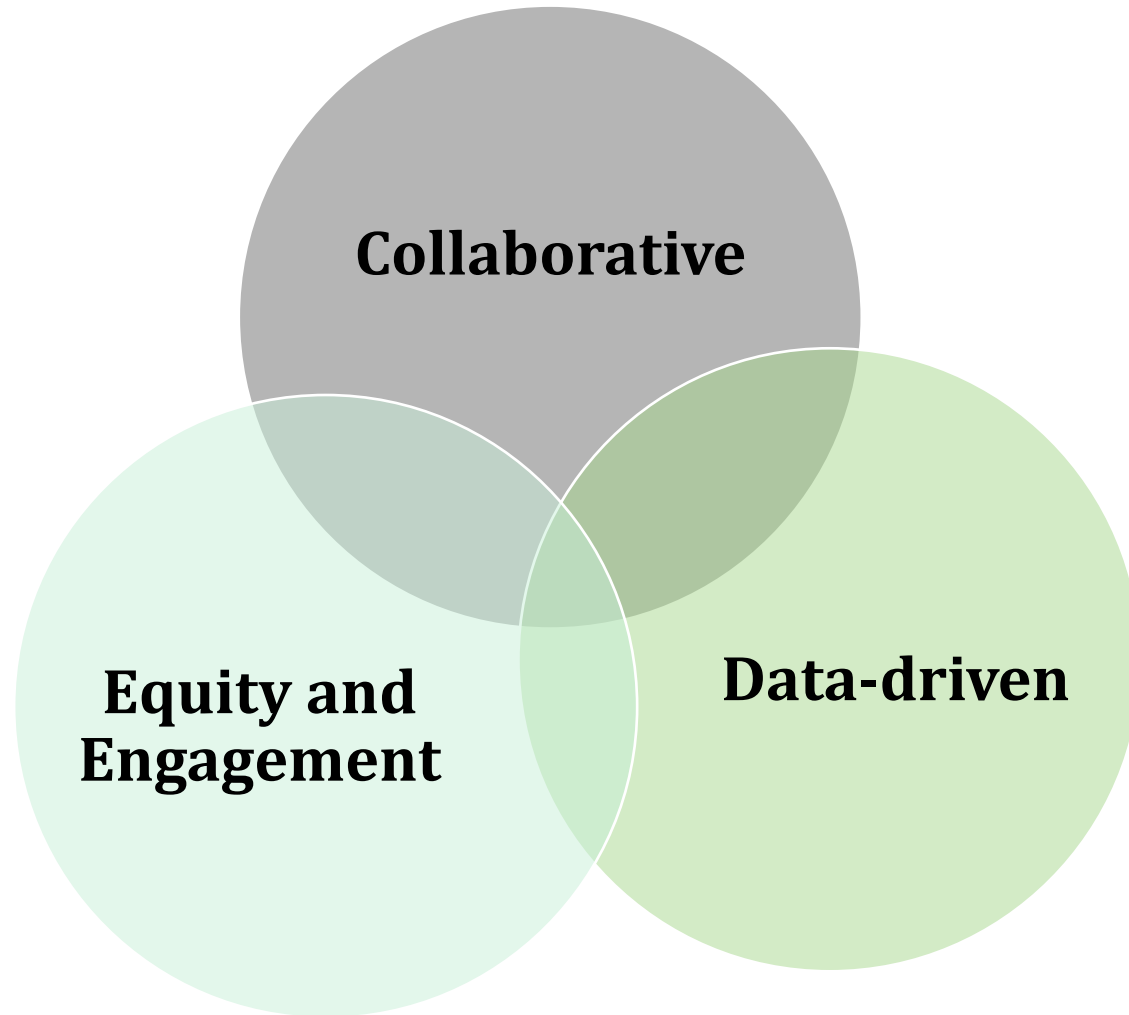


27 pedestrians were killed on our streets in 2017.



People walking and bicycling are involved in **< 3% of all crashes** but account for over **40% of all traffic deaths**.

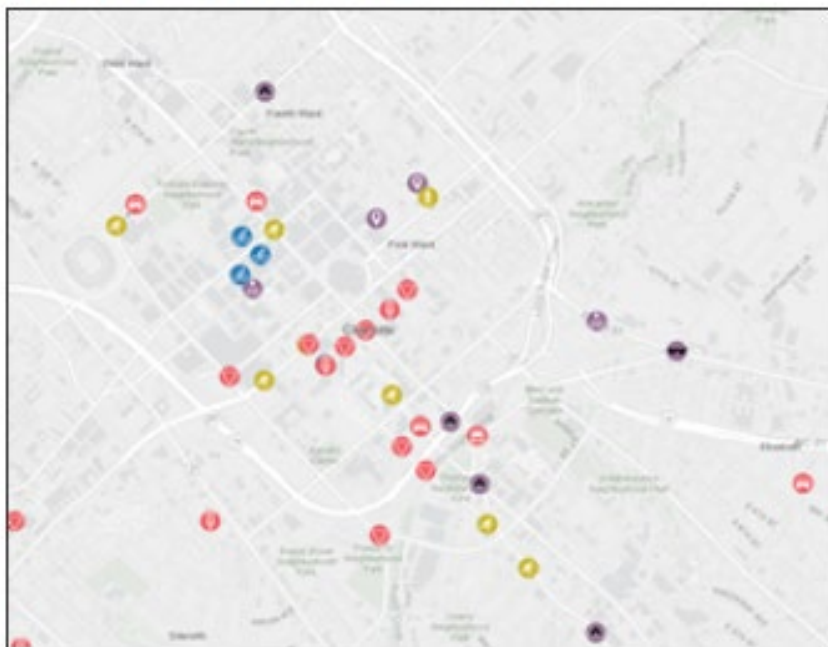

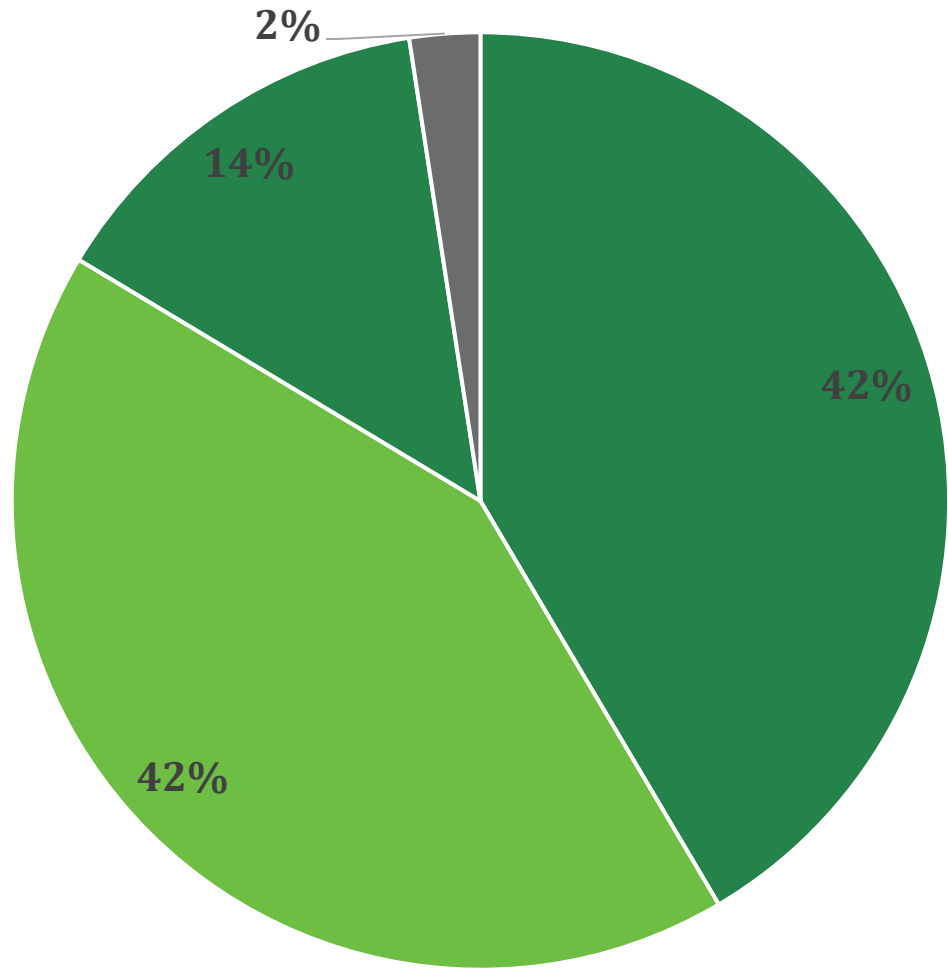

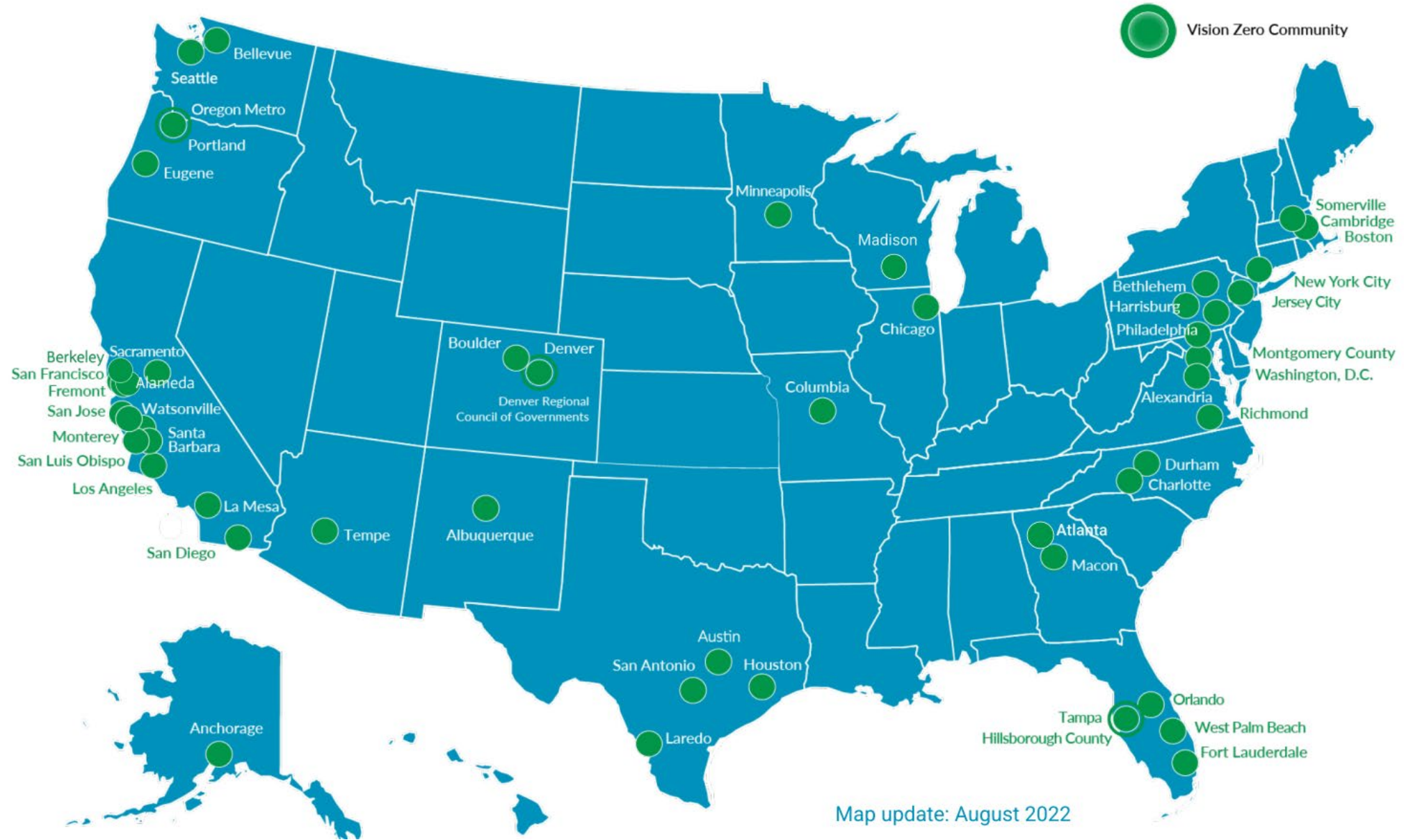
