








Step 1: Desktop Research

- 15 States had similar Committees or Commissions as North Carolina




Step 2: Collect Additional Desktop Information





Potential Paths Forward



Pathway A – Maintain the Current ECHS Structure

Survey existing ECHS members about the responsibilities and direction of the ECHS. Clarify the structure of the ECHS in a formal memorandum that summarizes its purpose.

Implement the low-effort changes prior to the start of the annual year.











Use the feedback from to refocus the ECHS purpose in the aspects listed.

Develop onboarding training and materials

Pathway B – Hire a Neutral Facilitator

Survey existing ECHS members about the responsibilities and direction of the Committee. Identify
opportunities
for a neutral
facilitator to
engage with or
lead the
Committee

Invite the chosen neutral party and coordinate their responsibilities.













Clarify the structure of the ECHS.

Research candidates for the neutral facilitator role.

On-board the neutral facilitator to the ECHS.

Pathway C – Executive Order/Legislative Route

Survey existing ECHS members about the responsibilities and direction of the committee.

Identify champions of the ECHS to coordinate legislative efforts.

Invite safety stakeholders and partners to support and lobby for the proposed legislation.













Clarify aspects of the ECHS in written format.

Propose and sponsor legislation in front of NC State Legislature.

Receive formal documentation of the ECHS.
