AWARD OF CONTRACT

The award of the contract, if it be awarded, will be made to the lowest responsible Bidder in accordance with Section 102 (excluding 102-10) of the current edition of the *Standard Specifications for Roads and Structures*. The lowest responsible bidder will be notified that his bid has been accepted and that he has been awarded the contract. NCDOT reserves the right to reject any or all bids.

PROJECT SPECIAL PROVISIONS

GENERAL

The North Carolina Department of Transportation (hereinafter referred to as "Department") is seeking the services of a Contractor to install and establish Landscape Plantings and Irrigation System. The work shall consist of furnishing labor, traffic control, installing various plants. The Contractor will complete a Plant Bed Establishment Work (Maintenance of Plant Bed's) regiment.

All work and materials shall be in accordance with the provisions of the General Guidelines of this contract, the Project Special Provisions, the North Carolina Department of Transportation *Standard Specifications for Roads and Structures*, the current edition of the North Carolina Department of Transportation *Roadway Standards Drawings*, and the current edition of the *Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices* (MUTCD).

Wherever reference is given to codes, or standard specifications, or other data published by regulating agencies or accepted organizations, including but not limited to N.C. State Building Codes. Federal Specifications, ASTM Specifications, N.C. Department of Transportation "Standard Specifications for Roads and Structures", and the like, it shall be understood that such reference is to the latest edition including addenda published prior to and after the date of the contract documents.

The Contractor shall keep him/herself fully informed of all Federal, State and local laws, ordinances, and regulations, and shall comply with the provisions of Section 107 of the *Standard Specifications*.

BASIS OF AWARD:

Actual quantities will be determined on an as needed basis. The quantities shown on the bid form will be used to establish unit prices for each line item and determination of low bid only. The Contractor shall submit a unit price for every item on the bid form. The Department reserves the right to increase or reduce quantities with no adjustment in unit prices.

<u>Unit prices should reflect actual costs; in accordance with Article 102-14, unbalanced bids may be rejected.</u>

Quotations will be evaluated based on the total bid of all items. There are no guarantees either stated or implied for the quantities as shown on the bid form. <u>Payment to the successful low bidder will be based on actual quantities installed and accepted at the PER UNIT PRICE for each item as quoted.</u>

The Department reserves the right to reject any or all bids.

SMALL BUSINESS ENTERPRISE PROGRAM:

This is a Small Business Enterprise Program project, and as such, will be restricted to businesses with a gross income of not more than \$1.5 million, excluding materials during the previous calendar year. Only contractors currently certified as an SBE contractor by the Contractual Services Unit of NCDOT and listed in the Directory of Transportation Firms at bid opening will be eligible to bid on this project.

Since general liability insurance is required, a copy of a certificate of insurance must also be submitted. Proof of small business status will be the previous year's income tax return. A copy of this return does not have to be submitted with this bid proposal, but may be requested at a later date.

General Statute §136-28.10, an award in a contract may be for an amount less but shall not exceed \$1,000,000 per year. No payments in excess of this amount will be disbursed, in accordance with the Statute.

CONTRACT TIME AND LIQUIDATED DAMAGES

The date of availability for this project is <u>APRIL 8, 2024 OR UPON ISSURANCE OF PURCHASE ORDER</u>. No work will be permitted and no purchase order will be issued until all prerequisite conditions and certifications have been satisfied.

The completion date for this project is <u>August 16, 2024</u>. No extensions will be authorized except as authorized by Article 108-10 of the current edition of the *Standard Specifications*.

Liquidated damages for this contract are Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00) per calendar day.

INTERMEDIATE CONTRACT TIME NUMBER 1 AND LIQUIDATED DAMAGES

The Contractor shall complete all work required to install Irrigation and all annual bedding plants.

The date of availability for Irrigation and initial planting is April 23, 2024.

The completion date for the Irrigation and initial planting is May 17, 2024.

Liquidated damages for these seasonal limitations and intermediate contract times are Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00) per calendar day.

INTERMEDIATE CONTRACT TIME NUMBER 2 AND LIQUIDATED DAMAGES:

The Contractor shall not narrow or close a lane of traffic on **any road**, detain and /or alter the traffic flow on or during holiday weekends, special events, or any other time when traffic is unusually heavy, including the following schedules:

DAY AND TIME RESTRICTIONS MONDAY THRU SUNDAY FROM 7:30 A.M. TO 8:30 A.M. MONDAY THRU SUNDAY FROM 4:30 P.M. TO 5:30 P.M.

HOLIDAY AND HOLIDAY WEEKEND LANE CLOSURE RESTRICTIONS

- 1. For **unexpected occurrence** that creates unusually high traffic volumes, as directed by the Engineer.
- 2. For **New Year's Day**, between the hours of **4:00 p.m.** December 31st and **8:30 a.m.** January 2nd. If New Year's Day is on a Friday, Saturday, Sunday or Monday, then until **8:30 a.m.** the following Tuesday.
- 3. For Martin Luther King, Jr. Day, between the hours of 4:00 p.m. Friday and 8:30 a.m. Tuesday.
- 4. For **Easter**, between the hours of **4:00 p.m.** Thursday and **8:30 a.m.** Monday.
- 5. For Memorial Day, between the hours of 4:00 p.m. Friday and 8:30 a.m. Tuesday.
- 6. For **Independence Day**, between the hours of **4:00 p.m.** the day before Independence Day and **8:30 a.m.** the day after Independence Day.
 - If **Independence Day** is on a Friday, Saturday, Sunday or Monday, then between the hours of **4:00** p.m. the Thursday before Independence Day and **8:30** a.m. the Tuesday after Independence Day.
- 7. For Labor Day, between the hours of 4:00 p.m. Friday and 8:30 a.m. Tuesday.
- 8. For Veteran's Day, between the hours of 4:00 p.m. Friday and 8:30 a.m. Tuesday.
- 9. For **Thanksgiving Day**, between the hours of **4:00 p.m.** Tuesday and **8:30 a.m.** Monday.
- 10. For **Christmas**, between the hours of **4:00 p.m.** the Friday before the week of Christmas Day and **8:30 a.m.** the following Tuesday after the week of Christmas Day.
- 11. For the U.S. Open Golf Championship, held at Pinehurst Resort & Country Club from June 10, 2024, to June 16, 2024, between the hours of 4:30 p.m. the Friday before the U.S. Open Golf Championship and 8:30 a.m. the day after the U.S. Open Golf Championship.

Holidays and holiday weekends shall include New Years, Easter, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving, and Christmas. The Contractor shall schedule his work so that work is not required during these periods, unless otherwise directed by the Engineer.

Liquidated damages for this contract are **Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250.00)** per hour or portion thereof that the Contractor operates outside of the work hours as stated above.

NOTIFICATION OF OPERATIONS

The Contractor shall notify the Engineer forty-eight (48) hours in advance of beginning work on this project. The Contractor shall give the Engineer sufficient notice of all operations for any sampling, inspection or acceptance testing required.

The Contractor shall incur immediate Liquidated Damages in the amount of Two Hundred Fifty Dollars

(\$250.00) for each occurrence for failure to comply with this provision.

INSURANCE

The Contractor shall maintain all legally required insurance coverage, including without limitation, worker's compensation, and vehicle liability, in the amounts required by law. Refer to Section 107-15 in the current edition of "Standard Specifications for Roads and Structures, for additional information.

CONTRACT BID QUANTITIES

The Engineer reserves the right to make changes at any time during the life of the project as to quantity count. The Engineer may increase or decrease quantity count of the various contract items. The Engineer will notify the Contractor in writing of any significant changes in the quantities.

PLAN, DETAIL AND QUANTITY ADJUSTMENTS

The Contractor must cooperate with State forces working within the limits of this project as directed by the Engineer. The Department reserves the right to make, at any time during the progress of the work, such alterations in plans or the details of construction as may be found necessary or desirable by the Engineer to complete the project.

BOND REQUIREMENTS - No Bonds Required:

The provisions of Articles 102-10 and 103-7 of the 2024 Standard Specifications for Roads and Structures are waived for this project. No bonds required.

PROSECUTION OF WORK:

(7-1-95) (Rev. 8-21-12) 108 SP1 G15R

The Contractor will be required to prosecute the work in a continuous and uninterrupted manner from the time he begins the work until completion and final acceptance of the project. The Contractor will not be permitted to suspend his operations except for reasons beyond his control or except where the Engineer has authorized a suspension of the Contractor's operations in writing.

In the event that the Contractor's operations are suspended in violation of the above provisions, the sum of **Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00)** will be charged the Contractor for each and every calendar day that such suspension takes place. The said amount is hereby agreed upon as liquidated damages due to extra engineering and maintenance costs and due to increased public hazard resulting from a suspension of the work. Liquidated damages chargeable due to suspension of the work will be additional to any liquidated damages that may become chargeable due to failure to complete the work on time.

CONTRACTOR CLAIM SUBMITTAL FORM:

If the Contractor elects to file a written claim or requests an extension of contract time, it shall be submitted on the *Contractor Claim Submittal Form (CCSF)* available through the Construction Unit or at https://connect.ncdot.gov/projects/construction/Pages/Construction-Resources.aspx as Form CCSF under Construction Forms.

Any claims for additional compensation and/or extensions of the completion date shall be submitted to the Division Engineer in writing, with detailed justification, prior to submitting the final invoice payment. Once an invoice is received and accepted that is marked as "Final", the Contractor shall be barred from recovery.

NO MAJOR CONTRACT ITEMS:

(2-19-02) (Rev. 8-21-07) 104 SPI G31

None of the items included in this contract will be major items.

NO SPECIALTY ITEMS:

(7-1-95)(Rev. 1-16-24) 108-6 SPI G34

None of the items included in this contract will be specialty items (see Article 108-6 of the *Standard Specifications*).

COOPERATION BETWEEN CONTRACTORS:

(7-1-95) 105-7 SP1 G133rev

The Contractor's attention is directed to Article 105-7 of the 2024 Standard Specifications.

The Contractor on this project shall cooperate with other Contractors or State Forces working within or adjacent to the limits of this project to the extent that the work can be carried out to the best advantage of all concerned.

OUTSOURCING OUTSIDE THE USA:

(9-21-04) (Rev. 5-16-06) SP1 G150

All work on consultant contracts, services contracts, and construction contracts shall be performed in the United States of America. No work shall be outsourced outside of the United States of America.

Outsourcing for the purpose of this provision is defined as the practice of subcontracting labor, work, services, staffing, or personnel to entities located outside of the United States.

The North Carolina Secretary of Transportation shall approve exceptions to this provision in writing.

AUTHORITY OF THE ENGINEER

In accordance with Section 105 of the 2024 Standard Specifications for Roads and Structures and the following provisions: the Engineer for this project shall be the Division Engineer, Division 8, Division of Highways, North Carolina Department of Transportation, acting directly or through his duly authorized representatives.

The Engineer will decide all questions which may arise as to the quality and acceptability of work performed and as to the rate of progress of the work; all questions which may arise as to the interpretation of the contract; and all questions as to the acceptable fulfillment of the contract on the part of the Contractor. His decision shall be final and he shall have executive authority to

enforce and make effective such decisions and orders as the Contractor fails to carry out promptly.

TEMPORARY SUSPENSION OF THE WORK

In accordance with Article 108-7 of the Standard Specifications, the Engineer will have the authority to suspend the work wholly or in part, any written order for such periods as he may deem necessary for any of the following reasons.

- 1. Conditions considered unfavorable for the suitable prosecution of the work, or
- 2. The Contractor's failure for correct conditions unsafe for workmen or the general public, or
- 3. The Contractor has not carried out orders given to him by the Engineer, or
- 4. The Contractor's failure to perform any provisions of the contract.

No extension of the completion date will be allowed for the above suspensions except as may be provided for in Article 108-10.

MATERIALS AND TESTING:

The Engineer reserves the right to perform all sampling and testing in accordance with Section 106 of the <u>Standard Specifications</u> and the Department's "Materials and Test Manual." However, the Engineer may reduce the frequency of sampling and testing where he deems it appropriate for the project under construction.

The Contractor shall furnish the applicable certifications and documentation for all materials as required by the <u>Standard Specifications</u>. Material which is not properly certified will not be accepted.

INSPECTION

All work shall be subject to inspection by the Engineer at any time. Routinely, the Engineer will make periodic inspections of the completed work. It will be the responsibility of the Contractor to keep the Engineer informed of his/her proposed work plan and to submit written reports of work accomplished on a frequency to be determined by the Engineer.

SUBLETTING OF CONTRACT

In accordance with Section 108, the Contractor is reminded that he shall not sublet, sell, transfer, assign, or otherwise dispose of the contract or any portion thereof; or of his right, title, or interest therein; without written consent of the Engineer.

SUPERVISION BY CONTRACTOR

At all times during the life of the project the Contractor shall provide one permanent employee who shall have the authority and capability for overall responsibility of the project and who shall be personally available at the work site within 24 hours notice. Such employee shall be fully authorized to negotiate and execute all supplemental agreements and to execute the orders or directions of the Engineer.

At all times that work is actually being performed, the Contractor shall have present on the project one competent individual who is authorized to act in a supervisory capacity over all work on the project. The individual who has been so authorized shall be experienced in the type of

work being performed and shall be fully capable of managing, directing, and coordinating the work; of reading and thoroughly understanding the contract; and receiving and carrying out directions from the Engineer or his authorized representatives. He shall be an employee of the Contractor unless otherwise approved by the Engineer.

The Contractor may, at his option, designate one employee to meet the requirements of both positions. However, whenever the designated employee is absent from the work site, an authorized individual qualified to act in a supervisory capacity on the project shall be present.

DRIVEWAYS AND PRIVATE PROPERTY

The Contractor shall maintain access to driveways for all residents and property owners throughout the life of the project.

The Contractor shall not perform work for private citizens or agencies in conjunction with this project or within the project limits of this contract.

SITE INVESTIGATION AND REPRESENTATION

The contractor acknowledges that he has satisfied himself as to the nature of the work, and general local conditions; particularly those bearing on transportation, availability of labor, and State Regulations for safety required for the prosecution of the work and all matters which can, in any way, affect the work or cost thereof under this contract. Any failure by the Contractor to acquaint himself with all the available information concerning these conditions will not relieve him from the responsibility for estimating properly the difficulty or cost of successfully performing the work.

SUBSURFACE INFORMATION

There is **no** subsurface information available on this project. The Contractor shall make his own investigation of subsurface conditions.

DAMAGE TO NCDOT PROPERTY

Any damage to NCDOT property shall be repaired or replaced by the Contractor to the satisfaction of the Engineer. Payment to Contractor for work performed may be withheld until acceptable repairs are made to damaged property.

SAFETY AND ACCIDENT PROTECTION

In accordance with Article 107-21 of the 2024 Standard Specifications for Roads and Structures, the Contractor shall comply with all applicable Federal, State, and local laws, ordinances, and regulations governing safety, health, and sanitation, and shall provide all safeguards, safety devices, and protective equipment, and shall take any other needed actions, on his own responsibility that are reasonably necessary to protect the life and health of employees on the job and the safety of the public, and to protect property in connection with the performance of the work covered by the contract.

UTILITY CONFLICTS

It shall be the responsibility of the Contractor to contact all affected utility owners and determine the precise locations of all utilities prior to beginning construction. Utility owners shall be contacted a minimum of 48 hours prior to the commencement of operations. Special care shall be used in working around or near existing utilities, protecting them when necessary to provide uninterrupted service. In the event that any utility service is interrupted, the Contractor shall notify the utility owner immediately and shall cooperate with the owner, or his/her representative, in the restoration of service in the shortest time possible. Existing fire hydrants shall be kept accessible to fire departments at all times.

The Contractor shall adhere to all applicable regulations and follow accepted safety procedures when working in the vicinity of utilities in order to insure the safety of construction personnel and the public.

EXTENSION OF CONTRACT TIME

Failure on the part of the Contractor to furnish bonds or certifications or to satisfy preliminary requirements necessary to issue the purchase order will not constitute grounds for extension of the contract time. If the Contractor has fulfilled all preliminary requirements for the issuance of a purchase order, and the purchase order authorization is not available by the date of availability, the Contractor shall be granted an extension equal to the number of calendar days the purchase order authorization is delayed after the date of availability.

EROSION CONTROL

The Contractor shall exercise every reasonable precaution throughout the life of the project to prevent erosion and siltation.

MAINTENANCE OF PROJECT:

The Contractor shall maintain the project from the date construction begins until project is finally accepted in accordance with Section 104-10, Maintenance of Project, Section 104-11, Final Clean Up, and Section 105-16, Failure to Maintain the Project or Perform Erosion Control Work.

DECLARATION OF DEFAULT

The Department shall have the right to declare a default of contract for breach by the Contractor of any material term or condition of the contract. Material breach by the Contractor shall include, but specifically shall not be limited to failure to begin work under the contract within the time specified; failure to provide workmen or equipment adequate to perform the work; unsatisfactory performance of the work, failure to maintain satisfactory work progress, or failure to maintain a valid pesticide license. Default of contract shall be in accordance with the terms, conditions, and procedures of Article 108-9 of the Standard Specifications.

PAYMENT AND RETAINAGE

The Contractor may submit a request for partial payment on a monthly basis, or other interval as approved by the Engineer. The amount of partial payments will be based on the work

accomplished and accepted as the last day of the approved pay period. One hundred percent (100%) payment shall be made after successful completion of the work and all quantities have been verified. The invoices will show the requisition number and purchase order number and should state "Terms Net Ten (10) Days". There will be no retainage held on this project.

Prices and payment will be full compensation for all work covered including all miscellaneous materials to complete the work. All work items necessary to complete the work other than listed on the "Bid Proposal Form" will be considered incidental in nature and no further compensation will be made. Any work performed in an unsatisfactory manner could be the basis for cancellation of the contract.

Units on the "Bid Proposal Form" are for bid evaluation only and do not reflect the purchase order limits. Purchase order quantities will be based on actual need. The Engineer reserves the right to make, at any time during the work, such changes in the quantities as necessary to satisfactorily complete the project.

BANKRUPTCY

The Department of Transportation, at its option, may terminate the contract upon filing by the Contractor of any petition for protection under the provisions of the Federal Bankruptcy Act.

EQUIPMENT IDLING GUIDELINES: 107

SP1 G096

Exercise reduced fuel consumption and reduced equipment emissions during the construction of all work associated with this contract. Employees engaged in the construction of this project should turn off vehicles when stopped for more than thirty (30) minutes and off-highway equipment should idle no longer than fifteen (15) consecutive minutes.

These guidelines for turning off vehicles and equipment when idling do not apply to:

- 1. Idling when queuing.
- 2. Idling to verify the vehicle is in safe operating condition.
- 3. Idling for testing, servicing, repairing or diagnostic purposes.
- 4. Idling necessary to accomplish work for which the vehicle was designed (such as operating a crane, mixing concrete, etc.).
- 5. Idling required to bring the machine system to operating temperature.
- 6. Emergency vehicles, utility company, construction, and maintenance vehicles where the engines must run to perform needed work.
- 7. Idling to ensure safe operation of the vehicle.
- 8. Idling when the propulsion engine is providing auxiliary power for other than heating or air conditioning. (such as hydraulic systems for pavers)
- 9. When specific traffic, safety, or emergency situations arise.
- 10. If the ambient temperature is less than 32 degrees Fahrenheit. Limited idling to provide for the safety of vehicle occupants (e.g. to run the heater).
- 11. If the ambient temperature is greater than 90 degrees Fahrenheit. Limited idling to provide for the safety of vehicle occupants of off-highway equipment (e.g. to run the air conditioning) no more than 30 minutes.

12. Diesel powered vehicles may idle for up to 30 minutes to minimize restart problems.

Any vehicle, truck, or equipment in which the primary source of fuel is natural gas or electricity is exempt from the idling limitations set forth in this special provision.

CARGO PREFERENCE ACT:

Privately owned United States-flag commercial vessels transporting cargoes are subject to the Cargo Preference Act (CPA) of 1954 requirements and regulations found in 46 CFR 381.7. Contractors are directed to clause (b) of 46 CFR 381.7 as follows:

- (b) Contractor and Subcontractor Clauses. "Use of United States-flag vessels: The contractor agrees-
 - "(1) To utilize privately owned United States-flag commercial vessels to ship at least 50 percent of the gross tonnage (computed separately for dry bulk carriers, dry cargo liners, and tankers) involved, whenever shipping any equipment, material, or commodities pursuant to this contract, to the extent such vessels are available at fair and reasonable rates for United States-flag commercial vessels.

BURNING RESTRICTIONS:

(7-1-95) 200, 210, 215 SP2 R05

Open burning is not permitted on any portion of the right-of-way limits established for this project. Do not burn the clearing, grubbing or demolition debris designated for disposal and generated from the project at locations within the project limits, off the project limits or at any waste or borrow sites in this county. Dispose of the clearing, grubbing and demolition debris by means other than burning, according to state or local rules and regulations.

EQUIPMENT CONDITIONS

The Contractor shall furnish equipment of sufficient type, capacity, and quantity to safely and efficiently perform the work as specified in the Project Special Provisions. All vehicles used by the Contractor must be performance worthy by visual and operational inspection. All vehicles, including trailers, used should be properly equipped with lighting per Roadway Standard Drawing 1165.01 Sheet 1 of 1. Lights shall be mounted as high as possible on trailers to enhance visibility. The Contractor shall display the company name on each vehicle.

The safety of the public and the convenience of traffic shall be regarded as prime importance. The Contractor shall operate the equipment in a safe manner so as not to create a hazard to the traveling public. Crossing lanes of traffic and erratic driving will be strictly prohibited.

All equipment used shall be commercial grade and of sufficient size to complete tasks effectively and in a timely manner. All equipment shall be in good working order capable of being used as originally intended, including all guards and safety attachments. Mowers are to be equipped with shields which preclude foreign objects from being thrown out from the cutting unit enclosures. All equipment shall conform to the prevailing Occupational Safety Health Act Standards. The Contractor shall operate the equipment in a safe manner so as not to create a hazard to the traveling public or risks that may cause injury, health or safety risks, or damage to assets. The equipment shall not be parked within the State Highway System right of way overnight or at other times when work has been suspended, unless approved by the Engineer.

PROTECTION AND RESTORATION OF PROPERTY

The Contractor shall be responsible for the protection from his activities of all public and private property on and adjacent to the work and shall use every reasonable precaution necessary to prevent damage or injury thereto. He shall use suitable precautions to prevent damage to pipes, conduits and other underground structures, and to poles, wires, cables and other overhead structures, and to plantings.

The Contractor shall conduct his operations so as to prevent damage to roadway delineators and signs. Should any essential sign (YIELD, ONE WAY, WRONG WAY, etc.) suffer any damage, the Engineer, or his representative, shall be notified within two hours of the aforesaid damage. Damage to STOP signs shall be repaired by the Contractor immediately and reported to the Engineer within two hours of the aforesaid damage. Such signs may be repaired or replaced by the Department at the Contractor's expense. Damage to other signs, delineators, etc. may be repaired or replaced by the Contractor subject to approval by the Engineer or they may be repaired or replaced by the Department at the Contractor's expense.

COOPERATION BETWEEN CONTRACTORS

The Department reserves the right at any time to contract for and perform other or additional work on or near the work covered by the contract. When separate or additional contracts are let within the limits of any one project, each Contractor shall conduct his work so as not to interfere with or hinder the progress

or completion of the work being performed by other Contractors. Contractors working within the limits of the same project shall cooperate with each other. Each Contractor shall conduct his operations in such a manner as to avoid damaging any work being performed by others or which others have completed.

The Department will under no circumstances be liable for any claim for additional compensation due to acts of one Contractor holding up the work of another. The Department will under no circumstances be liable for any damages experienced by one Contractor as a result of the presence and operations of other Contractors working within the limits of the same project.

DAMAGES

The Contractor shall be held liable for all damage done, as a result of his operation or his Subcontractors, to fixed objects such as, but not limited to, fences, posts, roadway surfaces, shoulders, guardrail, drainage structure, signs, pavement markers, utilities, and all vegetation including turf, trees, shrubs, flower beds and desirable natural growth. Damage shall include among other things; skinning, scraping, breaking of tree limbs or gouging of trees or shrubs, and rutting, scalping or tearing turf.

Costs associated with damages caused by the Contractor to plant material will be assessed based on current cost to replace with like material of equal size or an equivalent combination. Such cost shall be deducted from the Contractors monthly invoice. All turf damage repairs shall be made by the Contractor as herein specified. Seed shall meet purity and germination requirements as specified by the Engineer. Only friable topsoil shall be used to fill any depressions, ruts, etc., prior to seeding. All other property damage will be assessed for actual replacement costs including labor, materials, and equipment.

Cost associated with damages caused by the Contractor's operation shall be deducted from monthly invoice payments or the Contractor will be required to repair the damages at his cost as directed by the Engineer. This is in addition to any compensation reduction assessed as a result of poor or non-performance of duties outlined in this contract.

Contractor is responsible for any injury or damages received or sustained by any person, persons, or property by reason of any act of the Contractor, Subcontractor, its agents or employees, in the performance of the contract.

FINAL INSPECTIONS

When the Contractor believes substantial completion of the contract has been achieved, a letter of Request for Final Inspection should be submitted to the Engineer.

PROJECT SPECIAL PROVISIONS

The Engineer reserves the right to make changes at any time during the life of the project as to quantity count. The Engineer may increase or decrease quantity count of the various items. The Engineer will notify the Contractor in writing of any significant changes in the quantities.

Note: All line item quantities listed are estimations. The Contractor should investigate all the sites. Any questions can be brought to the pre-construction conference.

Work shall be available from 8:00 am to 5:00 pm Monday through Friday; no work shall be performed on weekends or state holidays. The Contractor's operations are restricted to daylight hours only. Extended hours may be granted at the request of the Contractor, in writing, to the Engineer. The Contactor shall contact NCDOT after award of the bid for the time and date for the pre-construction conference.

The Contractor shall provide all materials, labor, equipment, and traffic control to satisfactorily complete the work on the project as specified. The Contractor shall be paid for all services satisfactorily rendered and accepted at one hundred (100%) percent for each of the line items listed for this contract at the end of the completion dates for this project.

The Contactor shall contact NCDOT inspector to discuss and agree on all line items and quantities, before submitting an invoice. If the Contractor submits an invoice before this takes place, payment may be delayed or denied. The Contractor will have to provide pesticide/herbicide spray reports; failure to do so may cause a delay or denied payment. The Contractor also will submit Certified Payroll by the 7th day of each month; failure to do so may cause a delay or denied payment.

The proposed bedding plant sites are listed below. Refer to project plans for additional information.

Total Annual Plant Beds = 20,452 square feet

ANNUAL BEDDING PLANTS:

All annual bedding plants will be provided by the Department. The Contractor shall be paid for <u>installation</u> only on these items. Under a separate contract, the Department is contract growing annual bedding plants for installation in 9 sites within Moore and Lee Counties, NC.

PLANTS WILL BE DELIVERED TO THE PROJECT SITE ON APRIL 23, 2024. THE CONTRACTOR SHALL BEGIN THE PLANTING OF ANNUALS IMMEDIATELY UPON DELIVERY. THE CONTRACTOR SHALL INSTALL A MINIMUM OF 3,500 PLANTS PER DAY.

The Contractor of this installation and establishment contract shall work cooperatively with the Division 8 Engineer regarding delivery of annuals. The quantities listed beside each type of annual should be used by the installation/establishment Contractor to determine amount of labor, work scheduling, time and materials, and long-term establishment requirements to fulfill the obligations within this contract. Due to the nature of this contract, substantial penalties will apply for non-adherence to contract requirements. The Pinehurst Traffic Circle site must be planted first.

Measurement and Payment

The quantity of plantings to be paid for will be the actual number of plants successfully installed and accepted.

Payment will be made under:

PLANT BED SITE PREPARATION

The contractor will be required to prepare the **existing** plant bed(s) to accept new plantings. Plant bed preparation includes removal and disposal of all existing plantings, stumps, roots, rocks, vines, undesirable grass, weeds, excessive vegetation, and other woody growth; rotivating, edging, leveling, and fertilizing of existing plant beds as follows:

- 1. Top 8" of soil to be loosened and clods broken as directed by the Engineer.
- 2. Add 14-14-14 polymer coated fertilizer at a rate of 16 lbs/1,000 sq. ft. The application of fertilizer shall be made with a mechanical applicator to ensure uniform distribution.
- 3. Add dolomitic limestone at a rate of 100lbs/1,000 sq. ft. The application of dolomitic limestone shall be made with a mechanical applicator to ensure uniform distribution.

The contractor will be required to create new beds including irrigation at the US 1 @ US 15/501 split near Tramway, and at the NC 5 Harness Track entrance. Additional topsoil may be required at other locations.

- 1. Till and integrate 6" of approved topsoil.
- Add 14-14-14 polymer coated fertilizer at a rate of 16 lbs/1,000 sq. ft. The application of fertilizer shall be made with a mechanical applicator to ensure uniform distribution.
- 3. Add dolomitic limestone at a rate of 100lbs/1,000 sq. ft. The application of dolomitic limestone shall be made with a mechanical applicator to ensure uniform distribution.

Measurement and Payment

The quantity of plant bed preparation to be paid for will be the actual square yards, premeasured along the surface of the ground, in which the plant bed is prepared in accordance with this provision.

TOPSOIL

General - The work covered by this provision shall consist of furnishing and placing topsoil for filling areas within proposed seeding, mulching, and planting areas, where existing vegetation has been removed or the surface disturbed, to provide proper surface drainage and to blend to surrounding grades as directed by the Engineer.

Material - Topsoil shall consist of a sandy loam, silt loam or clay loam which contains a reasonable amount of humus material. Topsoil shall be of good texture, loose and friable and shall be representative of topsoil in the general vicinity. It shall be reasonably free from sod, hard lumps, subsoil, large roots, rocks and gravel, noxious weed seeds and/or toxic substitutes or other material which would be harmful to plant growth. All topsoil shall be approved by the Engineer when delivered to the job site, whether or not the source of topsoil has been previously approved.

Construction - Care shall be exercised by the Contractor to minimize disturbance of roots of plants or trees to remain and to prevent disturbance of existing utilities which are to remain. Topsoil shall be placed and spread evenly to the required depth which, after settlement, shall constitute finish grade. Topsoil shall not be placed when the ground is frozen, is excessively wet, nor is in a condition that the soil cannot be worked easily and dressed smoothly.

Measurement and Payment - The quantity of topsoil to be paid for will be the actual number of cubic yards of topsoil which has been placed as specified herein and accepted. The topsoil used on this project will be measured for payment by pit measurement as provided in Subarticle 230-5(B) or by truck measurement as provided by Subarticle 230-5(c), as directed by the Engineer.

The quantity of topsoil, measured as provided for above, will be paid for at the contract unit price per cubic yard "Topsoil". Such price and payment will be full compensation for; furnishing, placing, all labor, equipment and all incidentals necessary to complete the work satisfactorily.

PINE BARK FINES

Annual plant beds shall be mulched with new pine bark fines screened not to exceed ½ inch in size, prior to planting of annuals. Mulch shall be applied to a depth as noted on the plans.

Measurement and Payment

The quantity of Pine Bark Fines to be paid will be the actual number cubic yards successfully installed. Payment will be made under:

MULCH FOR PERENNIAL BEDS

The Contractor shall furnish and place mulch as requested by the Engineer according to the following specifications.

The mulch shall be triple shredded pine bark, clean and void of sticks, cones, leaves or any extraneous materials. Mulch with excessive fines will not be accepted. Mulch color shall be dark brown at the time of application. Artificially colored mulch will not be accepted.

The mulch quantities given on the plans and in this contract proposal are an estimated quantity based on the plans. If the Contractor is supplying and installing mulch delivered to the job site in bulk, at the end of each work day the Contractor or Subcontractor must supply delivery ticket(s) for the amount of mulch received for that day. Failure by the Contractor to supply mulch tickets at the end of each work day will delay payment when invoice is submitted. It will be the responsibility of the Contractor to request permission from the Engineer or his/her representative to dump or stockpile mulch at the various sites(s). Before the Contractor moves to other various work site(s), the Contractor shall perform clean-up operations such as: hand raking or use equipment to pick up profuse amount of mulch to restore the area back to similar condition, and seed and mulch with grain straw as specified by the Engineer or his/her representative. Failure by the Contractor to get permission to dump or stockpile and or failure to clean-up mulch stockpile site(s) will receive a "stop work" order letter from the Engineer on this matter. Seeding and mulching with grain straw operations shall be incidental to this contract.

No mulch will be allowed to be stored within 40 feet of any travel lane overnight.

Prior to the mulching operation, all waste, debris and litter in the plant bed areas shall be removed and disposed of off-site. The Contractor shall place the mulch around all individual landscape plants and bedded shrub areas within the site as directed by the Engineer. Mulch shall be placed and maintained to ensure a uniform four (4) inch depth covering the entire mulched area. Following mulching operations, Contractor shall lift any branches or leaves of desirable plants which have been covered with mulch.

Mulch for Planting will be measured and paid for in cubic yards of mulch that is furnished during the initial planting intermediate contract time. Where mulch is furnished in bales or bags, the number of cubic yards in each bale or bag will be determined and then multiplied by the number of bales or bags of the same size which have been acceptably furnished and placed. Where mulch is furnished in trucks, each truck will be measured by the Engineer and shall bear a legible identification mark indicating its capacity. Load each truck to its measured capacity at the time it arrives at the site of the work. For all mulch that is delivered, you must provide a copy of the invoice to the inspector for each load at time of delivery.

Measurement and Payment

The quantity of Pine Bark Fines to be paid will be the actual number cubic yards successfully installed. Payment will be made under:

IRRIGATION

General:

NOTE: ALL IRRIGATION CONTRACTORS MUST BE LICENSED TO PERFORM WORK ASSOCIATED WITH CONSTRUCTION OR CONTRACTING OF IRRIGATION SYSTEMS. (NC G.S. 89G)

The contractor shall be familiar with all state and local regulations and ordinances concerning irrigation systems and obtain permits that are necessary for the installation of the irrigation system. Provided are plans that designate the specific areas to receive irrigation. The contractor shall lay out work as accurately as possible in accordance with the irrigation plans. The contractor shall provide as built plans showing all piping (lateral and main lines), head/emitter locations, system controllers (battery powered or AC powered), valves, wires, and any other components proposed for the irrigation system. All components and layouts are to be approved by the Division Roadside Environmental Engineer (DREE) before installation begins.

The contractor will be responsible for insuring that all areas receive the appropriate coverage and make any adjustments as needed. Upon completion of the irrigation system installation, the contractor shall schedule a final inspection with the DREE. The contractor shall conduct his operations in such a manner to prevent damage to existing trees, shrubs, turf, hardscapes, and structures. When any such damage occurs, the contractor will be responsible for repair or replacement as directed by the DREE. The contractor shall be responsible for training division personnel in the operation and maintenance of the irrigation system. Final acceptance of the irrigation system shall take place upon approval of the DREE that satisfactory installation is complete.

The contractor shall provide all labor, equipment, and materials for the installation of the irrigation system including but not limited to layout, trenching, backfilling, providing and installing pipe, valves, filters, pressure regulators, drip tubing, drains, controller, wiring, backflow, and boring sleeves. The contractor shall furnish a transferable certificate of warranty and a guarantee of work and materials for a one-year period from the date of final acceptance of the system. Final payment for the system shall not be made unless this certification is presented to the DREE.

System Piping: PVC pipe shall be the size as noted on the irrigation plans. The installation of the system piping shall be in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions and shall begin from the point of connection of supply for the system. Pipe and fittings shall be thoroughly cleaned of dirt, dust, and moisture before the application of the required solvent or lubricant. All connections between plastic pipe and metal valves or steel pipe shall be made using plastic adapters. All threads shall be sealed with Teflon thread sealing tape. During the installation process prior to completion and final acceptance, the pipelines and their appurtenances shall be kept clean throughout. Any obstructions or deposits shall be removed. When work is not in progress, all open ends of pipe, fittings, and valves shall be securely closed so that water, soil, or other foreign substances cannot enter. If any broken pipe or any defects are found in the lines or in any of their fittings or appurtenances before the completion of the project, they shall be replaced. All pipe, fittings, and appurtenances shall be carefully examined for defects before placing, and any found to be defective shall not be used. Pipe and accessories shall be carefully lowered into the trench with suitable equipment. All irrigation system main lines shall be installed at a minimum of 18 inches and a maximum of 24 inches below the soil grade. All irrigation lateral lines shall be installed at a minimum of 12 inches and a maximum of 18 inches below the soil grade. All backfill material shall be free of rock, stones, lumps, or debris. Backfilled trenches shall be compacted to a degree comparable to the adjacent undisturbed material. Trenches shall be tamped mechanically. All disturbed areas shall be repaired and match the adjacent finished grade

Valves: All automatic remote-control valves with PVC ball valves shall be installed in 12-inch meter boxes to provide accessibility for maintenance operations. Valve boxes shall be mounted with the lids

flush with the finished grade. The contractor shall install all valves in locations that will not conflict with current or new plantings. All PVC water pipe shall be installed in accordance with the applicable irrigation provisions herein, as shown on the irrigation plans, and as directed by the DREE.

Wiring: Automatic control wiring shall be installed in a common trench with the system piping where feasible. All wiring shall be installed at least 12 inches below finished grade and to the side of or below the irrigation piping. The contractor shall provide looped slack at the valve locations and snake wires in the trench to allow for linear contraction of the wires. Wiring shall be bundled and tied or taped at 10 ft. intervals. The following shall also apply:

- All 26.5 VAC control wiring shall be #14 AG, single strand, copper wire with polyethylene UF installation rated for 300 VAC minimum unless otherwise noted. Common wires from controllers shall be white in color while hot wires shall be red in color.
- Control wire splices shall be allowed only in runs of 500 feet or more. Splices shall be kept to a minimum and be made with approved materials. Concentrations of splices, where necessary, shall be installed in Ametek valve boxes or approved equal. All 26.5 VAC control wire shall be installed within conduit whenever the wire is passing through sleeves.

System Controller: The irrigation system controller shall be a battery-powered multiple zone controller with a built-in surge protector capable of fully automatic or manual operation of the system. See the irrigation detail sheet for mounting instructions.

Testing: Upon completion of the irrigation system, the entire system shall be tested for proper operation. All air will be flushed from the system and the contractor will check all components for proper operation. The contractor shall perform pressure and leakage testing of irrigation lines. The contractor shall notify the DREE 2 days in advance of testing and shall be performed in their presence. All main line piping shall be flushed of air and placed under the available static pressure or the design pressure, whichever is greater, for a period of 6 hours. The system piping shall be isolated from the water supply for the duration of the test. The pressure in the system be noted every hour and if an excessive pressure drop occurs, the reason(s) should be determined and repaired. Zone lateral lines shall be inspected while a specific irrigation zone is in operation. Each emitter shall be inspected for leaks as will the route of the installed lateral piping.

Compensation:

Irrigation will be paid for as a lump sum. Such price and payment will be full compensation for all work covered by this provision; including but not limited to furnishing all materials, components, labor, tools and equipment and any other incidentals necessary or required to complete the work.

Payment will be made under:

Irrigation.......LUMP SUM (LS)

PLANT BED ESTABLISHMENT:

An initial application of water is required at the time annuals are planted. The initial water application is considered incidental, and no additional payment will be made for it.

The Contractor shall maintain plant beds until final acceptance of the project. Plant bed establishment includes removal of undesirable grass, weeds, or vegetation within the plant bed area, and removal of any litter, trash, or otherwise undesirable objects within 6 feet of the actual planting site.

Weather will play a critical role in the establishment of the annual bedding plants. Supplemental water, fertilizer, fungicide, pesticide, and disease control applications should be routinely discussed between the contractor and the Engineer. The price of fertilizer, fungicide, pesticide and disease control applications treatments shall be considered incidental to other items in this contract.

Establishment of plant beds shall be performed in cycles consisting of a minimum of once every week after acceptance of initial plantings. The number of cycles may be adjusted as determined necessary by the Engineer.

Payment

The Contractor shall be paid for each cycle in which the plant bed establishment work is successfully completed. Payment will be made under:

FERTILIZER:

Initial fertilizer will be applied in a polymer-coated formulation as directed under the PLANT BED PREPARATION Section of this contract. Liquid, water-soluble fertilizer (Peters 20-20-20 or equivalent) shall be applied every two weeks or at the direction of the Engineer. Slow-release fertilizers may be used if approved by the Engineer.

No direct payment will be made for fertilizer as it is considered incidental to other items of the contract.

WEED CONTROL:

Proper plant spacing and mulch shall be utilized to minimize weed growth. The Contractor may be required to control weeds by cultivation, herbicides, or manual methods.

Any herbicide used in plant beds must be chosen carefully. Herbicides must be applied according to the manufacturer's recommendations. Plant beds shall be weed-free at the time any pre-emergence herbicide is applied. For more information related to herbicide use in annual plant beds, refer to the following web site - http://www.ces.ncsu.edu/hil/hil-644.html . The application (product, timing, rate, etc.) of all pesticides shall be pre-approved by the Engineer.

The Contractor shall comply with all applicable federal, state, and local laws, ordinances, and regulations governing safety and shall provide all safeguards needed on his own responsibility. All pesticides shall be properly labeled and registered with the United States Department of Agriculture and the North Carolina Department of Agriculture. A container shall contain only the pesticide, which meets the analysis guaranteed on the label. All pesticides shall be kept in such original labeled containers until used. All pesticide applications must be made by or under the direct supervision of an individual who possesses a valid North Carolina Commercial Applicator's license with a Right of Way endorsement.

No direct payment will be made for Weed Control as it is considered incidental to other items of the contract.

INSPECTION

All work shall be subject to inspection by the Engineer at any time. Routinely, the Engineer will make periodic inspections of the completed work. It will be the responsibility of the Contractor to keep the Engineer informed of his proposed work plan and to submit written reports of work accomplished on a frequency to be determined by the Engineer.

The Engineer reserves the right to inspect or perform testing on any part of the project.

PLAN, DETAIL, AND QUANTITY ADJUSTMENTS

The Department reserves the right to make, at any time during the progress of the work, such alterations in plans or the details of construction as may be found necessary or desirable by the Engineer to complete the project.

The Department reserves the right to make adjustments in the estimated contract quantities as may be necessary or desirable by the Engineer to satisfactorily complete the project. If such overruns or underruns occur, there will be no adjustment to the contract unit prices unless the overruns or underruns exceed twenty-five percent (25%) for major contract items or one hundred percent (100%) for minor contract items of such original bid quantity.

Price adjustments made due to overruns or underruns which are greater than stated above are subject to Section 104-5 of the *Standard Specifications*.

CALENDAR:

April 8, 2014 - Begin plant bed site preparation.

April 23, 2014

- a) Begin installation of annual bedding plants.
- b) The Pinehurst Traffic Circle site is to be installed first.
- c) All other installations shall be installed in an order as chosen by the Contractor. Each site shall be completely installed and watered before moving to another site.

May 17, 2014

- a) All annual bedding plants shall be installed before the end of work (4:00pm) on this date or liquidated damages shall be assessed at \$300.00 per day for each working day after May 9th.
- b) The Contractor will be required to install a minimum of 3,500 annuals per day.
- c) During the installation process, previously installed annuals are to be managed by the Contractor. At no time will the Contractor be allowed to neglect installed annuals.
- d) Additionally, the Contractor assumes responsibility of annual bedding plant once they are delivered to the project.

Minimum, weekly establishment shall occur but not be limited to the following dates. At the Engineer's discretion additional visits may be required.

- April 26th All delivered annuals shall receive an on-site review with the Engineer and the Contractor to ensure proper management is occurring. Installation will continue.
- May 3rd All annuals (installed or delivered) receive an on-site inspection with the Engineer and the contractor to ensure proper management is occurring. Start week establishment periods.

Additional weekly establishment periods (including but not limited to: weed control, fungicide, pesticide, and fertilizer applications and supplemental watering) shall occur on May 10, 17, 24 & 31, June 7, 14, 21, & 28, July 5, 12, 19, and 26, and August 2, 9, &16.

A final establishment review shall occur the week of August 16th, 2024. At this time the Contractor responsibilities for the annual bedding plants shall end.

EROSION CONTROL

STABILIZATION REQUIREMENTS:

(3-11-16) S-1

Stabilization for this project shall comply with the time frame guidelines as specified by the NCG-010000 general construction permit effective August 3, 2011 issued by the North Carolina Department of Environment and Natural Resources Division of Water Quality. Temporary or permanent ground cover stabilization shall occur within 7 calendar days from the last land-disturbing activity, with the following exceptions in which temporary or permanent ground cover shall be provided in 14 calendar days from the last land-disturbing activity:

- Slopes between 2:1 and 3:1, with a slope length of 10 ft. or less
- Slopes 3:1 or flatter, with a slope of length of 50 ft. or less
- Slopes 4:1 or flatter

The stabilization timeframe for High Quality Water (HQW) Zones shall be 7 calendar days with no exceptions for slope grades or lengths. Seed shall not be labeled with the above weed species on the seed analysis label. Tolerances as applied by the Association of Official Seed Analysts will NOT be allowed for the above noxious weeds except for Wild Onion and Wild Garlic.

Tolerances established by the Association of Official Seed Analysts will generally be recognized. However, for the purpose of figuring pure live seed, the found pure seed and found germination percentages as reported by the North Carolina Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services, Seed Testing Laboratory will be used. Allowances, as established by the NCDOT, will be recognized for minimum pure live seed as listed on the following pages.

Seed of Pensacola Bahiagrass shall not contain more than 7% inert matter, Kentucky Bluegrass, Centipede and Fine or Hard Fescue shall not contain more than 5% inert matter whereas a maximum of 2% inert matter will be allowed on all other kinds of seed. In addition, all seed shall not contain more than 2% other crop seed nor more than 1% total weed seed. The germination rate as tested by the North Carolina Department of Agriculture shall not fall below 70%, which includes both dormant and hard seed. Seed shall be labeled with not more than 7%, 5% or 2% inert matter (according to above specifications), 2% other crop seed and 1% total weed seed.

TRAFFIC CONTROL AND WORK ZONE SAFETY:

Contractor performing Work Zone Traffic Control shall have a minimum of one (1) NCDOT Certified Work Zone Supervisor. At no time during the contract is the contactor to be without a NCDOT Certified Work Zone Supervisor. The NCDOT Certified Work Zone Supervisor must be on site during any traffic control activities that take place within the travel lane or otherwise alter the flow of traffic.

The Contractor shall maintain traffic during construction and provide, install, and maintain all traffic control devices in accordance with these project guidelines, the Project Special Provisions, North Carolina Department of Transportation *Standard Specifications for Roads and Structures*, and the current edition of the *Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices* (MUTCD).

The Contractor shall utilize complete and proper traffic controls and traffic control devices during all operations. All traffic control and traffic control devices required for any operation shall be functional and in place prior to the commencement of that operation. Signs for temporary operations shall be removed during periods of inactivity. The Contractor is required to leave the project in a manner that will be safe to the traveling public and which will not impede motorists.

Traffic movements through lane closures on roads with two way traffic shall be controlled by flaggers stationed at each end of the work zone. In situations where sight distance is limited, the Contractor shall provide additional means of controlling traffic, including, but not limited to, two-way radios, pilot vehicles, or additional flaggers. Flaggers shall be competent personnel, adequately trained in flagging procedures, and furnished with proper safety devices and equipment, including, but not limited to, safety vests and stop/slow paddles.

All personnel when working in traffic areas or areas in close proximity to traffic shall wear an approved safety vest, or shirt or jacket and hat or helmet which meets the color requirements of the *Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices* (MUTCD).

The Contractor shall comply with all applicable Federal, State, and local laws, ordinances, and regulations governing safety, health, and sanitation, and shall provide all safeguards, safety devices, and protective equipment, and shall take any other needed actions, on his own responsibility that are reasonably necessary to protect the life and health of employees on the job and the safety of the public, and to protect property in connection with the performance of the work covered by the contract.

Failure to comply with any of the requirements for safety and traffic control of this contract shall result in suspension of work as provided in Article 108-7 of the *Standard Specifications*.

Maintain traffic in accordance with Divisions 10, 11 and 12 of the 2024 Standard Specifications and the following provisions:

Install Work Zone Advance Warning Signs in accordance with the detail drawing provided in these

plans prior to beginning any other work. Use a lane closure or slow moving operation to complete

the work, as necessary, unless otherwise indicated. Refer to Standard Drawing No. 1101.02, 1101.11, 1110.01, 1110.02, 1130.01 1135.01 and 1180.01 of the 2024 Roadway Standard Drawings. Use a moving operation only if the minimum speed maintained at all times is 3 mph with no stops that narrow or close a lane of travel. If the moving operation is progressing slower than 3 mph at any time, install a lane closure. Maintain the existing traffic pattern at all times, except in the immediate work zone where lane closures are allowed as determined by the Engineer.

Refer to attached details and Standard Drawing No. 1101.02, 1101.03, 1101.04, 1101.05, 1101.11,

A pilot vehicle operation may be used in conjunction with flaggers and the appropriate pilot vehicle warning signing as directed by the Engineer. During periods of construction inactivity, return the traffic pattern to the existing alignment and remove or cover any work zone signs. When covering work zone signs, use an opaque material that prevents reading of the sign at night by a driver using high beam headlights. Use material, which does not damage the sign sheeting. When personnel and/or equipment are working on the shoulder adjacent to and within 5 feet of an open travel lane, close the nearest open travel lane using Standard Drawing No. 1101.02 of the 2024 Roadway Standard Drawings. When personnel and/or equipment are working within a lane of travel of an undivided facility, close the lane according to the traffic control plans, 2024 Roadway Standard Drawings or as directed by the Engineer. Conduct the work so that all personnel and/or equipment remain within the closed travel lane. Do not work simultaneously, on

both sides of an open travel way, within the same location, on a two-lane, two-way road. Perform work only when weather and visibility conditions allow safe operations as directed by the Engineer. When utilizing a slow-moving operation for such items as pavement marking and marker placement, the operation shall consist of the vehicles and devices as shown on Roadway Standard Drawing No. 1101.02, sheet 11 or 12 of the 2024 Roadway Standard Drawings. Traffic cones may be used when necessary to provide additional protection of wet pavement markings. Ballast all traffic cones so they will not be blown over by traffic.

In the event of termination, the contractor shall be paid for the work already performed in accordance with the contract specifications.

- (i) Withholding payments to the contractor under the contract until the contractor complies; and/or
- (ii) Cancelling, terminating, or suspending a contract, in whole or in part.

(f) Incorporation of Provisions

The contractor shall include the provisions of paragraphs (a) through (f) in every subcontract, including procurements of materials and leases of equipment, unless exempt by the Acts, the Regulations and directives issued pursuant thereto. The contractor shall take action with respect to any subcontract or procurement as the Recipient or the FHWA may direct as a means of enforcing such provisions including sanctions for noncompliance. Provided, that if the contractor becomes involved in, or is threatened with litigation by a subcontractor, or supplier because of such direction, the contractor may request the Recipient to enter into any litigation to protect the interests of the Recipient. In addition, the contractor may request the United States to enter into the litigation to protect the interests of the United States.

(2) Title VI Nondiscrimination Program (23 CFR 200.5(p))

The North Carolina Department of Transportation (NCDOT) has assured the USDOT that, as a condition to receiving federal financial assistance, NCDOT will comply with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and all requirements imposed by Title 49 CFR part 21 and related nondiscrimination authorities to ensure that no person shall, on the ground of race, color, national origin, limited English proficiency, sex, age, or disability (including religion/creed or income-level, where applicable), be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any programs, activities, or services conducted or funded by NCDOT. - 3. Required Solicitation Language. The Contractor shall include the following notification in all solicitations for bids and requests for work or material, regardless of funding source:
 - "The North Carolina Department of Transportation, in accordance with the provisions of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (78 Stat. 252, 42 US.C. §§ 2000d to 2000d-4) and the Regulations, hereby notifies all bidders that it will affirmatively ensure that any contract entered into pursuant to this advertisement, disadvantaged business enterprises will be afforded full and fair opportunity to submit bids in response to this invitation and will not be discriminated against on the grounds of race, color, or national origin in consideration for an award. In accordance with other related nondiscrimination authorities, bidders and contractors will also not be discriminated against on the grounds of sex, age, disability, low-income level, creed/religion, or limited English proficiency in consideration for an award."
- 4. Physically incorporate the FHWA-1273, in its entirety, into all subcontracts and subsequent lower tier subcontracts on Federal-aid highway construction contracts only.
- 5. Provide language assistance services (i.e., written translation and oral interpretation), free of charge, to LEP employees and applicants. Contact NCDOT OCR for further assistance, if needed.
- 6. For assistance with these Title VI requirements, contact the NCDOT Title VI Nondiscrimination Program at 1-800-522-0453.
- (b) Subrecipients (e.g. cities, counties, LGAs, planning organizations) may be required to prepare and submit a Title VI Plan to NCDOT, including Title VI Assurances and/or agreements.  - 1. Applicability

Title VI and related laws protect participants and beneficiaries (e.g., members of the public and contractors) from discrimination by NCDOT employees, subrecipients and contractors, regardless of funding source.

2. Eligibility

Any person—or class of persons—who believes he/she has been subjected to discrimination based on race, color, national origin, Limited English Proficiency (LEP), sex, age, or disability (and religion in the context of employment, aviation, or transit) may file a written complaint. Allegations received by telephone will be reduced to writing and provided to the complainant for confirmation or revision before processing. Complaints will be accepted in other languages, including Braille.

5. Discrimination Complaint Form

Contact NCDOT Civil Rights to receive a full copy of the Discrimination Complaint Form and procedures.

6. Complaint Basis

Allegations must be based on issues involving race, color, national origin (LEP), sex, age, disability, or religion (in the context of employment, aviation or transit). "Basis" refers to the complainant's membership in a protected group category.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD said lands and interests therein unto the North Carolina Department of Transportation (NCDOT) and its successors forever, subject, however, to the covenants, conditions, restrictions and reservations herein contained as follows, which will remain in effect for the period during which the real property or structures are used for a purpose for which Federal financial assistance is extended or for another purpose involving the provision of similar services or benefits and will be binding on the NCDOT, its successors and assigns.

The NCDOT, in consideration of the conveyance of said lands and interests in lands, does hereby covenant and agree as a covenant running with the land for itself, its successors and assigns, that (1) no person will on the grounds of race, color, or national origin, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be otherwise subjected to discrimination with regard to any facility located wholly or in part on, over, or under such lands hereby conveyed [,] [and]* (2) that the NCDOT will use the lands and interests in lands and interests in lands so conveyed, in compliance with all requirements imposed by or pursuant to Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations, U.S. Department of Transportation, Subtitle A, Office of the Secretary, Part 21, Non-discrimination in Federally-assisted programs of the U.S. Department of Transportation, Effectuation of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, and as said Regulations and Acts may be amended [, and (3) that in the event of breach of any of the above-mentioned nondiscrimination conditions, the Department will have a right to enter or re-enter said lands and facilities on said land, and that above described land and facilities will thereon revert to and vest in and become the absolute property of the U.S. Department of Transportation and its assigns as such interest existed prior to this instruction].*

In the event facilities are constructed, maintained, or otherwise operated on the property described in this (deed, license, lease, permit, etc.) for a purpose for which a U.S. Department of Transportation activity, facility, or program is extended or for another purpose involving the provision of similar services or benefits, the (grantee, licensee, lessee, permittee, etc.) will maintain and operate such facilities and services in compliance with all requirements imposed by the Acts and Regulations (as may be amended) such that no person on the grounds of race, color, or national origin, will be excluded from participation in, denied the benefits of, or be otherwise subjected to discrimination in the use of said facilities.
 - 2. With respect to licenses, leases, permits, etc., in the event of breach of any of the above Nondiscrimination covenants, the NCDOT will have the right to terminate the (lease, license, permit, etc.) and to enter, re-enter, and repossess said lands and facilities thereon, and hold the same as if the (lease, license, permit, etc.) had never been made or issued. *

NOTICE OF REQUIREMENTS FOR AFFIRMATIVE ACTION TO ENSURE EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY (EXECUTIVE NUMBER 11246)

1. The goals and timetables for minority and female participation, expressed in percentage terms for the Contractor's aggregate workforce in each trade on all construction work in the covered area, see as shown on the attached sheet entitled "Employment Goals for Minority and Female participation".

These goals are applicable to all the Contractor's construction work (whether or not it is Federal or federally assisted) performed in the covered area. If the Contractor performs construction work in a geographical area located outside of the covered area, it shall apply the goals established for such geographical area where the work is actually performed. With regard to this second area, the Contractor also is subject to the goals for both its federally involved and nonfederally involved construction.

The Contractor's compliance with the Executive Order and the regulations in 41 CFR Part 60-4 shall be based on its implementation of the Equal Opportunity Clause, specific affirmative action obligations required by the specifications set forth in 41 CFR 60-4.3(a), and its effort to meet the goals. STANDARD SPECIAL PROVISION

ON-THE-JOB TRAINING

(10-16-07) (Rev. 4-21-15)

Z - 10

Description

The North Carolina Department of Transportation will administer a custom version of the Federal On-the-Job Training (OJT) Program, commonly referred to as the Alternate OJT Program. All contractors (existing and newcomers) will be automatically placed in the Alternate Program. Standard OJT requirements typically associated with individual projects will no longer be applied at the project level. Instead, these requirements will be applicable on an annual basis for each contractor administered by the OJT Program Manager.

On the Job Training shall meet the requirements of 23 CFR 230.107 (b), 23 USC – Section 140, this provision and the On-the-Job Training Program Manual.

The Alternate OJT Program will allow a contractor to train employees on Federal, State and privately funded projects located in North Carolina. However, priority shall be given to training employees on NCDOT Federal-Aid funded projects.

Minorities and Women

Developing, training and upgrading of minorities and women toward journeyman level status is a primary objective of this special training provision. Accordingly, the Contractor shall make every effort to enroll minority and women as trainees to the extent that such persons are available within a reasonable area of recruitment. This training commitment is not intended, and shall not be used, to discriminate against any applicant for training, whether a member of a minority group or not.

Assigning Training Goals

The Department, through the OJT Program Manager, will assign training goals for a calendar year based on the contractors' past three years' activity and the contractors' anticipated upcoming year's activity with the Department. At the beginning of each year, all contractors eligible will be contacted by the Department to determine the number of trainees that will be assigned for the upcoming calendar year. At that time the Contractor shall enter into an agreement with the Department to provide a self-imposed on-the-job training program for the calendar year. This agreement will include a specific number of annual training goals agreed to by both parties. The number of training assignments may range from 1 to 15 per contractor per calendar year. The Contractor shall sign an agreement to fulfill their annual goal for the year.\

Training Classifications

The Contractor shall provide on-the-job training aimed at developing full journeyman level workers in the construction craft/operator positions. Preference shall be given to providing training in the following skilled work classifications:

Equipment Operators Office Engineers

Truck Drivers Estimators

Carpenters Iron / Reinforcing Steel Workers

Concrete Finishers Mechanics
Pipe Layers Welders

The Department has established common training classifications and their respective training requirements that may be used by the contractors. However, the classifications established are not all-inclusive. Where the training is oriented toward construction applications, training will be allowed in lower-level management positions such as office engineers and estimators. Contractors shall submit new classifications for specific job functions that their employees are performing. The Department will review and recommend for acceptance to FHWA the new classifications proposed by contractors, if applicable. New classifications shall meet the following requirements:

Proposed training classifications are reasonable and realistic based on the job skill classification needs, and

The number of training hours specified in the training classification is consistent with common practices and provides enough time for the trainee to obtain journeyman level status.

The Contractor may allow trainees to be trained by a subcontractor provided that the Contractor retains primary responsibility for meeting the training and this provision is made applicable to the subcontract. However, only the Contractor will receive credit towards the annual goal for the trainee.

Where feasible, 25 percent of apprentices or trainees in each occupation shall be in their first year of apprenticeship or training. The number of trainees shall be distributed among the work classifications on the basis of the contractor's needs and the availability of journeymen in the various classifications within a reasonable area of recruitment.

No employee shall be employed as a trainee in any classification in which they have successfully completed a training course leading to journeyman level status or in which they have been employed as a journeyman.

Records and Reports

The Contractor shall maintain enrollment, monthly and completion reports documenting company compliance under these contract documents. These documents and any other information as requested shall be submitted to the OJT Program Manager.

Upon completion and graduation of the program, the Contractor shall provide each trainee with a certification Certificate showing the type and length of training satisfactorily completed.

Trainee Interviews

All trainees enrolled in the program will receive an initial and Trainee/Post graduate interview conducted by the OJT program staff.

Trainee Wages

Contractors shall compensate trainees on a graduating pay scale based upon a percentage of the prevailing minimum journeyman wages (Davis-Bacon Act). Minimum pay shall be as follows:

60 percent	of the journeyman wage for the first half of the training period
75 percent	of the journeyman wage for the third quarter of the training period
90 percent	of the journeyman wage for the last quarter of the training period

In no instance shall a trainee be paid less than the local minimum wage. The Contractor shall adhere to the minimum hourly wage rate that will satisfy both the NC Department of Labor (NCDOL) and the Department.

Achieving or Failing to Meet Training Goals

The Contractor will be credited for each trainee employed by him on the contract work who is currently enrolled or becomes enrolled in an approved program and who receives training for at least 50 percent of the specific program requirement. Trainees will be allowed to be transferred between projects if required by the Contractor's scheduled workload to meet training goals.

If a contractor fails to attain their training assignments for the calendar year, they may be taken off the NCDOT's Bidders List.

Measurement and Payment

No compensation will be made for providing required training in accordance with these contract documents.
