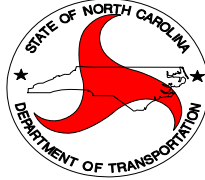

The Bidder has carefully examined the location of the proposed work to be known as Contract No. **D7POC138**; has carefully examined the plans and specifications, which are acknowledged to be part of the proposal, the special provisions, the proposal, the form of contract,; and thoroughly understands the stipulations, requirements and provisions. The undersigned bidder agrees to bound upon his execution of the bid. The undersigned Bidder further agrees to provide all necessary machinery, tools, labor, and other means of construction; and to do all the work and to furnish all materials, except as otherwise noted, necessary to perform and complete the said contract in accordance with *the 2012 Standard Specifications for Roads and Structures* by the dates(s) specified in the Project Special Provisions and in accordance with the requirements of the Engineer, and at the unit or lump sum prices, as the case may be, for the various items given on the sheets contained herein.

The Bidder shall provide and furnish all the materials, machinery, implements, appliances and tools, and perform the work and required labor to construct and complete State Highway Contract No. **D7POC138** in **Caswell County**, for the unit or lump sum prices, as the case may be, bid by the Bidder in his bid and according to the proposal, plans, and specifications prepared by said Department, which proposal, plans, and specifications show the details covering this project, and hereby become a part of this contract.

The published volume entitled *North Carolina Department of Transportation, Raleigh, Standard Specifications for Roads and Structures, January 2012* with all amendments and supplements thereto, is by reference incorporated into and made a part of this contract; that, except as herein modified, all the construction and work included in this contract is to be done in accordance with the specifications contained in said volume, and amendments and supplements thereto, under the direction of the Engineer.

If the proposal is accepted and the award is made, the contract is valid only when signed either by the Contract Officer or such other person as may be designated by the Secretary to sign for the Department of Transportation. The conditions and provisions herein cannot be changed except over the signature of the said Contract Officer or Division Engineer.

The quantities shown in the itemized proposal for the project are considered to be approximate only and are given as the basis for comparison of bids. The Department of Transportation may increase or decrease the quantity of any item or portion of the work as may be deemed necessary or expedient.

An increase or decrease in the quantity of an item will not be regarded as sufficient ground for an increase or decrease in the unit prices, nor in the time allowed for the completion of the work, except as provided for the contract.

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INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS

PLEASE READ ALL INSTRUCTIONS CAREFULLY BEFORE PREPARING AND SUBMITTING YOUR BID.

All bids shall be prepared and submitted in accordance with the following requirements. Failure to comply with any requirement may cause the bid to be considered irregular and may be grounds for rejection of the bid.

1. Download the entire proposal from the Connect NCDOT website, bind and return the entire proposal with your bid.
2. The Bidder shall submit a unit price for every item. *****Unit Prices shall be rounded off by the bidder to contain no more than TWO decimal places.*****
3. An amount bid shall be entered for every item.
4. Changes to any entry shall be made by marking through the entry in ink and making the correct entry adjacent thereto in ink. A representative of the Bidder shall initial the change in ink. **Do not use correction fluid, correction tape or similar product to make corrections.**
5. The bid shall be properly executed on the included **Execution of Bid – Non-collusion Affidavit, Debarment Certification and Gift Ban Certification** form. All bids shall show the following information:
 - a. Name of corporation, partnership, limited liability company, joint venture, individual or firm, submitting bid.
 - b. Corporations that have a corporate seal should include it on the bid.
 - c. Name of individual or representative submitting bid and position or title held on behalf of the bidder.
 - d. Name, signature, and position or title of witness.
 - e. Completed attestation by Notary Public
6. **Note: Signer, Witness and Notary Public must be different individuals.**
7. The bid shall not contain any unauthorized additions, deletions, or conditional bids.
8. The Bidder shall not add any provision reserving the right to accept or reject an award, or to enter into a contract pursuant to an award.

The contractor and/or subcontractor(s) shall be prequalified in the work code(s) for they will complete. Any contractor identified as working outside their expertise will be considered in default of contract.

GENERAL

This contract is for long arm mowing of vegetation within the State Highway System rights of way along State Highway system routes within Caswell County. The work shall include furnishing all equipment, tools, materials, transportation, and labor necessary for the prosecution and completion of the work.

The contract quantities are estimated quantities established for bid purposes only; actual quantities may vary. Roads may be added or deleted with no change in price.

All materials and workmanship shall be in accordance with the following:

The Project Special Provisions, Project Standard Provisions, most current Standard Special Provisions, *Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD)*, Provisions contained in the applicable Sections of the North Carolina Department of Transportation's *Standard 2012 Specifications for Roads and Structures* dated, and Drawings contained in the applicable sections of the North Carolina Department of Transportation's *Roadway Standard 2012 Drawings* dated shall apply.

The published volume entitled *North Carolina Department of Transportation, Standard 2012 Specifications for Roads and Structures*, with all amendments and supplements thereto, is by reference incorporated into and made a part of this contract; that, except as herein modified, all the construction and work included in the contract is to be done in accordance with the specifications contained in said volume, and amendments and supplements thereto, under the direction of the Engineer.

The Engineer will notify the Contractor in writing 30 days before the end of the contract period if the contract may be extended for the following year. The Contractor must notify the Engineer in writing within 15 calendar days of his/her acceptance or rejection of this offer. Failure on the part of the Contractor to reply will be considered a rejection of the contract extension.

The Contractor's **may work** between the hour of 7:00 a.m. and 5:30 p.m. **No work may be performed on weekends or State holidays.** Work shall only be performed when visibility and conditions allow for safe operations.

Liquidated damages for this contract are **Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250.00)** per hour or portion thereof that the Contractor operates outside of the work hours as stated above

PROSECUTION OF WORK:

The Contractor will be notified by the Engineer when to begin operations for each cycle or portion thereof and for any additional mowing, and the Contractor shall begin work within five (5) working days after being notified. Any work performed prior to the time of notification by the engineer will not be included in any payment to the Contractor. The Contractor will be required to prosecute the work in a continuous and uninterrupted manner.

The Contractor will be required to prosecute the work of each notification in a continuous and uninterrupted manner from the time he begins the work until completion and final acceptance of the project. The Contractor will not be permitted to suspend his operations except for reasons beyond his control or except where the Engineer has authorized a suspension of the Contractor's operations in writing.

In the event that the Contractor's operations are suspended in violation of the above provisions, the sum of **\$100.00** will be charged the Contractor for each and every calendar day that such suspension takes place. The said amount is hereby agreed upon as liquidated damages due to extra engineering and maintenance costs and due to increased public hazard resulting from a suspension of the work. Liquidated damages chargeable due to suspension of the work will be additional to any liquidated damages that may become chargeable due to failure to complete the work on time

PROJECT SPECIAL PROVISIONS

LONG ARM MOWING

(9-25-12)

Div. 7

General

The contractor shall perform Long Arm mowing within the Right-of-Way on various State maintained routes on the Primary and Secondary systems in Caswell County as directed by the Engineer.

The Contractor shall mow the roads assigned by the County Maintenance Engineer to a height of six inches (6").

The Contractor shall be responsible for the equipment provided in this contract at all times and at all locations during the term of the contract. The Contractor shall have no claim against the Department of Transportation for any expense involving damage or loss to the Contractor's equipment (including vandalism, theft, fire and acts of God) arising out of, or relating to, work performed under this agreement. Equipment shall be parked in safe areas and kept clear of intersection sight distance and utility access points (i.e. fire hydrants). The Contractor will be held responsible for all damage or injury to property and he shall restore such property to a condition equal to that existing before such damage or injury was done, and shall make good such damage or injury in a manner acceptable to the owner of the damaged property and to the Department.

The contractor shall be responsible for providing transportation for all equipment to and from all job sites assigned by the Department of Transportation at no cost to the Department of Transportation, and no equipment owned or personnel employed by the Department of Transportation may be used in the transportation or operation of the contractor's equipment.

Mowing

All routes shall be mown to the top of the cut slope, to the bottom of the fill slope, to the limit of the equipment, or as directed by the Engineer. Vegetation hanging over the cut slope or fill slope shall be mown to the limit of the mower. All vegetation five (5) inches in diameter or less shall be cut. Cut vegetation shall be cleaned up or mulched with mower. All brush or debris which falls into the roadway shall be immediately removed by the Contractor.

Equipment

A minimum of eight (8) **Long Arm 100 HP Tractor Mowers** meeting the following specifications shall be provided:

- All mowers provided under this contract shall be hydraulic powered, and shall be equipped with an A-Boom Rotary Attachment with a minimum reach of twenty feet (20') measured from the center of the steering wheel.
- Mower hydraulics shall be controlled from within the driver compartment.
- The tractor shall have a minimum of 100 HP.
- The mowing deck shall be a minimum of sixty inches (60") with mowing blades of 14" to 17" in length.

- Mowers are to be equipped with shields, which preclude foreign objects from being thrown out from the cutting unit enclosures.

Upon approval of the Engineer, the Contractor may provide additional units in accordance with the terms and conditions of this contract. If the Contractor demonstrates that he/she can perform the work on schedule with a lesser number, he/she may reduce the number with the prior approval of the Engineer.

All tractors and mowers provided by the Contractor shall be equipped so as to conform to the prevailing Occupational Safety Health Act Standards. Tractors shall also be equipped with a minimum of two (2) outside amber lights visible from both directions and one (1) top of the cab mounted amber flashing light, visible from 360 degrees. Headlights and Taillights shall be functioning and on during operation. The Contractor must furnish, mount, and maintain a 36"X36" "Caution Mower" sign on the rear of each mower. In addition, the Contractor shall display his company name on each tractor. All equipment shall be equipped with operable back-up warning devices. Mowers shall also be equipped with shields and guards which preclude foreign objects from being thrown out from the cutting unit enclosures, in addition to all other safety apparatus that originally was installed by the manufacturer.

The Long Arm Mowers shall be inspected and approved by the Engineer prior to work beginning and periodically during the life of the contract. If, at any time, the Engineer finds that the equipment is not satisfactory, or has not been maintained in operating condition, the Contractor shall repair or replace the unsatisfactory equipment at the Contractor's cost.

Operation of Equipment

The Contractor shall operate the equipment in a safe manner so as not to create a hazard to the traveling public. Insofar as possible, the tractor wheels are to remain off the travel way during mowing operations. The equipment shall not be parked within the State Highway System right of way overnight or at other times when work has been suspended, unless approved by the Engineer.

Inspection

All work shall be subject to inspection by the Engineer at any time. Routinely, the Engineer will make periodic inspections of the completed work. It will be the responsibility of the Contractor to keep the Engineer informed of his/her proposed work plan and to submit written reports of work accomplished on a weekly basis, unless otherwise directed.

Acceptance

It is intended that the work will be completed in a neat, workmanlike manner. Gapped or rolled down, uncut areas will not be considered acceptable. Vegetation around mailboxes, structures, delineators, guardrail, and sign posts, shall be mowed to provide a neat appearance; however, the Contractor will not be required to perform hand trimming.

Method of Measurement

The quantity of "Long Arm Mowing" to be paid for will be the actual number of shoulder miles which have been mown and the work accepted.

It is understood that during the course of the contract, routes may be added to or deleted from the contract as routes are added to or deleted from the State Highway System or other extenuating circumstances. It will be the responsibility of the Contractor to mow or not mow

such routes as directed by the Engineer. In the case of roads added to the System, actual mileage will be used for measurement.

Basis of Payment

The quantity of “Long Arm Mowing” will be paid for at the contract unit price per shoulder mile for “Long Arm Mowing”. Shoulder Miles will be measured to the nearest 1/10 mile based upon NCDOT county map mileages. Where there is an obvious mistake on the county map, measurement will be made using a distance meter.

Prices and payments will be full compensation for all work, including but not limited to supervision, labor, transportation, fuels, lubricants, repair parts, equipment, machinery, and tools, necessary for the prosecution and completion of the work. Payments will be made to the Contractor on a monthly basis for work accomplished and accepted.

SUPPLEMENTAL LONG ARM MOWING

(12-19-2012)

Div. 7

General

The contractor shall perform supplemental mowing of areas as determined by the Engineer. Supplemental mowing may entail mowing of irregularly shaped areas. “Supplemental Long Arm Mowing” shall be completed within 7 days of assignment unless otherwise determined by the Engineer.

The Contractor shall mow the roads assigned by the County Maintenance Engineer to a height of six inches (6”).

The Contractor shall be responsible for the equipment provided in this contract at all times and at all locations during the term of the contract. The Contractor shall have no claim against the Department of Transportation for any expense involving damage or loss to the Contractor’s equipment (including vandalism, theft, fire and acts of God) arising out of, or relating to, work performed under this agreement. Equipment shall be parked in safe areas and kept clear of intersection sight distance and utility access points (i.e. fire hydrants). The Contractor will be held responsible for all damage or injury to property and he shall restore such property to a condition equal to that existing before such damage or injury was done, and shall make good such damage or injury in a manner acceptable to the owner of the damaged property and to the Department.

The contractor shall be responsible for providing transportation for all equipment to and from all job sites assigned by the Department of Transportation at no cost to the Department of Transportation, and no equipment owned or personnel employed by the Department of Transportation may be used in the transportation or operation of the contractor’s equipment.

All provisions of the section entitled “LONG ARM MOWING” shall apply **except “General”, “Method of Measurement” and “Basis of Payment”**.

Method of Measurement

The quantity of "Supplemental Long Arm Mowing" will be measured as the actual number of hours the Contractor spends mowing the assigned areas which have been completed and accepted, including travel time from and return trip to the Contractor's current mowing location. No measurement of time will be made for breaks, meals or down time.

Basis of Payment

The quantity of "Supplemental Long Arm Mowing" will be paid for at the contract unit price per hour for "Supplemental Long Arm Mowing". Time will be measured to the nearest ¼ hour based upon the time the equipment was in actual productive operation, including travel time from and return trip to the Contractor's current mowing location.. The Contractor shall protect carefully from disturbance or damage all land monuments and property markers.

The Contractor shall be responsible for the removal, preservation, and resetting of all mail boxes disturbed by the mowing operations. The mailboxes and their supports, when reset, shall be left in as good a condition as they were prior to the mowing operations.

The Contractor will be held responsible for all damage or injury to property of any character resulting from any act, omission, negligence, or misconduct in the prosecution of the work. When any direct or indirect damage or injury is done to public or private property by or on account of any act, omission, negligence, or misconduct in the execution of the work, he/she shall either restore at his/her own expense such property to a condition similar or equal to that existing before such damage or injury was done, or shall make good such damage or injury in a manner acceptable to the owner of the damaged property and to the Department. In case of failure on the part of the Contractor to restore such property or make good such damage or injury the Department may at the Contractor's expense repair, rebuild, or otherwise restore such property in such manner as the Engineer may consider necessary.

GROWTH REGULATORS/RETARDANTS

TRAFFIC CONTROL AND WORK ZONE SAFETY

(Rev. 9-25-12)

The Contractor shall provide all traffic control along with attenuator truck (TMIA) along ALL primary routes.

All personnel when working in traffic areas or areas in close proximity to traffic shall wear an approved safety vest, or shirt or jacket which meets the color requirements of the Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD). All work vehicles shall be equipped with an outside flashing amber light visible from all directions.

The work zone sign shall be a portable sign 48"x 48" and stand specifically designed for one another, and should be five (5) feet off the ground (refer to NCDOT 2012 Roadway Standard Drawing 1110.02). Signs shall be composite, aluminum, or retro-reflective roll-up (Non-reflective Mesh Signs will not be accepted). Signs should be mounted 3' minimum from travel lane on the right shoulder or in the median in advance of slope mowing operations and should be relocated regularly to maintain a work zone of 2-mile maximum length. Care should be taken that this sign is displayed only while slope mowing work is underway.

In accordance with NCDOT 2012 *Standard Specifications* 107-22 , the Contractor shall comply with all applicable Federal, State, and local laws, ordinances, and regulations governing safety, health, and sanitation, and shall provide all safeguards, safety devices, and protective equipment, and shall take any other needed actions, on his own responsibility that are reasonably necessary to protect the life and health of employees on the job and the safety of the public, and to protect property in connection with the performance of the work covered by the contract.

Failure to comply with any of the requirements for safety and traffic control of this contract shall result in suspension of work as provided in NCDOT 2012 *Standard Specifications* 108-7.

No direct payment shall be made for traffic control and work zone safety items, as they shall be considered incidental to other contract items.

DEBARMENT CERTIFICATION

Conditions for certification:

1. The prequalified bidder shall provide immediate written notice to the Department if at any time the bidder learns that his certification was erroneous when he submitted his debarment certification or explanation filed with the Department, or has become erroneous because of changed circumstances.
