## TOWN OF LOUISBURG REQUEST FOR LETTER OF INTEREST

THE TOWN OF LOUISBURG DESIRES TO ENGAGE QUALIFIED PRIVATE ENGINEERING FIRMS TO PROVIDE CONSTRUCTION ENGINEERING AND INSPECTION SERVICES (CEI) FOR A CONTRACT CONSTRUCTION PROJECT.

The primary and/or subconsultant firm(s) shall be pre-qualified by NCDOT to perform Roadway Construction Engineering & Inspection and/or Structures Construction Engineering & Inspection. The work codes required are 00195 – Roadway Construction Engineering and Inspection, and 00233 – Structures Construction Engineering and Inspections.

The Town of Louisburg desires to engage a Private Engineering Firm (PEF) to provide Construction Engineering and Inspection (CEI) services for **NCDOT Project C-5527** also known as the Town of Louisburg South Main St. Sidewalk Project and **NCDOT Project C-5568** also known as the Town of Louisburg Bickett Blvd. and Johnson St. Sidewalk Project. The selected firm will report directly to Town Staff. The selected firm is to administer the contract and to ensure that all work is performed in accordance with the contract requirements.

Projects: Projects C-5527 and C-5568 will involve the combination of sidewalk construction, curb, gutter, storm drainage, environmental protective measures, associated site preparation work and other activities contained in the project design and bid document. The project(s) length is approximately 4,000 linear feet (LF) of 5-6' wide concrete sidewalk, approximately 3,500 LF of concrete curb and gutter, associated storm drainage, curb ramps, and other items- The project is currently scheduled for advertisement in April, 2017 with a low bid award. The construction contract will be available June, 2017 with an anticipated 120 day completion date.

The PEF will be responsible for providing engineers and technicians with the appropriate skills and qualifications to ensure contract compliance. The PEF will be directly responsible for oversight of the projects for the City. The PEF shall indemnify and save harmless the City for claims and liabilities resulting from negligence, errors or omissions of the PEF; including, but not limited to, the engineers, technicians or subconsultants. The private engineering firm must demonstrate the ability to provide Construction Technicians with the appropriate skills and qualifications to perform inspection, materials sampling, materials testing, surveying grade verification, documentation of pay quantities, erosion control and permit compliance, safety compliance and claims avoidance. The technicians performing the inspection work must be trained, qualified, and certified by the National Institute for Certification in Engineering Technologies (NICET) or have

an approved combination of education, experience, and training. NCDOT certifications are required for testing.

Any firm wishing to be considered must be properly registered with the Office of the Secretary of State and with the North Carolina Board of Registration for Professional Engineers and Land Surveyors. Any firm proposing to use corporate subsidiaries or subcontractors must include a statement that these companies are properly registered with the NC Board of Registration for Professional Engineers and Land Surveyors. The Engineers performing the work and in responsible charge of the work must be registered Professional Engineers in the State of North Carolina and must have a good ethical and professional standing. It will be the responsibility of the selected private firm to verify the registration of any corporate subsidiary or subcontractor prior to submitting a Letter of Interest. The firm must have the financial ability to undertake the work and assume the liability. The selected firm will be required to furnish proof of Professional Liability insurance coverage in the minimum amount of \$1,000,000. The firm must have an adequate accounting system to identify costs chargeable to the project. The proposed method of payment for this contract is cost plus a percentage fee with a maximum amount.

The selection of a private engineering firm to provide and Construction Engineering and Inspection Services on this specific project will be handled in accordance with the following process:

- 1. Submission by the private engineering firm of a Letter of Interest (LOI).
- 2. City will short list private engineering firms to a minimum of three firms.
- 3. Pre-interview meeting and oral interview at the option of the City.
- 4. City will select a private engineering firm to provide the Construction Engineering and Inspection Services.

### SMALL PROFESSIONAL SERVICE FIRM (SPSF) PARTICIPATION

The City encourages the use of Small Professional Services Firms. A firm must be certified as a Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE), Minority Business Enterprise (MBE), and/or Women's Business Enterprise (WBE) to qualify as an SPSF.

Small businesses determined to be eligible for participation in the SPSF program are those meeting size standards defined by Small Business Administration (SBA) regulations, 13 CFR Part 121 in Sector 54 under the North American Industrial Classification System (NAICS). The SPSF program is a race, ethnicity, and gender neutral program designed to increase the availability of contracting opportunities for small businesses on federal, state or locally funded contracts. SPSF participation is not contingent upon the funding source.

The Firm, at the time the Letter of Interest is submitted, shall submit a listing of all known SPSF firms that will participate in the performance of the identified work. The participation shall be submitted on the Department's Subconsultant Form RS-2. RS-2 forms may be accessed on the Department's website at <a href="NCDOT Electronic Forms">NCDOT Electronic Forms</a>.

The SPSF must be qualified with the Department to perform the work for which they are listed.

Real-time information about firms doing business with the Department and firms that are SPSF certified through the Contractual Services Unit is available in the Directory of Transportation Firms. The Directory can be accessed on the Department's website at <u>Directory of Firms</u> -- Complete listing of certified and pregualified firms.

The listing of an individual firm in the Department's directory shall not be construed as an endorsement of the firm.

## **PREQUALIFICATION**

The NCDOT maintains a file on each qualified firm that has expressed an interest in providing professional services. Included in this file are a company brochure and Form PREQUAL-1 listing personnel and their qualifications for performing desired work, company's present activities and financial qualifications. At the time this initial information is submitted, a sample of recent work is needed for evaluation.

If your firm and all subconsultants have submitted or updated this data since January 1, 2016, please advise when the new data packet(s) were sent to the Department in the Cover/Introductory Letter with your Letter of Interest (LOI). Having this data on file with the Department eliminates the need to resubmit this data with each letter of interest.

If your firm and/or any subconsultants have not submitted or updated this data since January 1, 2016, please submit the new data to the Department *prior* to submittal of your Letter of Interest (LOI). An application may be accessed at https://apps03.dot.state.nc.us/vendor/prequal. Having this data on file with the Department eliminates the need to resubmit this data with each Letter of Interest (LOI).

Even though specific DBE/MBE/WBE goals are not required for this project, the Department of Transportation is committed to providing opportunity for small and disadvantaged businesses to perform on its contracts through established Department goals. The Firm, subconsultant and subfirm shall not discriminate on the basis of race, religion, color, national origin, age disability or sex in the performance of this contract.

#### **EVALUATION**

Firms submitting LOIs to perform the Construction Engineering and Inspection Services on this specific project will be evaluated based upon certain considerations. The following considerations, with the weighted importance, will be utilized in the selection from those submitting an LOI:

- 1. Firm's experience, knowledge, familiarity and past performance with structure design and highway construction and CEI services 30%
- 2. The experience of the firm's proposed staff to perform the type of work required 40%
- 3. Firm's understanding of the project specific issues and their responsibility in delivering services for the advertised project -30%

North Carolina firms qualified to do the required work will be given priority consideration. A North Carolina firm is a firm that maintains an office in North Carolina staffed with an adequate number of employees judged by the Department to be capable of performing a majority of the work required. After reviewing qualifications, if firms are equal on the evaluation review, then those qualified firms with proposed SPSF participation will be given priority consideration.

# FORMAT FOR SUBMISSION OF A TOWN OF LOUISBURG LETTER OF INTEREST

All letters of interest are limited to 11 pages (RS-2 forms are not included in the page count) inclusive of the cover sheet, and shall be typed on 8 1/2" x 11" sheets, single-spaced, one-sided. Fold out pages are not allowed. In order to reduce costs and to facilitate recycling; binders, dividers, tabs, etc. are prohibited. One staple in the upper left-hand corner is preferred. Letters of interest containing more than 11 pages will not be considered.

**Section I - Cover/Introductory Letter** 

The introductory letter should be addressed to Tony L. King, Asst. Town Administrator, Town of Louisburg. Said letter is limited to 2 pages and should contain the following elements of information:
☐ Expression of firm's interest in the work;
☐ Statement of whether firm is on register or submitting information with letter of interest;
☐ Date of most recent private engineering firm qualification;
☐ Statement regarding firms' possible conflict(s) of interest for the work; and
☐ Summation of information contained in the letter of interest.
<b>Section II - Evaluation Factors</b> This section is limited to <b>4</b> pages and should contain information regarding evaluation and other factors listed in the advertisement such as:
☐ A brief synopsis of the firm's previous and Construction Engineering and Inspection Services experience that is focused to the type of project advertised for services [performed within last seven (7) years];
☐ The number of employees within the firm;
☐ A brief description of the firm's approach to performing and Construction Engineering and Inspection Services for this work, including the firm's understanding of their responsibility with regard to safety, contract administration, environmental responsibility, claims, and project delivery;
$\Box$ The proposed personnel to be assigned to the work by discipline, their availability date on the project.
☐ Identify project personnel/subconsultants' qualifications and experience as related to this work;
☐ Unique qualifications of key team members; and
☐ Any innovative approaches to be used.
Section III - Supportive Information

This section is limited to **5** pages and should contain the following information:

## SUBMISSION OF LETTER OF INTEREST

Private engineering firms are invited to have letters of interest for furnishing Construction Engineering and Inspection Services to the City by 2:00 p.m. on May 1, 2017. Letters of interest received after this deadline will not be considered. Submittals should include three (3) hard copies as well as an electronic copy

Firms submitting letters of interest are encouraged to carefully check them for conformance to the requirements stated above. If Letters of Interest (LOIs) do not

meet ALL of these requirements, or to any address other than shown below they will be disqualified. No exception will be granted.
