This RFLOI is to solicit responses (LETTERS of INTEREST, or LOIs) from qualified firms to provide professional consulting services to:

This request is for engineering services to perform inspection and testing, project certification, development of on-call personnel to perform inspection, sampling, testing and analysis of materials, products and pavements.

Except as provided below any firm wishing to be considered must be properly registered with the Office of the Secretary of State and with the North Carolina Board of Examiners for Engineers and Surveyors. Any firm proposing to use corporate subsidiaries or subcontractors must include a statement that these companies are properly registered with the North Carolina Board of Examiners for Engineers and Surveyors and/or the NC Board for Licensing of Geologists. The Engineers performing the work and in responsible charge of the work must be registered Professional Engineers in the State of North Carolina and must have a good ethical and professional standing. It will be the responsibility of the selected private firm to verify the registration of any corporate subsidiary or subcontractor prior to submitting a Letter of Interest. Firms which are not providing engineering services need not be registered with the North Carolina Board of Examiners for Engineers and Surveyors. Some of the services being solicited may not require a license. It is the responsibility of each firm to adhere to all laws of the State of North Carolina.

The firm must have the financial ability to undertake the work and assume the liability. The selected firm(s) will be required to furnish proof of Professional Liability insurance coverage in the minimum amount of \$1,000,000.00. The firm(s) must have an adequate accounting system to identify costs chargeable to the project.

SCOPE OF WORK

The North Carolina Department of Transportation (NCDOT) is soliciting proposals for the services of a firm/team for the following contract scope of work:

Selected firms will provide services to include inspection, sampling, testing, pavement design, reviewing and sealing typical sections, and analysis of materials and products. Services also include: development of training materials and conducting training sessions; performance of project certification functions; auditing of producer facilities; analysis of data; and development/documentation of procedures or guides.

Additionally, firms will provide on-call personnel for the inspection, sampling, testing and analysis of Pavements, Liquid Asphalt, Asphalt Mix, Concrete, Soil, Aggregate,

Steel and other miscellaneous materials. The private firm will be responsible for providing on-call personnel at the following levels:

- Engineering Technician (Levels I, II, III, and IV)
- Engineer (Contributing)
- Technical Trainer (Level II)
- Chemistry Technician (Levels I and II)
- Licensed Professional Engineer (when specifically required)

When specialized training or certification is required, the Department will provide the appropriate courses and/or training. It will be the responsibility of the firm to replace any technician who fails to achieve the necessary certifications. When technician certifications listed below are required, the firm will provide personnel with the appropriate certification.

Personnel will be assigned to locations as needed; either in the central facility or various M&T facilities throughout the state. Office space and access to office equipment will be provided as needed (computers, copiers, printers, etc.) Training in computer entry will be provided, although basic computer skills are expected.

Duties performed by these positions will be as determined by the Materials and Tests Unit.

The Department manager responsible for the work will provide daily supervision and instruction.

If the work assignment is at a single facility, no vehicle reimbursement will be made. If the work assignment involves travel to more than one location, the firm will be expected to provide a vehicle for the technician. A rate of reimbursement for the vehicle will be negotiated. <u>PROPOSED</u> CONTRACT TIME: TWO (2) YEARS; with a possible ONE (1) YEAR EXTENSION.

<u>PROPOSED</u> CONTRACT PAYMENT TYPE: THE CONTRACT PAYEMENT TYPE WILL BE TASK-DEPENDENT: LUMP SUM or COST-PLUS.

SUBMITTAL REQUIREMENTS

All LOIs are limited to **FIFTEEN** (15) pages (RS-2 forms are not included in the page count) inclusive of the cover sheet, and shall be typed on 8-1/2" x 11" sheets, single-spaced, one-sided.

LOIs containing more than FIFTEEN (15) pages will not be considered.

The FTS system will send you an electronic receipt when your LOI is uploaded to NCDOT's FTS system. Paper copies are not required. The subject line should contain the Firm's Name, and "LOI for 2017 INSPECTION, TESTING AND ANALYSIS OF MATERIALS AND PAVEMENTS -- LIMITED SERVICE CONTRACT".

If an interested firm does not have an FTS account they should send a request through regular e-mail to psmu-411@ncdot.gov. A response will be sent via the FTS system that will provide a login username, password, and login procedures.

LOIs SHALL be received electronically no later than 12:00 P.M., FEBRUARY 17, 2017.

LOIs received after this deadline will not be considered.

Firms submitting LOIs are encouraged to carefully check them for conformance to the requirements stated above (and any other requirements in this Advertisement). If LOIs are submitted late, exceed the maximum number of pages, are sent by any means other than NCDOT's FTS system, or are sent to any address other than psmu-411@ncdot.gov they will be disqualified.

The Department reserves the right to reject all LOIs and not proceed with procurement.

The Department reserves the right to waive any technicality in LOIs, or notify the Firm(s) of such technicality and allow the Firm(s) up to two (2) business days to rectify the technicality.

SELECTION PROCESS

Following is a general description of the selection process:

- The NCDOT Selection Committee will review all qualifying LOI submittals.
- <u>For Limited Services Contracts (On-Call type contracts)</u>, the NCDOT Selection Committee <u>MAY</u>, at the Department's discretion, choose any number of firms to provide the services being solicited.
- For Project-Specific Contracts (non On-Call type contracts), the Selection Committee <u>MAY</u>, at the Department's discretion, shortlist a minimum of three (3) firms to be interviewed. IF APPLICABLE, dates of shortlisting and dates for interviews are shown in the section SUBMISSION SCHEDULE AND KEY DATES at the end of this RFLOI.
- In order to be considered for selection, consultants must submit a complete response to this RFLOI prior to the specified deadlines. Failure to submit all information in a timely manner will result in disqualification.

SMALL PROFESSIONAL SERVICE FIRM (SPSF) PARTICIPATION

The Department encourages the use of Small Professional Services Firms (SPSF). Small businesses determined to be eligible for participation in the SPSF program are those meeting size standards defined by Small Business Administration (SBA) regulations, 13 CFR Part 121 in Sector 54 under the North American Industrial Classification System (NAICS). The SPSF program is a race, ethnicity, and gender neutral program designed to increase the availability of contracting opportunities for small businesses on federal, state or locally funded contracts. SPSF participation is not contingent upon the funding source.

The Firm, at the time the Letter of Interest is submitted, shall submit a listing of all known SPSF firms that will participate in the performance of the identified work. The participation shall be submitted on the Department's Subconsultant Form RS-2. RS-2 forms may be accessed on the Department's website at NCDOT Electronic Forms.

The SPSF must be qualified with the Department to perform the work for which they are listed.

Real-time information about firms doing business with the Department and firms that are SPSF certified through the Contractual Services Unit is available in the Directory of Transportation Firms. The Directory can be accessed on the Department's website at Directory of Firms -- Complete listing of certified and prequalified firms.

The listing of an individual firm in the Department's directory shall not be construed as an endorsement of the firm.

PREQUALIFICATION

The Department maintains on file the qualifications and key personnel for each approved discipline, as well as any required samples of work. Each year on the anniversary date of the company, the firm shall renew their prequalified disciplines. If your firm has not renewed its application as required by your anniversary date or if your firm is not currently prequalified, please submit an application to the Department **prior to submittal of your LOI**. An application may be accessed on the Department's website at <u>Prequalifying Private Consulting Firms</u> -- Learn how to become Prequalified as a Private Consulting Firm with NCDOT. Having this data on file with the Department eliminates the need to resubmit this data with each letter of interest.

Even though specific DBE/MBE/WBE goals are not required for this project, the Department of Transportation is committed to providing opportunity for small and disadvantaged businesses to perform on its contracts through established Department goals. The Firm, subconsultant and subfirm shall not discriminate on the basis of race, religion, color, national origin, age, disability or sex in the performance of this contract.

SELECTION CRITERIA

All prequalified firms who submit responsive letters of interest will be considered.

In selecting a firm/team, the selection committee will take into consideration qualification information including such factors as:

- 1. **50%** = The firm's understanding and experience with the specific work code or task.
- 2. **50%** = The firm's management experience in staffing similar types of work.
- 3. **N/A%** = N/A.
- 4. <u>N/A%</u> = N/A.
- 5. **N/A% =** N/A.

After reviewing qualifications, if firms are equal on the evaluation review, then those qualified firms with proposed SPSF participation will be given priority consideration.

SUBMISSION ORGANIZATION AND INFORMATION REQUIREMENTS

The LOI should be addressed to **Robert J. Stroup, PE -- State Professional Services Engineer** and must include the name, address, telephone number, and e-mail address of the prime consultant's contact person for this RFLOI.

The LOI must also include the information outlined below:

Chapter 1 - Introduction

The Introduction should demonstrate the consultant's overall qualifications to fulfill the requirements of the scope of work and should contain the following elements of information:

- Expression of firm's interest in the work;
- Statement of whether firm is on register;
- Date of most recent private engineering firm qualification;
- Statement regarding firm's(') possible conflict of interest for the work; and
- Summation of information contained in the letter of interest.

Chapter 2 - Team Qualifications

This chapter should elaborate on the general information presented in the introduction, to establish the credentials and experience of the consultant to undertake this type of effort. The following must be included:

- 1. Identify <u>recent</u>, similar projects the firm, acting as the prime contractor, has conducted which demonstrates its ability to conduct and manage the project. Provide a synopsis of each project and include the date completed, and contact person.
- 2. If subconsultants are involved, provide corresponding information describing their qualifications as requested in bullet number 1 above.

Chapter 3 - Team Experience

This chapter must provide the names, classifications, and location of the firm's North Carolina employees and resources to be assigned to the advertised work; and the professional credentials and experience of the persons assigned to the project, along with any unique qualifications of key personnel. Although standard personnel resumes may be included, identify pertinent team experience to be applied to this project. Specifically, the Department is interested in the experience, expertise, and total quality of the consultant's proposed team. If principals of the firm will not be actively involved in the study/contract/project, do not list them. The submittal shall clearly indicate the Consultant's Project Manager, other key Team Members and his/her qualifications for the proposed work. Also, include the team's organization chart for the Project / Plan. A Capacity Chart / Graph (available work force) should also be included. Any other pertinent information should also be listed in this section.

Note: If a project team or subconsultant encounters personnel changes, or any other changes of significance dealing with the company, NCDOT should be notified immediately.

Chapter 4 - Technical Approach

The consultant shall provide information on its understanding of, and approach to accomplish, this project, including their envisioned scope for the work and any innovative ideas/approaches, and a schedule to achieve the dates outlined in this RFLOI (if any project-specific dates are outlined below).
