Answer:

No, funding must be authorized in the Federal Fiscal Year in which they are programmed. For this specific project, funds programmed for Preliminary Engineering Authorization is in FFY 2023 (October 1, 2022 and September 30, 2023). The completion date of October 1st, 2023, was removed from the project scope in the RFLOI and remained in the public notice on accident.

Generally, NCDOT will set up a portion of the total funding for preliminary engineering. PE Funding may be adjusted after the review and approval of a consultant contract. PE expenses should be monitored so that it stays within this range; additional funds may not be available.

1.1 Public Notice

The Village of Marvin (Village) seeks Engineering Services from fully qualified professional consulting firms for the design, feasibility studies, and environmental documents of new trail segments, which will be a continuation of the existing Marvin Loop Greenway Trail. The Village is pursuing firms that are knowledgeable regarding federal regulations in general, and firms whose combination of experience and expertise will provide timely, professional services to the Village.

This contract shall be partially reimbursed with federal-aid funding through the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), North Carolina Department of Transportation (NCDOT), the Charlotte Regional Transportation Planning Organization's (CRTPO) Discretionary Project Program and the Village of Marvin. The solicitation, selection, and negotiation of a contract shall be conducted in accordance with all federal and state guidelines.

The work on this contract shall be completed by October 1st, 2023. The budget for this project is \$244,000.

A firm will not be considered unless the following minimum requirements are met:

- 1. A firm must be properly registered with the Office of the Secretary of State of North Carolina; and
- 2. The primary and any subconsultant firms(s) shall be prequalified by NCDOT to perform the required services. The firm should be prequalified with NCDOT under the following Work Codes/Discipline Codes:

Except as provided below any firm wishing to be considered must be properly registered with the Office of the Secretary of State and with the North Carolina Board of Examiners for Engineers and Surveyors. Any firm proposing to use corporate subsidiaries or subcontractors must include a statement that these companies are properly registered with the North Carolina Board of Examiners for Engineers and Surveyors and/or the NC Board for Licensing of Geologists. The Engineers performing the work and in responsible charge of the work must be registered Professional Engineers in the State of North Carolina and must have a good ethical and professional standing. It will be the responsibility of the selected private firm to verify the registration of any corporate subsidiary or subcontractor prior to submitting a Letter of Interest. Firms which are not providing engineering services need not be registered with the North Carolina Board of Examiners for Engineers and Surveyors. Some of the services being solicited may not require a license. It is the responsibility of each firm to adhere to all laws of the State of North Carolina.

The firm must have the financial ability to undertake the work and assume the liability. The selected firm(s) will be required to furnish proof of Professional Liability insurance coverage in the minimum amount of \$1,000,000.00. The firm(s) must have an adequate accounting system to identify costs chargeable to the project.

1.2 Introduction

The purpose of this project is to provide planning and design for the completion of trail segments the Marvin Loop Trial. As a rapidly growing municipality adjacent to Charlotte, Marvin needs to prioritize developing a safe and interconnected greenway system that promotes safe non-vehicular travel and a sense of community.

As Marvin has grown, the Village has faced many challenges, the most daunting being increased traffic. Due to the rapid growth of neighboring municipalities, the Village of Marvin has experienced a continual growth in vehicular traffic. This increased traffic has left residents vulnerable, as many residents walk alongside roadways and in drainage ditches due to the lack of sidewalks and walking paths.

The Marvin Loop Trail segment in the scope of our proposal is the cornerstone of the Marvin Greenway network, which eventually will provide safe greenway access between all neighborhoods in Marvin and all destinations in and around Marvin, as well as residents of Charlotte, Waxhaw, Weddington, and beyond.

The development of our greenway system and the completion of the Marvin Loop Trail will be integral to providing a pedestrian connection to the Marvin Heritage District, a planned mixed-use downtown district on New Town Road between Marvin Road and Marvin School Road. This one trail segment in the scope of this grant application will provide interconnectivity between the proposed district, multiple neighborhoods, multiple churches, and Marvin Elementary School. The system will provide safe avenues of travel to promote a greater sense of community as well as healthy and active lifestyles.

1.3 **Project Overview**

The **Marvin Loop** aims to advance the implementation of the adopted Village of Marvin Parks and Greenways Master Plan **and** expand the trail alignment to include connections to existing and planned greenway trials within the Village and surrounding communities.

The Marvin Loop Trail follows New Town, Marvin School, Joe Kerr, and Marvin Roads. Approximately 40% of the Loop is complete to date.

Please see **Exhibit A** for maps of for the scope of services. The attached map indicates the general location of the entire trail. Design services for this LOI are for the portion of the Marvin Loop Trail from section 1 to section 6 (inclusive), as shown on the attached map. This phase of the Marvin Loop is for pedestrian improvements along SR 3635 (Marvin Road) at Saddle Avenue to SR 1316 (Marvin School Road) at Yellow Jasmine Lane.

1.4 Scope of Work

To provide professional engineering design services for the portion of the Marvin Loop Trail from section 1 to section 6 (inclusive), as shown on the attached map. This phase of the Marvin Loop is for pedestrian improvements along SR 3635 (Marvin Road) at Saddle Avenue to SR 1316 (Marvin School Road) at Yellow Jasmine Lane.

Professional Services Associated with Preliminary Engineering: Conceptual plans, planning or environmental studies, preliminary design, final design, and all other related design work necessary to advance a project to physical construction.

Examples include preparation of surveys, environmental documents, plans, specifications, and estimates, and construction proposals. For projects that do not result in physical construction, this includes activities that are necessary for the development or implementation of the project. Examples include developing or preparing safety programs, feasibility studies, conceptual studies, or other planning documents.

Easements and/or rights-of-way will be assessed and mapped by the selected firm (herein referred to as the ENGINEER). Easements and/or rights-of-way needed for the project are to be acquired and processed by the Village and/or NCDOT

Preliminary Design Services:

ENGINEER shall complete all surveying work.

ENGINEER shall complete all necessary environmental documents for the project.

ENGINEER shall provide preliminary conditions assessment of the proposed trail and provide services related to any required permits, geotechnical investigations, or other services required during the preliminary stage of the project.

ENGINEER shall provide sketches and drawings which illustrate the preliminary design of the project and meet with the Village, NCDOT and the majority of adjacent property owners, and the general public to review the preliminary design.

ENGINEER shall prepare an opinion of construction cost. Prepare preliminary copy of the Technical Specifications.

ENGINEER shall prepare Final plans for Construction that are reviewed and approved by the Village and NCDOT.

Each Proposer is solely responsible for the delivery of the Letter of Interest and accepts all risks of late delivery regardless of fault. You may request a red receipt. In addition, Proposers accept all risks if file is corrupted, incorrect, incomplete, or not attached. Any LOI received after the due date and time for LOI submissions, regardless of the mode of delivery, shall not be considered.

1.6 <u>Selection Criteria and Process</u>

Firms will not be considered unless the following minimum qualifications are met:

- Firm must be properly registered with the Office of the Secretary of State of North Carolina (if applicable); and
- The primary and any subconsultant firms(s) shall be prequalified by North Carolina Department of Transportation (NCDOT) to perform the required services. The firm should be prequalified with NCDOT for Work Codes/Discipline Codes as identified above.

Selection criteria are listed below in descending order of importance:

- **Criteria Number 1 (25%):** Qualifications and recent relevant experience of firm and Key team members experience in providing planning services;
- Criteria Number 2 (25%): Project understanding, methodology and approach;
- Criteria Number 3 (25%): Understanding of local multi-modal initiatives; and
- Criteria Number 4 (25%): Demonstrated experience with federal and/or state funds and processes.

The Village will appoint a selection committee whose responsibilities will include performing independent technical review of each LOI and making selection recommendations based on the selection criteria provided above. Selections will focus on identifying the relative strengths, weaknesses, deficiencies and risks associated with each LOI. Interviews with firms may be held at the option of the selection committee. The Village reserves the right to obtain clarification or additional information with any firm.

The Village reserves the sole right to select the most qualified consultant(s) on the basis of best overall RFLOI(s) that is most advantageous to the Village. Firms that submit RFLOIs will be notified of the selection results. Final approval of any selected firm is subject to the approval of Village Board and/or Village officials.

1.7 RFLOI Format

Each Letter of Interest package should consist of a cover letter, responses to the specific inquiries in Section 1.7 below, and a set of completed Forms as requested in 1.8 below.

RFLOIs are limited to a maximum of <u>10</u> numbered, printed pages. Cover letters, required forms, resumes, covers, sub-tabs and dividers do not count toward the page limit. Non-conforming submissions may be removed from consideration at the sole discretion of the Village.

1.8 SUBMISSION ORGANIZATION AND INFORMATION REQUIREMENTS

Chapter 1 - <u>Introduction</u>

The Introduction should demonstrate the consultant's overall qualifications to fulfill the requirements of the scope of work and should contain the following elements of information:

- Statement of whether firm is on register;
- Date of most recent private engineering firm qualification;
- Statement regarding firm's(') possible conflict of interest for the work; and
- Summation of information contained in the letter of interest.

Chapter 2 - Team Qualifications

This chapter should elaborate on the general information presented in the introduction, to establish the credentials and experience of the consultant to undertake this type of effort. The following must be included:

- Identify <u>recent</u>, similar projects the firm, acting as the prime contractor, has conducted which demonstrates its ability to conduct and manage the project. Provide a synopsis of each project and include the date completed, and contact person.
- 2. If subconsultants are involved, provide corresponding information describing their qualifications as requested in bullet number 1 above.

Chapter 3 - <u>Team Experience</u>

This chapter must provide the names, classifications, and location of the firm's North Carolina employees and resources to be assigned to the advertised work; and the professional credentials and experience of the persons assigned to the project, along with any unique qualifications of key personnel. Although standard personnel resumes may be included, identify pertinent team experience to be applied to this project. Specifically, the Department is interested in the experience, expertise, and total quality of the consultant's proposed team. If principals of the firm will not be actively involved in the study/contract/project, do not list them. The submittal shall clearly indicate the Consultant's Project Manager, other key Team Members and his/her qualifications for the proposed work. Also, include the team's organization chart for the Project / Plan. A Capacity Chart / Graph (available work force) should also be included. Any other pertinent information should also be listed in this section.

3.1 Government-Wide Debarment and Suspension (Non-Procurement)

The Consultant is required to verify that neither it, nor its principals (as defined at 49 CFR 29.995) or affiliates (as defined at 49 CFR 29.905) is excluded or disqualified as defined at 49 CFR 29.940 and 29.945.

The Consultant is required to comply with 49 CFR 29, Subpart C and must include the requirement to comply with 49 CFR 29, Subpart C in any lower tier covered transaction in which it enters. By signing and submitting its SOQ, the Consultant certifies as follows:

The certification in this clause is a material representation of fact relied upon by the City. The Company represents and warrants that in its performance under the Contract, the Company shall comply with section 6002 of the Solid Waste Disposal Act, as amended by the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act. The requirements of Section 6002 include procuring only items designated in guidelines of the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) at 40 CFR Part 247 that contain the highest percentage of recovered materials practicable, consistent with maintaining a satisfactory level of competition, where the purchase price of the item exceeds \$10,000 or the value of the quantity acquired during the preceding fiscal year exceeded \$10,000; procuring solid waste management services in a manner that maximizes energy and resource recovery; and establishing an affirmative procurement program for procurement of recovered materials identified in the EPA guidelines.

3.11 Clean Air Act and Federal Water Pollution Control Act



Each greenway recommendation is designated as either a Spine (S) or Connector (C) Trail. The Spine Trail serves as the backbone of the larger greenway network. Connector Trails are routes that connect the Spine Trail to other key assets. A description for each proposed trail is subsequently provided, including the recommended trail type and estimate of probable cost. Cost estimates are projected to account for increased costs of construction and inflation in the future. An overview of the greenway system is provided on Map 4 (see page right).


