



What is a Discretionary Grant?

- Discretionary Grants are awarded to applicants through a competitive process.
- Most eligible applicants are state, tribal and local governments.
- Although "grant" implies that the funding is available up front, the program works on a cost-reimbursement basis.

Grant Programs

- ➤ BUILD, formerly RAISE and TIGER
- > MPDG, which includes RURAL, INFRA, and MEGA
- Culvert AOP (Aquatic Organism Passage)
- Wildlife Crossings
- Bridge or BIP (Bridge Investment Program)
- ➤ RCP (Reconnecting Communities Program)
- NSFLTP (National Significant Federal Lands and Tribal Projects)
- NSBP (National Scenic Byways Program)

NOT Discretionary Grant Programs - Federal Core Program Funding

Federal surface transportation program sub-allocations to urbanized areas >200K population –"Direct Allocation (DA)"

- Surface Transportation Block Grant Program (BG)
 - Facility must be classified on Federal-aid system as a collector or higher
- Transportation Alternatives (TA) Program
 - Alternative transportation modes / solutions
- Carbon Reduction (CRP) Program new with IIJA

Congestion Mitigation / Air Quality (CMAQ)

NCDOT sub-allocates a portion to MPOs, RPOs in eligible counties

Strategic Transportation Initiatives – generally Transportation Alternative Program (TA) – allocated through the Prioritization process

Grants Pursuit (Pre-award)



- Applicant registers on <u>SAM.gov</u> and <u>Grants.gov</u> in advance* of application.

 *registration is not immediate
- Applicant searches for <u>USDOT grants</u> on Grants.gov where all USDOT grants are posted with a Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) outlining program eligibility criteria and requirements.
- Applicant applies for funding for a project that meets program requirements before the end of the application window.
- 4 applications and selects programs to award funding based on the stated criteria in the NOFO.



Registration

- Unique Entity Identifier (UEI)
- > Grants.gov registration to apply
- Local Governments need to have their own registration

- > Coordination with NCDOT and Letters of Support

Grants Pursuit - Pre-Award

Local Evaluation of Project and Commitment

- Is there a clearly defined scope or does the project make sense?
- Who owns the facility being improved? Locally owned? State owned?
- Q Will we, as the local, deliver the project or will NCDOT need to deliver?
- Does the local government have the staff with adequate skills to administer a project?
- Is there a good estimate of the Project? Identified sources of funding that the local controls? Is the funding flexible as to when it can be used?
- Q What happens if the award is reduced from what was requested? Gap funding?
- Q What happens if the actual costs exceed the estimated budget? Where will the additional funding come from?





Submitted Grant Application

- Review by Federal Agency
- > Continuing Coordination
- > Debriefing









Grants Award

- > Award Notification Full Award
- > Award Notification Reduced Award



Just because an award is announced, work cannot begin on a project.



Programming in the TIP and the STIP



- Grants Agreements must be executed before work is performed
- Kickoff Meeting with FHWA and USDOT

- ➤ Terms and Conditions (T&C)
- **Exhibits**



Grants Agreements (local governments)

- Direct Recipient
- > Subrecipient



Patience goes a long way...

- ➤ Timing between notification of grant award and execution of agreement can be lengthy.
- Local funding/priorities must be flexible to meet the timing of the grant.





- 8 USDOT monitors the project's progress and provides technical assistance and customer support to grantees as needed.
- Grantee reports progress to USDOT throughout the project lifecycle through applicable Project Progress Reports (PPRs) and Federal Financial Reports (SF-425s) as required by USDOT.

10 Grantee completes all closeout requirements and submits final financial and technical reports.

Grants Reporting

- > Pre-quarterly
- > Post-quarterly
- ☐ Quarter 1 January-March
- ☐ Quarter 2 April-June
- ☐ Quarter 3 July-September
- ☐ Quarter 4 October-December

- Financial Reporting







- > Scope
- > Funding
- > Schedule



Respect the Deadlines




- ➤ Obligation deadline is when all the grant funds must be obligated. This date is non-negotiable. It's usually identified in the NOFO.
- Expenditure Deadline is when all the grant funds must be expended. This date might be able to be extended, depending on the progress of your project.



How Will NCDOT Help?

For Subrecipient partners:

- Attend kickoff meeting with awardee and FHWA
- Review draft agreement and provide recommendations
- Prepare two-party agreement for reimbursement
- Establish a meeting schedule among any relevant parties
- Prioritize reviews of grant projects for a municipality
- Provide assistance with reporting
- Assist with development of amendments




