ORD SERVICE PORTAL: CADD Support & Knowledge Base




NCDOT's **ORD SERVICE PORTAL** is now available (currently only for NCDOT staff) and can be reached at the following **link**. The portal is a new means of CADD support and ORD knowledge Base development, intended to replace legacy e-mail support and some website functionality.

Digital Delivery and 3D Modeling with ORD will come with challenges and many questions as the Department transitions to designing in the new platform. The Knowledge Base system will provide a searchable open forum where questions and responses will be captured. Users can search the system for articles and previous Q&A's about their CADD related questions. If no answers are found, questions can be submitted as a "support ticket" which will be answered and posted to the Q&A forum ... building the knowledgebase for everyone!

The system is currently only available for NCDOT staff. However, availability for our consultant partners will be coming soon.


An update to the Roadway Design Manual will be released at the end of May to address comments and feedback received after the previous update in November 2023.

One major change to the May 2024 update is the incorporation of the updated Roadway Submittal Guidelines into Chapter 13. The Roadway Submittal Guidelines will supersede the October 2015 "Guidelines to be Used by Consultants for Producing Roadway Plans". Other additions to the RDM are the addition of Section 4.9.1 Median Slopes and 9.4.1 Flyover Ramps. Other changes will be detailed in the RDM redlines which will be available on the website once the update is released.

Previous versions of the manual are now available by using the appropriate dropdown menu. Using the RDM redlines drop down menu will allow you to see the highlighted list of what was changed followed by a marked up version showing the exact changes. A copy of the Legacy Roadway Design Manual continues to be provided.

Anyone with questions or comments about the manual's content are encouraged to use the Contact Us Form link on the Roadway Design Manual website. Announcements regarding updates to the Roadway Design Manual content will be distributed through a variety of means, including but not limited to the Project Delivery Newsletter, ACEC, and NCLUG. Constructability Review Program and Post Construction Assessment Program



Value Management offers multiple opportunities to find ways to reduce risk, ease constructability challenges, reduce costs, and enhance projects across the state. Two of these opportunities are Constructability Reviews and Post Construction Assessments. A Constructability Review brings designers, construction, and contractors to the same table to discuss the project and find ways to ease constructability challenges on the project. These meetings also help reduce risks, enhance designs, and reduce costs. The Post Construction Assessments are completed when the construction of the project is completed. These meetings

bring our planners, designers, construction, and maintenance teams together with the project contractor to discuss what went well on the project, best practices and lessons learned. These discussions provide an opportunity to incorporate things learned from past projects into future designs. 
Roadway Design Unit: Website Redesign
