



Project History/Linkage to Other Plans

The 2014 Carteret County CTP includes this road as major thoroughfare needs improvement. This project is listed in SPOT (H191119). This project recommendation is directly related to the Lake Road and Nine Foot Road Improvements (CART40023-H and CART40012-H).


