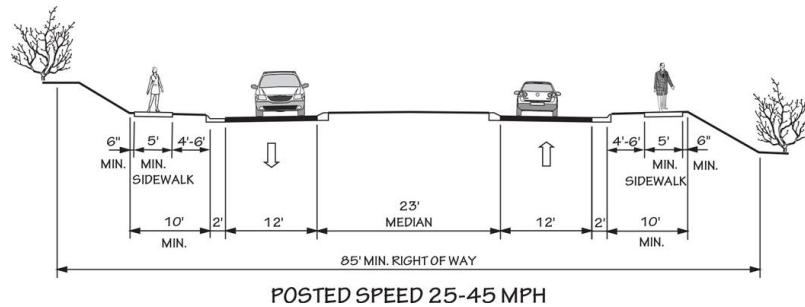

**Project History/Linkage to Other Plans**

This roadway is a major connector between routes NC 24 and US 70. This project was included as a minor thoroughfare needs improvement project in the 2014 Carteret County CTP. It was submitted in SPOT 7.0 as H230553.

This project is directly related to the Mid Island Bridge over Bogue Sound project (CART40021-H, H190093). R-3437 US 70-NC 101 connector project is in close proximity to the proposed SR-1141 (Hibbs Rd) Improvements project. R-3437 was proposed in previous STIP plans. The current 2024-2033 STIP does not include R-3437.

CTP Goal Analysis**Goals and Objectives Survey**

The vision for Carteret County is to have a safe, diverse, efficient, integrated, and environmentally sensitive and sustainable multi-modal transportation system for its residents, visitors, and businesses. This Carteret County CTP survey was open from March 1st, 2023 to April 30th, 2023 and there was an English and Spanish version of the survey. There were a total of 439 participants and 1,387 comments as pins on the map were received. This project received 9 comments as pins during the online survey. The main concerns were congestion, maintenance, and bicycle and pedestrian

needs.

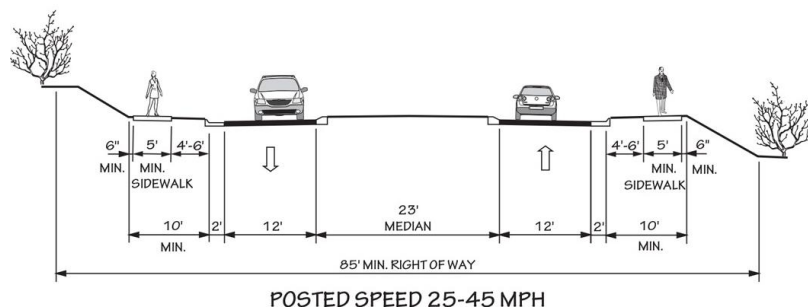
