

RESOLUTION ADOPTING THE  
CARTERET COUNTY COMPREHENSIVE TRANSPORTATION PLAN  
FOR THE TOWN OF  
BEAUFORT, NORTH CAROLINA

**WHEREAS**, Carteret County, the municipalities within Carteret County, the NCDOT Transportation Planning Branch and the Down East RPO actively worked to develop a transportation plan for Carteret County and the municipalities; and

**WHEREAS**, the County and Towns and the Department of Transportation are directed by North Carolina General Statutes 136-66.2 to reach agreement for a highway, transit, bicycle, and pedestrian systems that will serve present and anticipated volumes of traffic in and around the county; and

**WHEREAS**, it is recognized that the proper movement of traffic, the provision of transit opportunities, and the safety of bicycle and pedestrians within and through the town of Beaufort is highly desirable element of the comprehensive plan for the orderly growth and development of the town; and

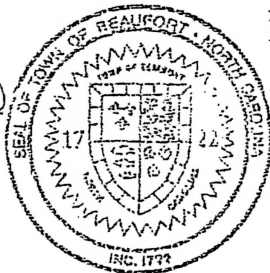
**WHEREAS**, after full study of the plan, the town Commissioners of Beaufort feel it to be in the best interests of Beaufort to adopt the plan elements that are within the town limits pursuant to General Statutes 136-66.2;

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, That the Carteret County Comprehensive Transportation Plan as shown on text and maps dated May 30, 2012 be approved and adopted as a guide in the development of the highway, transit, bicycle, and pedestrian systems and the same is hereby recommended to the North Carolina Department of Transportation for its subsequent adoption:
