




The Numbers Game

- Survey distributed in various ways posted on websites, hard copies distributed in the mail, notices in newsletters, etc.
- Approximately 100 hard copy surveys received, all were entered into the online survey
- Received 1,429 responses to the survey, the most for a CTP across the state
- People in Carteret county have something to say about transportation!








More Demographics


- The majority of households (686) had two people in the household
- The majority contained 2 drivers (873). Seven households had zero drivers (7)
- Eight households had zero vehicles, but the majority of households had two vehicles (641)



Crash Concerns

- 67.2% responded that they are concerned about crashes
 - Responses mostly reflected the main highways, such as US 70, NC 24, NC 101, many residential roads, lots of complains about traffic violations (speeding, etc.)
 826 responses
- 26.5% responded that they are concerned with truck traffic
 - Along US 70 and NC 101, reasons include speeding, trucks in residential areas. 314 responses






Congestion and Flooding

- ▶ 1081 respondents to the question re: which roads are most likely to be congested
 - Not too many surprises in the responses- US 70, NC 58, Bridges St., the intersection of NC 24 and NC 58, and Arendell St.
- 985 respondents to the question re: their experience of flooding on roadways
 - More then half indicated they have not experienced travel delays (548). Most all other indicate local roads and only after a storm


Roadways to Be Better Connected

- 676 respondents. Diverse responses to this question.
 - All major highways were mentioned, better connection to Down East, improvement of US 70, create more bike paths
 - Improvements to NC 101, mention of a bridge to Pine Knoll Shores (PKS), support for the Gallants Channel Bridge project




Sidewalks and Off-Road Trails

- People see to be in favor of building additional sidewalks-508 written responses
- ▼ The same can be said for off-road trails for walking and biking. 419 written responses




On-Road and Buses

- There is slightly less support for on-road facilities, but still seem important to the respondents (469 written responses)
- Bus service has less than 50% support but the 269 written responses were in favor



Rail and Park-and-Ride

- responses were mainly to and from the major cities such as Raleigh, Charlotte, etc. There were 256 written responses
- Park-and-Ride lots did not receive much support, 171 written responses



General Responses on How to Improve Transportation

- > 728 written responses
- Many comments about a desire to increase the availability of transportation choice- more public transportation, bike lanes and sidewalks
- Reminder to not forget the communities
 Down East need viable transportation options as well
- Multiple comments on adding a third bridge

General Responses on How to Improve Transportation

- > Support for by-pass projects
- > Dislike of the improvements on 70 in Newport
- Interest in regional connections (New Bern, Jacksonville, Raleigh)
- Limit sprawl-type development
- Better maintenance of existing roads before building new roads
- Enforcement of existing traffic laws

Concerns about Crashes at Certain Locations

- > 826 Written Responses
- Overall concern about speeding, talking on the phone, distracted driving
- > Taylor Notion Rd. and Hwy 58, even with improvements that have been done
- Hwy 24 and Hwy 58 intersection during tourist season and because of development
- Down East intersections (Straight Rd., Harkers Island, Gillikin, etc.)

Concerns about Crashes at Certain Locations

- Hwy 101 at Old Wineberry and narrow in general with lots of truck traffic
- > Old Hwy 70 (East Chatham) and Hwy 70
- > The intersection of Hwy 101 and 70
- The Belk/TJ Maxx shopping center intersection on 70 in Morehead City
- Continued comments for increased bicycle and pedestrian safety with facilities

Next Steps

- Continue to analyze the over 3,000 written responses
- Present to other elected bodies
- Integrate into the Carteret County CTP as we move forward with recommendations for roadways, public transit, bicycle, and pedestrian facilities
