

The proposal is to widen from 2 Lane Undivided to 4B - 4 Lane Divided (23' Raised Median) with Paved Shoulders and Sidewalks.



H090657-A project received 7 comments during the survey period. Comments indicated the need of roadway improvements related to school parking, median and bicycle lanes. The Survey was launched on August 12, 2020 and closed on September 28, 2020. There was an English and Spanish version of the survey. A total of 228 participants created 530 comments / suggestions on the map of Cumberland County / FAMPO.


