

Identified Need

Wayside Rd (SR 1305) is projected to be over capacity by year 2045. Improvements are needed to accommodate projected traffic volumes such that a minimum LOS D can be achieved.

Recommendation

Project U-5753 proposes to widen and extend SR 1305 (Wayside Road), US 401 to Plank Road, and SR 1418 (Lindsay Road), US 401 to SR 1406. The proposed typical section consists of a four-lane divided section with a raised grass median up to 23 feet in width and shoulder section.



Project History/Linkage to Other Plans

U-5858 and U-5707 are being developed in coordination with STIP U-5857, U-5798, the Widening of SR 1102/SR 1420 (Gillis Hill Road) and U-5753, the Widening of SR 1305 (Wayside Road) and SR 1418 (Lindsay Road).

The proposed projects are included in the approved 2020-2029 North Carolina State Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) with right-of-way acquisition for both projects scheduled for Fiscal Year (FY) 2022 and construction scheduled for FY 2024.

The purpose of this project is to reduce congestion, reduce travel time, and improve safety along this facility. U-5753 project received no comments during the survey period. The Survey was launched on August 12, 2020 and closed on September 28, 2020. There was an English and Spanish version of the survey. A total of 228 participants created 530 comments / suggestions on the map of Cumberland County / FAMPO.


