

Identified Need

Rockfish Road/ Stoney Point Road (SR 1112) is projected to be over capacity by 2045. Improvements are needed to accommodate projected traffic volumes such that a minimum LOS D can be achieved.

Recommendation

The proposal is to widen from 2 Lane Undivided to 4F - 4 Lane Divided (17'-6" Raised Median) with Curb & Gutter, Bike Lanes, and Sidewalks



Project History/Linkage to Other Plans

Project history

SR 1112 (Stoney Point Road/Rockfish Road) is functionally classified as a minor arterial and has a posted speed limit varying between 55 miles per hour in the west and 35 to 45 miles per hour in the east. The project is listed in the 2020-2029 NCDOT State Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) (September 2019) as project U-6072A with right of way in 2029.

Linkage to Other Plans

The proposed project is related to the TIP U-4709, Rockfish Road widening project. The proposed project is consistent with local and regional development goals and plans, such as the FAMPO 2045 MTP, adopted in 2019. It was also part of NCDOT Spot 5.0

CTP Goal Analysis

Vision, Goals, & Objectives

The purpose of this project is to reduce congestion, reduce travel time, and improve safety along this facility. The Cumberland County / FAMPO CTP Goals include focusing on growth around established municipalities, infrastructure, and strategic nodes while encouraging safe, multi-modal transportation options with adequate connectivity. Additionally Cumberland County / FAMPO CTP goals strive to protect, preserve, and enhance environmental features and open space opportunities in conjunction with recognizing the strategic importance of military installations within and adjacent to the community and promoting economic development growth through transportation and planning means.

Goals & Objectives Survey

U-6072A project received 22 comments during the survey period. Comments emphasized the need for transit, bicycle, and pedestrian accommodations, and to address congestion. The Survey was launched on August

12, 2020 and closed on September 28, 2020. There was an English and Spanish version of the survey. A total of 228 participants created 530 comments / suggestions on the map of Cumberland County / FAMPO.


