

Identified Need

Rockfish Road (SR 1112) is projected to be over capacity by 2045. Improvements are needed to accommodate projected traffic volumes such that a minimum LOS D can be achieved.

Recommendation

The proposal is to widen from 2 Lane Undivided to 4J - 4 Lane Divided (23' Raised Median) with Curb & Gutter, Bike Lanes, and Sidewalks. Widening the road will help address the capacity issue.



Project History/Linkage to Other Plans

Project history

The NCDOT proposes to improve Rockfish Road (SR 1112), currently a two-lane roadway, to a multi-lane, median-divided roadway from just west of Labonte Drive to just east of Golfview Road (SR 1115) in the Town of Hope Mills.

The project vicinity is comprised primarily of established, medium to high density residential development, with some commercial development and religious institutions towards the west approaching Notblake Road, which intersects with Rockfish Road. Rockfish Road has a functional classification of Minor Arterial with a speed limit of 35 miles per hour (mph).

The project is listed in the 2020-2029 NCDOT State Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) (September 2019) as project U-6072B with right of way and construction both listed as unfunded (implementation in future years).

Linkage to Other Plans

The proposed project related to the TIP U-4709, Rockfish Road widening project.

The proposed project is consistent with local and regional development goals and plans, such as the FAMPO 2045 MTP, adopted in 2019. It was also part of NCDOT Spot 5.0

CTP Goal Analysis

Vision, Goals, & Objectives

The purpose of this project is to reduce congestion, reduce travel time, and improve safety along this facility. The Cumberland County / FAMPO CTP Goals include focusing on growth around established municipalities, infrastructure, and strategic nodes while encouraging safe, multi-modal transportation options with adequate connectivity. Additionally Cumberland County / FAMPO

CTP goals strive to protect, preserve, and enhance environmental features and open space opportunities in conjunction with recognizing the strategic importance of military installations within and adjacent to the community and promoting economic development growth through transportation and planning means.

Goals & Objectives Survey

U-6072B project received 5 comments during the survey period. Comments emphasized the need for bicycle and pedestrian accommodations. The Survey was launched on August 12, 2020 and closed on September 28, 2020. There was an English and Spanish version of the survey. A total of 228 participants created 530 comments / suggestions on the map of Cumberland County / FAMPO.


