2. Draft Elements. The future transportation system will....

- Provide safe access for travelers without personal automobiles (bicycle, pedestrian, and public transit).
- Provide a safe and intuitive transportation system that is comfortable for all travelers to navigate, including teens, elderly, disabled, locals, tourists, or freight providers.
- Maintain mobility and efficiency of higher-speed routes into and out of the county.
- Manage access to property while maintaining mobility and minimizing congestion.
- Support growth in the local economy by building communities that are attractive to young families and entrepreneurs while enhancing outdoor recreation tourism opportunities.
- Improve health outcomes by providing active transportation options.
- Promote resiliency by improving road segments that are vulnerable to flooding and landslides; also provide adequate detour routes in the event of road closures.
- Incorporate flexibility to embrace emerging technologies such as autonomous vehicles, drones, and ride-hailing applications.
- Eliminate fatal crashes (adopt Vision Zero principles).

5. Refined Vision Statements for Steering Committee Feedback

The following two refined Draft Vision Statements were sent to the Steering Committee for feedback via a Google Form:

<u>VISION 1</u>: Macon County's transportation network is safe, efficient, reliable, and accessible - effectively serving the mobility needs of local residents, visitors, and freight providers. Our transportation system supports economic development opportunities, promotes healthy and active communities, adapts to emerging technologies, and preserves the natural beauty and rural character of our county.

<u>VISION 2</u>: Macon County has a safe and reliable multi-modal transportation network that accommodates all users and connects our people with goods and services. This transportation system supports economic development opportunities while also preserving the natural beauty and rural character of our county.

Overall, five committee members preferred Vision 2 and three preferred Vision 1. The following comments were collected:

- I like Vision 2 because it is concise :)
- I like Vision 2 because it is more compact. The only thing I think that would be good to add is "promotes healthy and active communities" or similar verbiage.
- I like version 1 but my issue with both as they imply that our road system has no flaws and is perfect. Which I don't believe is the mission of the plan. I think we should add to beginning of which ever one is picked this statement "This plan is striving for a". Or something in that realm.
- Prefer Vision 1 but add "is becoming safer through engineering".

5. Final Draft Vision Statement

Macon County Comprehensive Plan:

To preserve the integrity of our mountain heritage, welfare of the citizens will be maximized, and our natural environments will continue to flourish, and economic vitality will be sustained for current and future generations.

Macon County CTP 2012
