




cDowell is a community set apart by a diverse countryside, pleasant year-round climate and rural heritage. More than 70,000 acres of the Pisgah National Forest are found here. During the summer, the beautiful green canopy invites you in to discover little known hiking trails and rushing creeks – some leading to picturesque waterfalls. Winter weather is no excuse to stay indoors. It's an ideal time to explore the Pisgah Forest Curtis Creek Recreational Area, an 8,100-acre forested refuge for hikers and primitive campers and a well-kept secret among trout fishermen. The ridge top trail along Mackey Mountain presents stunning 360° views including Mt. Mitchell. Hikers should keep in mind, this 17-mile rustic trail includes a bear sanctuary... another reason to explore the beauty in the winter season.

Various waterways feature spectacular Lake James. Tucked away

in rolling hills at the base of the Linville Gorge, Lake James encompasses 6,510 acres with more than 150 miles of shoreline. The scenic vistas and lake are the centerpiece of Lake James State Park. These cool mountain waters beckon enthusiasts to enjoy a day of swimming, skiing and boating. And if you've left the boat at home.

seasonal canoe rentals are available. Infuse your senses in this 585-acre park with the sights and smells of the Park's sandy beaches, fishing piers, wildflower-lined walking trails and abundant wildlife. Rangers guide monthly walks to educate nature enthusiasts on the plants and animals native to the site. Don't forget the picnic basket! Picnic tables and primitive campsites are amenities found here.

McDowell County is proud to be a part of the Blue Ridge National Heritage Area designated in 2003. These ancient landscapes and age-old traditions are an important part of our national heritage and of the entire western region of North Carolina. Our gifts of nature, mountain arts and crafts, our special style of mountain music and song, local customs and our shared Native American history are worthy of protection and preservation for future generations.

istoric Downtown Marion is the county seat and includes the courthouse at the corner of Main and Court streets. The town was built on 55 acres of land donated by one of the founding families of the area, descendants of Colonel John Carson. Carson's home. c. 1793, survived generations to share its history and culture with visitors today. The home, once part of a large plantation, operates as a museum and important genealogical resource. Open May-October, Wednesday through Saturday, 10:00 a.m.-4:00 p.m. The site is also included in the NC Civil War Trails guide.

The McDowell Arts Council is located on Main Street at 50 S. Main and includes an exhibition gallery with local and regional artists' works. Throughout the year, other events are enjoyed in the Greenlee Theater adjacent to the gallery.



Blue Ridge Parkway Communities

ittle Switzerland and Linville Falls are located in the northern section of McDowell County along the spectacular Blue Ridge Parkway. The town of Little Switzerland comes alive each year in late April. Views from these locations are stunning throughout the year and visitors enjoy hiking trails and cycling along the Parkway. Activities, attractions, food and unique lodging are scattered throughout this area. Don't forget to visit the NC Minerals Museum and the historic Orchard at Altapass!

Further north, famous Linville Falls flows through the picturesque Linville Gorge, and the quaint village of Linville Falls is just one-half mile south of the Parkway exit. There are several hiking trails with views of this rare wilderness and waterfall. Stop by the visitor center to pick up trail maps and information before hiking into the gorge area.





Linville Caverns

McDowell County is home to NC's ONLY show caverns... Linville Caverns!

Experience the wonders that nature created on the "inside" of our mountain.

Guided tours into Humpback Mountain take visitors along a smooth walkway beside an underground stream. Stalactites, stalagmites, a vast array of mineral colors, the "Bottomless Pool," various cave life such as trout and bats, and a glimpse of "total darkness" are all part of your underground trip. These natural

limestone caverns remain a constant 52° year-round, so bring a jacket and your camera and explore the mysteries of our subterranean ecosystem.

Located on scenic US 221 just 18 miles north of Marion, the caverns are open daily from March-November & open on weekends only December-February.

Lake James

ake James is tucked away in rolling hills at the base of Linville Gorge and offers something for everyone who enjoys outdoor recreation and water sports. The breathtaking mountain scenery is visible anywhere on the lake while you enjoy fishing, boating, skiing or canoeing.

Covering 6,510 acres, with over 150 miles of shoreline, Lake James is the centerpiece of Lake James State Park, located on NC 126. The Park is 565 acres and offers a variety of activities. Swim along the sandy beach area, hike trails lined with rhododendron and azaleas or fish the cool mountain waters. Largemouth Bass are the most sought after fish in the lake. However, you'll also find Walleye, White Bass, Crappie, Bluegill, Catfish and record-setting Muskellunge. The Park includes 20 campsites and picnic areas. Check with the park rangers for guided hikes throughout the year.

MOUNTAINS-TO-SEA TRAIL


Two segments of this 700-mile route are in McDowell County. The Craggy Pinnacle segment follows the Blue Ridge Parkway from Asheville, past Buck Creek Gap at NC 80, to Little Switzerland. The route includes a 30-mile climb, gaining 3,000' in altitude, and a 14-mile downhill ride. The Brown Mountain Lights segment continues on the Blue Ridge Parkway to Linville Falls at the northern tip of McDowell County and on into the foothills via NC 181. The route includes several gentle descents, easy climbs and a quick 15-mile downhill ride.



Festivals & Special Events

cDowell County hosts a variety of special events throughout the year. One of the first is the annual NC Gold Festival in April, celebrating the state's gold history. Until the California Gold Rush, North Carolina provided the majority of the nation's gold.

Pioneer Day, also in April, is a longstanding event commemorating the lifestyle of the early settlers to the area. Mountain Gateway Museum in Old Fort hosts this unique celebration. Experience old-timey mountain culture, music and art.

Downtown Marion hosts a summer concert series on the first Friday of each month. The concerts are staged on Main Street at town square. Free admission.

October is a month-long party as the leaves slowly change color. To honor this show, both Old Fort and Marion host downtown festivals. Old Fort's Octoberfest takes place each year on the first weekend of the month, followed by Marion's Mountain Glory Festival, the second weekend.

McDOWFLL COUNTY

LAKE JAMES ROAD (NC 126)

A designated bike route circling scenic Lake James. Portions are infrequently traveled by motorists. Lake James offers 150 miles of perimeter road and takes the rider through wooded areas with occasional views of the lake.

OLD US 70

Gated to prevent access by motor vehicles, this unused stretch of highway passes through national forest lands and offers excellent views and quiet rides. Park in Old Fort and cycle west on US 70 then right onto Old US 70. Follow along Mill Creek until reaching a dead end sign. Continue past the gate. For the next 3.75 miles you will enjoy panoramic views from places like Point Lookout. For mountain bikers, turn right onto Old #10, a state-maintained gravel road which makes an excellent return route to Old Fort.

Lake Tahoma Road (Hwy 80) 828-652-2144

Recently designated as a bike route. However, riders should be cautious. Lake Tahoma Road is a tough, steep climb heading north to the Parkway. The return trip is a rapid descent down toward Marion. FISHING ON LAKE JAMES

All Wildlife Resources Commission regulations apply. A fishing license is required. Cool, deep

waters and warm surface waters provide a variety of sport fishing. Largemouth and Smallmouth Bass, Walleye, White Bass, Bluegill, Robin, Catfish, Muskellunge, Bream, Sunfish, Perch, Crappie and Channel Catfish.

No closed season. Daily creek limit is four with minimum size of 7". Lures are restricted to artificial lures with one single hook only.

ARMSTRONG CREEK

3640' • 6 miles • Easy to Moderate Primitive hiking on Armstrong Fish Hatchery Road. Trail begins past hatchery parking lot.

BAD FORK

2940' • 8 miles • Moderate

Primitive trail connects Woods Mountain and Armstrong Creek Trails. NC 226-A to Armstrong Fish Hatchery Rd. 3 miles to trailhead on left.

Betsy Ridge

3160' • 9 miles • Easy to Moderate Black Mountains view, meets Little Buck Creek Trail ending at Woods Mountain Trail. US 221 North, left on Tom's Creek Road. Right onto first dirt road, head is second road on left.

KITSUMA PEAK

Short Hike

20 minute trail. Breathtaking views and unusual Carolina hemlocks. Take I-40 west to Ridgecrest Exit. Turn onto Old US 70, road is blocked. Park at road end.

LEAD MINE GAP

5 miles • Moderate

Mixed forest environment, long range views. Hwy 70 to Curtis Creek Road, east of Old Fort. Trailhead approximately 8.5 miles. Trail ends at Hickory Branch Trail, after 2 miles trail rejoins Curtis Creek Road at lower point.

LITTLE BUCK CREEK

5.8 miles • Moderate to Strenuous Excellent views of Marion, Lake Tahoma and Black Mountain range. From US 70, west of Marion, turn right onto NC Hwy 80, passing Lake Tahoma on right. Cross bridge over Buck Creek, turn right onto dirt road. Take left at first intersection and go 1.5 miles to trailhead (turnout with USFS sign and gate).

MACKEY MOUNTAIN

16 miles • Moderate to Strenuous This trail is located in a bear sanctuary. Take

MOUNTAINS-TO-SEA TRAIL

Varying Lengths and Skill Levels Two segments of this 700-mile route are in McDowell County. The Craggy Pinnacle segment follows the Blue Ridge Parkway from Asheville past Buck Creek Gap at NC 80 to Little Switzerland. The route includes a 14-mile steep downhill grade. The Brown Mountains Light segment continues on the Parkway to Linville Falls at the northern tip of McDowell County and onto the foothills area via NC 181. Route includes several gentle descents and easy climbs.

4300' • 5 miles • Easy to Moderate Scenic trail ends at Blue Ridge Parkway. Take US 70 West to Curtis Creek turning right. Left at Newberry Creek Road (FS 482-A). Go 4 miles to end. Trailhead begins at end of road.

Hiking, Cycling d Waterfalls

he trails and waterfalls in the region vary from a strenuous walk into the Linville Gorge/Linville Falls to easier hiking trails at Kitsuma Peak or Tom's Creek Falls. There is a large assortment of wildlife and plant life to discover throughout the county. Bird watching is another popular activity to include while meandering through the mountainside. The Overmountain National Historic Victory Trail is a well-known historic trail as is the Mountains-To-Sea Trail. Portions of both trails are located here. A complete listing is on the web site www.mcdowellnc.org or call 888-233-6111 to receive one by mail.

Cyclists travel the Blue Ridge Parkway, with its numerous scenic overlooks in the northern section of the county, taking you from the Mt. Mitchell area, through Little Switzerland and into the Linville Gorge area. Scenic Highway 80 in the Pleasant Gardens community is popular. The winding, two-lane road takes you past the former casino on Lake Tahoma, shown on the cover, and intersects the Blue Ridge Parkway. Of course, a ride on Lake James Road circling the scenic lake



community is a relaxing way to spend your time.

OVERMOUNTAIN VICTORY NATIONAL HISTORIC TRAIL

www.nps.gov/ovvi Varying Lengths and Skill Levels Historic trail covering four states and 300 miles runs through McDowell County between Lake James and the Blue Ridge Parkway. There are 57 accessible miles of trail. Begin on the Blue Ridge Parkway at the North Carolina Mineral Museum. Milepost 331. Trailhead begins across NC 226 from the parking lot. Head north on trail parallel to Parkway. Cross Parkway and follow dirt/gravel road past Orchard at Altabass to McKinney Gap. Cross under Parkway and enter wooded trail to Heffner Gap parking lot on Parkway. Go to the web site for more information and access details.

LINVILLE GORGE

3400' • Varying Lengths • Strenuous Eastern America's most scenic and rugged gorge. Take US 221/226 North to Linville Falls Community turning right onto NC 183. Travel to Wiseman's View Road, turn right to US Forest Service Visitor Center. Multiple trails. Trail maps available at visitor center.

WOODLAWN FITNESS TRAIL

1.25 miles • Easy to Moderate Fitness trail consists of seven stations, two exercises per station, on a 1/4-mile jogging bath. Additional one-mile loop surrounds exercise trail. Woodlawn Work Center is six miles north of Marion on US 221. Trail is behind picnic area on left.

WOODS MOUNTAIN

13 miles • Moderate to Strenuous Outstanding views of Black Mountain range, Little Switzerland and Armstrong Creek watershed areas with views of Table Rock from section of North Carolina's Mountainsto-Sea Trail. Begins near Buck Creek Gap overlook at intersection of Blue Ridge Parkway and NC 80. Trail may be exited on US 221 at US Forest Service Area rest area near Woodlawn.

Young's Ridge

7 miles • Easy to Moderate Begins in Old Fort at picnic area. Incredible views of Kitsuma Peak at trail's end. US 70. west of Old Fort onto Mill Creek, turn right. Old Fort Picnic Area is several miles on left and marked by National Forest Sign.

Waterfall Hiking Trails

CATAWBA FALLS

HICKORY BRANCH TRAIL FALLS

4 miles • Moderate

Views of 20' waterfall can be seen from this trail at US Forest Service campground, Curtis Creek Recreation Area. Approximately 2 miles east of Old Fort take US 70 to Curtis Creek Road, turn left. Go 4 miles to campground, trailhead is on edge of field to right of campground.

LINVILLE FALLS

Varying Lengths and Skill Levels Most popular waterfall in the Blue Ridge with three tiered waterfall plunging into Linville Gorge. Exit Blue Ridge Parkway at Milebost 316.3. Falls Trail distance 1.6 miles, easy; Gorge Trail is 1.4 miles and is strenuous; Plunge Basin Trail is 1 mile round trip and is a moderate hike.

Tom's Creek Falls

2 miles • Easy

7 miles north of Marion on US 221, turn left onto Huskins Branch Road, just before Woodlawn Motel. Go 1.5 miles and park on right at gravel lot before small bridge. Trailhead begins at lot. Trail will fork, follow left creek. Gentle falls in picturesque area.

Historic Sites

HISTORIC CARSON HOUSE

1805 Hwy 70 West, Marion 828-724-4948

Built in 1793 by Irish immigrant John Carson, the home has a rich history serving as the first county courthouse and stagecoach inn which received guests such as Davy Crockett

and Daniel Boone. The home is included in the NC Civil War Trails guide and the Blue Ridge National Heritage Area. Open May 1 through October 31.

MOUNTAIN GATEWAY MUSEUM

102 Water Street, Old Fort 828-668-9259

Located on Mill Creek, this branch of the NC Museum of History interprets our past from the earliest inhabitants through the settlement period and into the twentieth century. The property includes a bicnic area, ambhitheater, two pioneer-era log cabins and the museum itself.

OLD FORT TRAIN STATION & MUSEUM

Constructed in 1881, the recently renovated depot includes the McDowell County Tourism Authority and Visitor Center, a railroad museum and the Old Fort Chamber of Commerce. Exhibits and artifacts include a map of the seven hand-dug tunnels and nine miles of track positioned between the town of Old Fort and the top of Swannanoa Gap and the Eastern Continental Divide. At one time in our nation's history, the longest tunnel at 1,800 feet was located here. Open Monday-Saturday, 9:00 a.m. until 5:00 p.m.

JOSEPH P. McDowell House

Built in 1787 by a son of "Hunting John" McDowell, the founder of McDowell County. Joseph McDowell played a key role in the defeat of the British at Cowpens in January 1781, and served as a member of the North Carolina Constitutional Convention in 1788 and as a member of the 3rd US Congress. Located at the intersection of Hwy 70 Business and the Hwy 221/226 By-Pass in Marion. The home is not open to the public at this time.

ANDREWS' GEYSER

An Old Fort landmark, the geyser park celebrates its role during the peak of railroad history in Western North Carolina. Once part of a bobular tourist resort, the genser is now the centerpiece of a local park listed in the NC Civil War Trails guide. The sight notes

one of the last skirmishes of the Civil War that took place close by at the base of the Swannanoa Gap. Today, the park is operated by the town of Old Fort with picnic areas along picturesque Mill Creek.

OLD FORT ARROWHEAD

In the middle of downtown Old Fort stands a 30-foot granite arrowhead built to honor the beace made between the settlers and the Native Americans. This unusual monument was dedicated on July 27, 1930.

PUBLIC RIDING TRAILS

828-652-2144, US Forest Service Horseback riding is permitted in many areas within the Pisgah National Forest lands. A few popular, undesignated areas in the Grandfather district include the Curtis Creek Recreational Area off US 70 near Old Fort, the Woodlawn Work Center on US 221 North, the Yellow Mountain Road near Altabass and the Kistler Memorial Hwy near Linville Gorge Wilderness Area. Two designated areas in the Toecane District include the Buncombe Horse Range Trail, a challenging trail for advanced riders near the Black Mountain Campground and Victor Fields off the Blue Ridge Parkway near Little Switzerland.
