1. Welcome

Ivo Dernev with the NCDOT Transportation Branch began the meeting at 2:00 pm and welcomed everyone to the steering committee meeting for the Nash County Comprehensive Transportation Plan (CTP). Mr. Dernev explained the transitioning from Elena Talanker to him and let the group know that he would be completing the Nash County Study and Mrs. Talanker would be assisting in the completion as necessary.

2. Network

Mr. Dernev informed the group that he was working to reduce the study size of the network roads within the study. Mr. Dernev stated that he recommended removing any roads with an AADT less than 1000. It was stated that any road taken out could be added back at a later date if necessary.

3. Growth Rate/Volume to Capacity

Mr. Dernev presented a map showing the growth rates that he was able to develop utilizing past trends within the county. He also stated that this data was used towards developing the future volume to capacity (V/C) ratio projected 25 years into the future. Mr. Dernev also presented the current and future V/C ratio maps.

4. Capacity Definitions

Mr. Dernev discussed the facility type definitions and informed the group that these definitions will. Mrs. Talanker stated that it was the intention of the CTP study to be consistent with neighboring CTP studies in terms of what facility types were used along the county borders. These facility types and recommendations will be discussed further at future meetings.

5. Crash Data

Mr. Dernev presented crash data for Nash County intersections within 100 feet of an intersection occurring from January 1, 2008 to December 31, 2010. This information will be used to determine safety projects that may impact projects and project recommendations.
