

Budget Narrative

The costs and project elements presented in the application are based on conceptual design associated with the 135-foot alternative being considered in the Section 404/NEPA Merger Process. The cost elements summarized in this attachment reflect the breakdown as shown in Standard Form (SF) 424C.

Land, structures, rights-of-way, appraisals, etc.

\$60,000,000

Right-of-way needs have been identified as part of the conceptual design process. Estimates for the cost associated with acquisitions and easements are based on a conservative interpretation of property needs and are subject to refinements in design.

Architectural and engineering fees

\$20,000,000

Final design costs are based on NCDOT experience with projects of a similar scale.

Construction

\$312,320,000

Unit prices were developed considering bid history from the last six to nine months, quantity and scale of each pay item, location, constructability and phasing, and local line-item scarcity (i.e., borrow), as well as market volatility over the last few years caused by inflation, supply chain issues, and labor shortages. Input and pricing information from structures subject-matter experts was considered related to the bridge costs. As prescribed by SF 424C, this category also includes the cost of utility relocation.

Contingency

\$91,980,000

To accommodate any unforeseen changes during the remaining design and construction phases, a contingency level of 23 percent has been applied to anticipated construction costs. Contingency represents 19 percent of all project costs (including project development activities, ROW and utility estimates).
