Hi Buck,

NCDOT, and the ICI/Onsite Mitigation Group in particular, is maintaining a geodatabase of the locations of stream, wetland, buffer, and T&E species mitigation sites throughout the state. We're using the database to store pertinent regulatory information and are displaying the boundaries online in map form here: <http://www.arcgis.com/home/item.html?id=d560dfeb1ea443b299ca7fc68b2506b4>. There are links to the data services through that map description for people that are interested in using the layers locally. We hope to have the appropriate regulatory and legal documents for many sites available online as well so that regulators can view pertinent information with the boundary, though many T&E sites' documents may contain sensitive information that will not be shared.

We currently do not have a way to acknowledge the source of individual boundaries for our online service, but we are keeping records so that we can answer inquiries about particular sites.

I'm still searching for documents related to this site, but from what I understand NCDOT holds an easement over a share of the property. This means it's something we'd like to include in our database.

Hi Sarah,

I'm going to forward your question to Justin Boner from The Conservation Fund - that's who we got the file from. I *believe* (but could be wrong) that they had the P3 boundary surveyed, so I would tend to trust theirs more than the parcel layer.

Reeves-Jackson is a separate tract near P3 that was acquired by TCF recently. It's usually kept in the same property boundary shapefile, so that was just for us to know that it isn't in this file (it isn't part of P3 and doesn't have any NCDOT involvement). For your purposes, you could just delete "...no Reeves Jackson" from the file name - I'm sorry I didn't do that before I sent it!

Justin, I'm attaching what I sent to Rachelle. I actually just noticed this in the metadata: "All information contained with this layer has been developed for use solely by The Conservation Fund and its partners. No other organization or individual may use this data without express written permission from The Conservation Fund."

I'm sorry if I shouldn't have forwarded it to DOT without asking! Could you please just let them (and us) know semi-officially where the boundary came from and what (if anything) it should be used for?

I see there's some metadata associated with it, but it doesn't say much about where the boundaries came from, just that they are "based on data available from local sources." They don't quite match up with the 2010 Tyrrell parcel data we have, but that's about all I have to compare it to. If that's the best we have then that's fine, I just wanted to ask if you had any information. We're trying to add it to our database and want to track where it came from. Also, what does "No Reeves Jackson" refer to?
