

List of Items to Be Included in Consultations

1. Updated Project Commitments
 - It should be verified that each commitment has or will be incorporated into the project design. Reference [Consultation Green Sheet](#) for examples.
 - If any commitments are modified or excluded the reasons for this action will be explained.
 - Any additional environmental commitments should be documented.
2. Coordination with affected State and Federal agencies, local government, and other interested groups following completion of the environmental document should be documented. Provide copies of all written correspondence.
3. A discussion of all major design revisions not previously evaluated since completion of the environmental document. Updated graphics illustrating the revisions may be required for the consultation.
4. The environmental consequences of any revisions should be documented. This includes (but is not limited to):
 - changes in Biological Conclusions for Threatened and Endangered Species previously discussed in the original planning document.
 - Biological Conclusions for T&E Species due to additions to the county list
 - updated T&E surveys and Biological Conclusions due to revisions or outdated surveys.
 - revised Section 7 concurrence letters due to revisions (Section 7 coordination due to revisions must be completed before the consultation can be signed).
 - revisions to Section 4(f), 6(f), or 106 that required additional coordination
 - documentation of discussions with various regulatory agencies to update them on the project.
