

WHO IS NC811

North Carolina 811, is a non-profit organization funded by its member facilities. We take locate information from anyone engaged in excavation activities. An excavator may include contractors, utilities, and homeowners. The information about proposed excavation is transmitted to the member facility owners that provide service in the requested excavation area.

North Carolina 811 does not identify or locate facilities or utility easements. North Carolina 811's role is to notify the facility operators of the proposed excavation and to send positive response information.

DEFINITION OF AN EXCAVATION

§ 87-117. Definitions.

(9) Excavate or excavation. - An operation for the purpose of the movement or removal of earth, rock, or other materials in or on the ground by use of manual or mechanized equipment or by discharge of explosives, including, but not limited to, auguring, backfilling, boring, digging, ditching, drilling, directional drilling, driving, grading, horizontal directional drilling, well drilling, plowing-in, pounding, pulling-in, ripping, scraping, trenching, and tunneling.



KEY CHANGES TO THE DAMAGE PREVENTION AND SAFETY ACT

- Mandatory Membership
- Mandatory Positive Response
- Mandatory Damage Reporting
 To NC811 and Operator affected
- Mandatory response to Survey/Design Tickets
- Ticket size limit of ¼ mile maximum or 5 contiguous addresses
- Enforcement through a combination of a Governor appointed Board of stakeholders "Underground Damage Prevention Review Board" and the Utilities Commission.
- White lining included
- Tolerance zone 24 inches
