Project Budget

The SAFE Lumberton project is estimated to cost \$11,000,000. This total cost includes \$2,150,000 in funds secured by NCDOT's Highway Safety Program and \$250,000 in Spot Safety (State) funds. SAFE Lumberton is requesting \$8,600,000 in RAISE funding from USDOT to aid in implementing the multimodal improvements along NC 72 in Lumberton. SAFE Lumberton is located in a rural area (as defined by the US Census) and has currently completed 15% design. Public engagement will be covered as part of the preliminary design work.

Commitment to SAFE Lumberton

NCDOT will administer the SAFE Lumberton project, in partnership with the City of Lumberton. NCDOT, in support of Lumberton and their commitment to this project, will provide money through their Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP) and Spot Safety (State) funds to implement Complete Street improvements and help make Lumberton a safer place. NCDOT will ensure that HSIP funds and State Spot Safety Program funds will be in place for obligation concurrently with the RAISE grant funds becoming available.


