
The upcoming Rail Planning Forum will provide NCDOT with the opportunity to engage various stakeholders as we embark on the development of the State Comprehensive Rail Plan and the department transitions to the Strategic Transportation Investment program, which will transform how the State of North Carolina invests in its transportation system.

These two parallel and related initiatives will lay the foundation for how the state invests in its rail infrastructure over the next 20 years. Stakeholders attending include North Carolina's shippers, manufacturers, agricultural product producers, commodity producers, city and county officials, and local and regional planners.


The Rail Planning Forum will be held on November 12 at 9am at the Friday Center in Chapel Hill.







North Carolina's state-supported *Piedmont* and *Carolinian* trains continue to be among the most rapidly growing in the Amtrak system, setting new ridership and revenue records in FFY 2013. Ridership on *Piedmont* service was 170,266 and revenue was over \$3.3 Million. Ridership on the *Carolinian* was 317,550 and revenue was over \$19.8 Million. This is the fourth consecutive year of positive growth for both routes.

## **PIP Projects Update:**

Reid to North Kannapolis Double Track Grading will be awarded 11/7/2013. When completed, this project adds a second track to one of three remaining single track sections on the Main Line between Charlotte and Greensboro totaling 26 miles.

## **Eastern Infrastructure Improvement Studies Mandated by NC General Assembly**

Studies began October 2013 to evaluate markets and feasibility of infrastructure and access improvements to ports and Global TransPark. The study will cover:

- GTP Connections
- Morehead City Port
- Wallace to Castle Hayne and Wilmington Port

The NC Dept. of Agriculture and Consumer Services and the NC Department of Commerce are our partners on studies.
