Once home to one of the world's largest textile producers, Kannapolis today features the NC Research Campus, a scientific research hub for several North Carolina universities. **The Kannapolis Train Station** still holds the history of a once-booming industry within its newly revived Colonial architecture. Visitors will find Kannapolis' culture filled with music appreciation, NASCAR memorials and lots of good eats!

NASCAR fans can stop by the **Dale Earnhardt Plaza**, located right down the street from the station along S. Main Street between A Street and B Street. This memorial to the late NASCAR driver honors a hometown hero and racing legend. Visitors can pay respects and take a photo with the 900-pound, nine-foot-tall bronze statue or picnic in the surrounding gardens.
