## Selma, NC



Rail has always played an important role in the history of Selma, a small town formed along the railroad shortly after the Civil War. Your train arrives at the **Historic Selma Union Station**, a 1924 depot restored to its original condition in 2002. The station features museum-quality exhibits on the history of the railroad in Johnston County, including a historical train, as well as the events and people who have shaped the town.

Selma's downtown boasts some great antique shopping, though the kids may be more interested in the sweet treats available just a few blocks away:

**Creech Drug Company** – Old-fashioned soda fountain with milk shakes, fresh-squeezed orangeade and lemonade, and hand-dipped ice cream.
