The AGC-DOT Joint Cooperative Committee met at 10:00 AM on November 19, 2020 via Microsoft Teams.

FINANCIAL UPDATE

Presentation attached. Stephanie King requested feedback from AGC on the presentation visuals as it changes to meet expanding needs.

Of note, Build NC Bonds were sold and closed on November 12. Compared to last year, revenues are higher while expenditures are lower. The cash balance as of November closing exceeded \$900 million, which places the Department near the legislative threshold to resume reporting. It was noted that the Department must keep the cash balance under \$1 billion in order to be eligible for future Build NC bonds.

REVENUE UPDATE

Presentation attached. Of note, reductions in VMT over last year have improved and are holding somewhat steady in the range of -6% to -11%. The federal trust fund balance is approximately half its level this time last year. Details of a future stimulus are uncertain.

LEGISLATIVE AGENDA FOR UPCOMING SESSION

The Department has begun developing its legislative agenda for the upcoming session. The agenda will likely be influenced by NC FIRST.

UTILITY & RAILROAD WORKGROUPS

AGC expressed concern on continued utility relocation delays and their impact on projects. It was suggested that the Department consider the cost of these delays to the traveling public, in a similar manner as liquidated damages in contracts are calculated. The NCDOT/AGC Utility Workgroup met on October 7 and November 9 and was composed of contractor representatives, Central & Division Utility staff, Right of Way, and others.

CSX requested that the Rail Division work to reduce flagging needs on projects. Flagmen are now being required for resurfacing projects, and CSX wants the agreement to be between the contractor and the railroad.

PROJECT CLOSEOUT


