The Board of Transportation has delegated to the Secretary of Transportation the authority to adopt and promulgate all rules and regulations and ordinances regulating traffic on the highways pursuant to authority of N.C.G.S. 143B-350 (f), (g) (see 19ANCAC 4A.0004).

Pursuant to that delegation, the Secretary of Transportation hereby adopts and promulgates the following ordinances based on traffic and engineering studies performed by the Traffic Engineering Branch, Department of Transportation, and in accordance with General Statute 20-141 (i).

TRUCK ROUTES

City of Eden

"NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED that the following sections of highways shall be designated as the "truck routes", said truck routes being particularly described as follows:

Rockingham	TR-4	NC 14	2.68	From the southern corporate limit, northward to the northern corporate.
Rockingham	TR-5	NC 700-770	1.40	From NC 14, eastward to SR 1733 (Summit Road).
Rockingham	TR-6	NC 770	2.12	From SR 1733 (Summit Road), eastward to the eastern corporate limit.
Rockingham	TR-7	SR 1737	0.20	From NC 770 (Meadow Road) to NC 700 (Fieldcrest Road).
Rockingham	TR-8	NC 700	1.61	From SR 1737 (Main Street) to the eastern corporate limit.

"BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that all thru trucks and other vehicles with an axle load limit in excess of 13,000 lbs. shall be restricted from all other state maintained roads within the corporate limits of Eden.
