

**GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF NORTH CAROLINA SESSION 2003 SESSION LAW
2003-310 HOUSE BILL 1140**

AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE QUICK REMOVAL OF VEHICLES, CARGO, OR OTHER PERSONAL PROPERTY FROM CONTROLLED-ACCESS HIGHWAYS AND TO ALLOW DRIVERS TO REMOVE VEHICLES FROM TRAVEL LANES OF A HIGHWAY FOLLOWING MINOR ACCIDENTS, IF THE VEHICLES CAN BE SAFELY MOVED. The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

SECTION 2. G.S. 20-166 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:

"(c) If an accident or collision occurs on a main lane, ramp, shoulder, median, or adjacent area of a highway, each vehicle shall be moved as soon as possible out of the travel lane and onto the shoulder or to a designated accident investigation site to complete the requirements of this section and minimize interference with traffic if all of the following apply:

- (1) The accident or collision has not resulted in injury or death to any person or the drivers did not know or have reason to know of any injury or death.
- (2) Each vehicle can be normally and safely driven. For purposes of this subsection, a vehicle can be normally and safely driven if it does not require towing and can be operated under its own power and in its usual manner, without additional damage or hazard to the vehicle, other traffic, or the roadway."

SECTION 3. This act becomes effective October 1, 2003.
