- On December 22, USDOT awarded \$10.4 Million to NCDOT for the Mobility for Everyone, Everywhere in North Carolina (MEE NC) project.
- The project will deploy on-demand microtransit in eleven rural communities.
- Final scope, schedule and budget details are still being confirmed.
- IMD will meet with participating communities to discuss next steps on January 17.

FY 2022 USDOT Rural Surface Transportation Grant Summary

Mobility for Everyone, Everywhere in NC (MEE NC) will accelerate the deployment of high-quality, on-demand transit services to rural, low-income communities throughout North Carolina, leading to more equitable mobility and improved access to opportunities, services, and resources for transportation disadvantaged populations.

On-demand mobility is a technologyenabled service typically using shuttles or vans to provide pooled responsive transit with dynamic routing.



On-Demand Mobility Benefits

- More efficient and responsive service that responds to rider demands
- Increases flexibility when planning and scheduling trips
- Provides transit to low density, hilly, or otherwise difficult to serve areas
- Does not require advance reservations
- > Serves late-shift workers and those with unpredictable schedules
- Generates robust data and insights on trip
- Offers a public, subsidized form of rideshare services

Equity for Everyone, Everywhere

- Reaches underserved communities not served by fixed routes or unable to access a personal vehicle
- Provides more **responsive** service with shorter wait times and a higher level of service
- > Improves access to essential services, healthcare, and employment opportunities, which improves quality of life
- Creates a system responsive to evolving needs and
- MEE NC service areas are 45% non-white with 20% living below the poverty line, compared to North Carolina at 31% and 15% respectively
- ≥ 262 census block groups in participating communities have poverty rates greater than 2x the statewide average and 149 block groups have people of color populations greater than 2x the statewide average



Program Release: FY24 Capital Cost of Contracting

Opened: January 6, 2023 Deadline: Friday, February 3rd.

Eligible recipients: 5311 Subrecipients when offering additional types of transit service like microtransit, that have not been traditionally offered in a particular location.

FY24 5303 Planning Grant MPOS/RPOS Draft UPWPS due January 31, 2023 in EBS. Final UPWP and other required documentation is due March 31st.

Vehicle Bid Status

- Raised Roof Van/LTV Contract Status Update
 - As of 10/5/21, the previous NCDOT-specific contract for LTVs has expired
 - The IFB (Invitation for Bids) for an NCDOT-specific contract for LTVs and Raised Roof Vans was advertised as of 8/8/22; <u>Bids opened as of 12/13/22</u>
 - Mid-roof and high-top RR vans
 - 20ft, 22ft, 25ft and 28ft Light Transit Cutaway-type Vehicles (LTV)
 - Fully electric has been advertised as an eligible option for vendors to bid on
 - Currently projecting that contract awards will take place in February of 2022
 - Order forms for FY23 vehicle projects will be released shortly after
 - NCDOT will pay the federal and state share for the higher pricing on FY22 and FY23 vehicle projects

• SUMMARY AND REVIEW OF THE GOAL METHODOLOGY PROCESS:

DBE GOAL METHODOLOGY:

- The DBE Goal Methodology is based on:
- 1. The Estimated Budget of Federal Funds for projects for the next three (3) Fiscal Years, i.e. FY 2023, 2024, and 2025.
- 2. The NC IMD is the DIRECT RECIPIENT, and the principal responsibility entity, responsible for establishing goals, interactions and responding to the FTA, and PASSING ALONG the responsibilities to the SUBRECIPIENTS.
- 3. The GOAL METHODOLOGY is based only on subcontracting opportunities, and/or potential procurement opportunities by vendors, for GOODS and SERVICES.
- 4. **EXCLUSIONS**: Transit Vehicles, Administration and Operations costs, with no procurement opportunities.

FY 2023-2025 DBE goal = 3.94%, with no adjustment at this time.

The State is estimated that approximately \$16,687,941 of federal grant funds will be spent on potential opportunities, over the next three years.

Goal means that the IMD has a goal of expending approximately \$657,505 with DBEs during the three-year period, passed along to Subrecipients.

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2-Step Process

Step 1 - Base figure calculation

Calculate relative availability of DBE firms for proposed projects and/or estimated procurement opportunities.

Step 2 - Consider evidence for adjustment of base figure

Review past participation data

Review disparity study data

Step 2 – Consider evidence for <u>adjustment</u> of base figure

Adjustment Factors to Consider

- The regulations further state that there are several types of evidence that must be considered when adjusting the base figure. These include:
 - "(i) The current capacity of DBEs to perform work in your USDOT-assisted contracting program, as measured by the volume of work DBEs have performed in recent years.
 - "(ii) Evidence from disparity studies conducted anywhere within your jurisdiction, to the extent it is not already accounted for in your base figure...

Typically, this would include consideration of prior DBE attainment history for recent years.

PROPOSED FY 2023-2025 DBE goal = 3.94%, with no adjustment at this time.

During the next three (3) years, approximately \$16,687,941 of federal grant funds will be spent on potential opportunities, over the next three years, by Subrecipients:

This would amount to an <u>annual</u> expenditure of approximately \$219,168 by Subrecipients.
