#### Vehicle Order Issues

- Vehicle supply chain challenges continue.
- Supplier cost increases get passed down to vehicle vendors.
- Vendors may not be able to fulfill FY 2022 orders at original price.
- IMD is closely monitoring the situation and developing strategies to address price increases and delivery delays.
- Follow up meeting will be scheduled for July 28 with all systems with pending FY 2022 vehicle orders to discuss further.



#### Finance Reminders/Updates

- Final claims must be submitted by July 30, 2022 for all projects ending June 30, 2022.
- Please double check your claims using the claim checklist before submittal.
- We anticipate FY 2023 5311 agreements will be sent out by the end of July.

#### Claims Issues and Changes

- IMD processes nearly 1,500 claims per year.
- Each claim takes on average over 2 hours to review.
- CARES claims have been particularly challenging.
- Recent internal audits highlighted claims payment as a high-risk area for IMD.
- IMD is exploring modifications to claims documentation requirements that will reduce risk to IMD, ensure consistency in claims documentation across agencies, and streamline the claims review process.





#### **FY 2023 ROAP**

- FY 2022 ROAP reports to be balanced against allocation amount.
  - June reports, and any other outstanding reports, due by July 30<sup>th</sup>
  - All documentation of trips required for verification
  - Unspent funds determined for adjustment to FY2023 disbursement
- DOT fiscal office to provide IMD with ROAP program amounts by category, ITRE to calculate individual county amounts.
- Anticipate FY2023 ROAP disbursement to be in October or November after all the verifications and adjustments have been completed.
- NEW: Beginning with July 2023 report, due date will be 45 days after the end of the month (ex: July report due on September 15<sup>th</sup>).

- Application Phase: EBS Applications will open July 1 2022 Due date is October 7, 2022.

#### \*\*FY 24 Capital Application will open in late Fall 2022 – Est. Nov 1st

- State vehicle contract will determine pricing releasing application after contract is complete will ensure
  accurate pricing and costs to be covered.
- Capital Cost of Contracting Grant app available on Nov 1

#### **EBS New Features**

- Project Status Report will be a required and automated part of the Claims
  - Improvement of existing project status reporting requirement
  - Will help IMD gather status updates for required FTA reporting
- Integrated cash flow –will now require when submit a change request
  - Will help IMD understand anticipated and actual cash flow on grants to better predict cash spend.
  - IMD must ensure cash spend is within 10% of target at the end of each fiscal year.
- Beta testing will occur on new features to ensure smooth rollout.

  - (2) Received technical and legal review approval (Davidson, Union)
  - (2) pending technical FTA review (Alamance, Cabarrus)
  - (2) FTA awaiting further info for requested follow-up (Guilford, Orange)


# Public Transportation Systems with NEMT Contracts Before and After

Dropped from 90% to 69%





#### NEMT Trips by Broker by Month

- But still much lower than 2019




#### Impacts Are Not Equal






#### Private Brokers Are Invoiced Less Per Trip




- DSS = \$31.08
- Brokers = \$29.94
- Difference = \$1.14

#### Private Brokers Are Less Reliable Payers


5 percentage point difference in invoiced amounts versus paid






#### Transit Rejects Many Private Broker Trips

36 out of 100 trips offered to transit are returned






#### Public Transit is Not Offered Trips First



Private Providers	21,696	18,890	2,806	12.9%
Total	31,789	25,311	6,478	20.4%

- Hard to know who received the trips first
- But, even if transit received all trips first, transit was only offered 10,000 out of 25,000 trips carried

#### Returned Trips & Comments






- Outside service area the dominate reason for returned trips
- Comments address a wide-range of concerns

#### Conclusions

- 1. Nearly 25% of the transit systems with DSS contracts were unable to agree on terms with the private brokers.
- 2. Total NEMT trips after Medicaid Transformation are slightly higher than 2020, but well below 2019 levels.
- 3. The impact of Medicaid Transformation on transit systems is uneven.
- 4. The per trip invoices to the private brokers are lower than for DSS.
- 5. DSS is more reliable at paying invoices on-time and in-full than the private brokers.
- 6. Transit systems reject over 1/3 of the trips offered to them by private providers.
- 7. Transit systems are not offered most trips first by private brokers.
- 8. Public transit systems expressed concerns about numerous topics related to Medicaid Transformation and NEMT provision.







### Emergency Preparedness Response

- Updating Contacts, including Emergency Contacts will Begin next week.
- Keeping your contact info up to date is very important so that the State can provide resources.
- Emergencies do not only happen on the coast! They can also include flooding, forest fires, ice storms, etc.



#### FTA's Emergency Relief Program:

Should your agency be affected by a declared emergency, it is important that all expenses related to disaster response before, during, and after the event be documented so that they can be evaluated for reimbursement eligibility if disaster or emergency relief funding is made available. The major data points that should be tracked include:

- the type of any emergency transportation services being provided, including the <u>number and type of vehicles</u>, the <u>number of trips provided</u>, the <u>number of passengers transported</u>, the <u>dates and hours of service</u>, and <u>any fares collected</u> for emergency transportation services
- emergency protective measures put in place to protect transit assets and/or personnel
- damages to vehicles, facilities, or equipment
- any temporary or permanent repairs made to damaged vehicles, facilities, or equipment

Additionally, FTA has established an <u>Emergency Relief Docket</u> for calendar year 2022 so that grantees and subgrantees affected by national or regional emergencies may request temporary relief from FTA administrative and statutory requirements.

#### **FEMA Public Assistance Program**


The FEMA Public Assistance (PA) program reimburses state and local governments, federally recognized tribes and certain private nonprofit organizations in designated counties for eligible expenses incurred before, during and after an emergency on a cost-share basis. This money helps pay for efforts to protect people and property, restore power, repair roads and clean up neighborhoods.

Transit providers are advised that any emergency related expenses reimbursed by FEMA are not eligible for reimbursement by FTA's Emergency Relief Program should funding be made available. If funding is made available for FTA's Emergency Relief Program, FTA assumes primary responsibility for reimbursing transit related emergency relief expenses.




