IMD Staffing Updates

- Welcome Mary Schuler, new Deputy Director for Finance and Administration.
- Bernard Clark is no longer with IMD. Lisa Avery will take over the Eastern Piedmont Region on the Grants Administration team until the position is filled. <u>ext-Inavery@ncdot.gov</u>
- Cassandra Wilson is no longer with IMD. Katie Dunn will take over the Western Piedmont Region on the Finance team. <u>kedunn@ncdot.gov</u>

Vehicle Shortage Updates

- NCDOT Legal still reviewing ability to leverage expired contract to change pricing on existing FY 22 orders.
- New vehicle IFB posted on August 8. Awards expected by November.
- Creative bus sales offered 66 raised roof vans with delivery by end of calendar year.
 - Letter of Intent submitted August 10 to secure vehicles.
 - IMD will send photos of vehicle, confirm interest, and finalize list of systems receiving vehicles.
 - IMD will work with agencies receiving vehicles to complete procurement documents, identify vehicle features, and place orders.

Vehicle Shortage Updates

- IMD working on broader prioritization approach of all cancelled orders.
 - IMD will determine categories of need for other cancelled FY 22 orders based on conversations with each system, useful life information, and spare ratio.
 - Based on pricing in new vehicle contract, IMD will determine how many FY 22 orders can be retained and how many need to shift to FY 23 and 24.
 - Highest-need agencies will retain FY 22 contracts while lower-need agencies may shift to FY 23 or 24.
- FY 24 capital applications with new pricing opens Nov. 1.
- IMD developing new disposition guidance to help agencies in dire need.
- Vehicle workgroup with NCPTA and transit directors met on August 16.



IMD Working with IT to Resolve Claims Issues

- In some cases, approved change requests submitted under the new Fiori platform are not properly reflecting in on claims forms and agreement budgets.
- This has led to issues when submitting claims after change request approvals, particularly when claimed amount exceeds original budget amount.
- IMD is working with IT to resolve this matter.

ROAP Update as of August 17, 2022



ROAP Update Continued

- FY 2022 ROAP reports are in process of final validation against allocation amount.
 - Regional Grant Specialists have reached out to a few transit directors for final reports, corrections, or clarifications
 - Unspent funds determined for adjustment to FY2023 disbursement
- IMD has the ROAP allocation to determine the amount for each program, then will give to ITRE to calculate individual county amounts.
- ROAP and SMAP applications are in draft form to be finalized by month-end.
- Anticipate FY2023 ROAP disbursement to be in late-October or November after all the verifications and adjustments have been completed.
- NEW: Beginning with July 2023 report, due date will be 45 days after the end of the month (ex: July report due on September 15th).


**FY 24 Capital Application will open in late Fall 2022 – Est. Nov 1st



Equity and Transportation Disadvantage Screening Tool

Transportation barriers and disadvantage may occur at the intersection of the following factors:

Each mapping tool has a specific purpose:



People with low incomes

Ethnic minorities, specifically of Hispanic or Latino origin

BIPOC (Black, Indigenous and Persons of Color) people

Households without access

Youth aged 15 and under who are

Seniors (aged 65 years old or more)

People with mobility impairments (physical, mental, or self-care disability)

EJ Index Score

Provides a score for a Census block group based on concentrations of ethnic and racial minorities and poverty status compared to state-wide averages.


TDI Score


Provides a score for a Census block group based on concentrations of six factors compared to state-wide averages.

EJ Dashboard & TDI Dashboard


Generates a dynamic score for a block group based on the selected index and geographic scale.

Environmental Justice Index






Environmental Justice Dashboard




Transportation Disadvantage Index (TDI) Tool

- Six indicators to generate a Block Group score based on variance from the geographic mean.
 - Vehicle ownership
 - Income
 - Disabilities
 - Age: Youth
 - Age: Seniors
 - BIPOC


Higher score = greater level of transportation disadvantage.



Transportation Disadvantage Index




Transportation Disadvantage Dashboard

Complete Streets Implementation Updates



Complete Streets Maintenance Workgroup Key Issues

- NCDOT has limited resources to maintain separated bicycle and pedestrian facilities.
- Counties have limited resources for maintaining separated bicycle and pedestrian facilities.
- There is demand from counties and municipalities for separated bicycle and pedestrian facilities outside of incorporated areas.
- Inclusion of complete streets elements may be at risk on some projects due to the lack of clear guidance regarding maintenance responsibilities and uncertain cost of maintenance.

Mobility as a Service (MaaS)

Mobility as a Service (MaaS) is "an **integrated** mobility concept in which travelers can access their **transportation modes** over a single **digital interface**. MaaS primarily focuses on passenger mobility, allowing travelers to seamlessly **plan**, **book**, **and pay** for travel on a pay-as-yougo and/or subscription basis."

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 Statewide advanced scheduling software connected by Mobility-as-a-Service (MaaS)


